



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Be it Remembered, that on this twenty eighth day of Dec^r, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Two, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Joaquin Estrada, for the Place named "Santa Margarita", was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 501, and is as follows, to wit;

To the Honorable Commissioners to Settle Private Land
Claims in California

The petition of Joaquin Estrada
respectfully shows: That on the 27th day of September
A.D. 1841 Manuel Jimeno, Governor of California, by virtue
of authority in him vested, granted to the petitioner the
tract of Land called "Santa Margarita" situated in the
present County of San Luis Obispo, containing four
League Leagues, a little more or less with the boundaries
described in the grant, which original grant is sub-
mitted herewith marked "A" with a translation
marked "B"

That said grant was duly approved and possession
of the Land given in due form -

That he has been for more than ten years and now is
in the quiet and undisputed possession of said tract
of Land.

That he knows of no conflicting claim

That he relies for confirmation of title upon the
original grant submitted herewith, upon the notes
and records in the Archives of the former Government
now in charge of the U. S. Surveyor General, and upon
such other and further proofs as he may be advised
are necessary

Wherefore he prays the Commissioners to confirm to
him the said tract of Land



Letter addressed to the Governor of Monterey before you, as he best may in
consequence of Law, appears and says, that being owner of a consider-
able number of cattle - and having no place
to repose upon in which to place them, and the place known by
the name of "Santa Margarita" being actually vacante

which may contain three square leagues a little more
or less, as shown in the map which he duly transmits
herewith, he prays you to have the goodness to take the
informations which you may deem proper, and
make known to his Excellency the Governor the State
as I have said of the before mentioned place, in
which there is a house pertaining to the Mission of
San Luis Obispo, but this is in ruins and ready to
fall down, nevertheless he promises not to make use
of it, nor to hinder said Mission from using it as
it may see fit. And the same with respect to the
planting grounds which it may wish to cultivate for
the Indians.

Wherefore he prays you to accede to his request that
he may come to obtain from the Government the conser-
vation he asks for, from which he will receive
grace and favor -



as far as the point called "La Tasajera": the proper
measures and examinations being previously made
as required by laws and regulations on the matter
using the powers which are conferred on me in the name
of the Mexican Nation I have granted him the above
accordance, declaring to him the ownership of it by the
present letters, subject to the approbation of the
Most Excellent Departmental Junta and to the
following conditions -

1^o He may enclose it without prejudice to the crops
ings roads and invitees and enjoy it freely and
exclusively making such use or cultivation of it
as he may see fit -

2^o He will request the proper Magistrate to give him
judicial possession in virtue of this patent, by whom
the boundaries will be marked out, in the limits of
which, he shall place the respective boundaries

3^o The land of which mention is made is four square
leagues a little more or less. The magistrate who
may give the possession will cause it to be measured

in Conformity with the Ordinance, leaving the Surplus
which may result to the Nation for its convenient
use -

4th If he shall contravene these Conditions, he will
lose his right to the Land and it will be subject
to alienation by another person

In consequence I bear that this title being held as
Jum And Valico, note be made of it in the respective
Books and it be delivered to the person interested
for his Security and other purposes

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Joaquin Estuder vs Santa Margarita
 The United States vs Four Leagues of Land in
 The County of San Luis Obispo
 This claim is founded on a grant made to the
 present claimant by Manuel Someno 1st Vocal of
 the Most Excellent Departmental Junta exercising
 the functions of Governor, dated September 27th
 1841 and duly to be ^{proven} genuine. The grant does not
 appear to have been approved by the departmental
 Assembly nor is there any evidence of jurisdiction
 of the Pope having been given - In other respects the
 case presents no question of difficulty -
 The petition to the Crown contains in the Espe-
 ciente describes the Land by the name of Santa
 Margarita, and containing three square leagues
 a little more or less as shown by the map which
 accompanies it. The grant itself is for four
 square leagues and describes and describes the
 lands by metes and bounds, the boundaries given
 are marked with sufficient distinctness on the
 map and according to the seal shows the
 quantity to be less than the amount called for
 in the grant. The grant contains no exception for
 building a house or an occupation within a
 year - The evidence shows that in the year imm-
 edately preceding the date of the grant the gran-
 teer had a house on the Land and has continued
 to live on it, and that he also had on it flocks of
 cattle and horses - This is considered a substantial
 compliance with the conditions of the Law and
 entitles the petitioner to a confirmation of his
 claim -
