



To the Hon. the Board of Commissioners to ascertain
and settle Private Land Claims in the State of
California -

The petition of Augustin Oliva and
Narciso Botello residents of said State respectively
sets forth that they claim in fee a certain tract
of Land, situated in the County of Los Angeles
known by the name of "La Llaguna" bounded by
the Ranchos of San Francisco and containing
twenty square leagues of Land.

They claim said Land in virtue of a Concession
thereof made to them by Pio Pico Governor
of the Department of the California, in virtue
of authority in him vested by Law and bearing
date 25th April, which said Concession was approved
by the Departmental Assembly.

They further represent that since their date they
have been in peaceful possession of the same since
the boundaries whereof are well known, and that
they know of no conflicting claim thereto.

They herewith submit a copy of the Petition
and Grant from the Office of the U.S. Surveyor
General Milwaukee and a translation thereof
and they rely on the same and on such other
verbal and documentary testimony as they may
be advised may be necessary.

Wherefore they pray the Hon. Board to take their
said Claim into consideration and confirm
the same.

Whereas the citizens Narciso Botello and Augustin Olvera have solicited further material benefit and that of their families the tract known by the name of "La Loberia" inside of the Rancho of San Francisco, towards the North; the necessary steps having been previously taken, using the faculties which I am authorized to exercise by the Supreme Government in the name of the Mexican Nation, I have come, by decree of this day, to grant to them, the aforesaid Mrs. Botello & Olvera, the Land in question, in conformity with the Law of 18th August 1824 and Regulations of 1st November 1828 subject to the approval of the Most Excellent

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The Departmental Assembly and under the following
conditions:

1st. They may enclose the same without prejudice
to the crops ~~others~~, high ways and rights of way; they
shall enjoy the same freely and exclusively devot-
ing it to the use and cultivation that may best
suit them.

2^d. They shall solicit the respective Judge to give them
jurisdiction to perform in virtue of this Patent, by whom
the boundaries shall be marked out with the
necessary landmarks.

3rd. The tract granted comprises twenty leagues ~~seats~~
in large cattle, according to the map. The Judge
giving jurisdiction shall cause the same to be
measured according to Ordinance, the surplus
remaining in the Nation for its convenient uses
I therefore order, that the present title being held

the appropriate book and delivered to the parties
interested in their security and further encl-

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The claimants allege ownership of the Land under
 a concession made to them by Governor Pio Pico on
 the 25th day of April 1846 and approved by the Dep-
 uty territorial Assembly.

A true copy of the Especialencia from the Surveyor's
 General's Office is filed, but no other proof of the
 grant, and no proofs of any other facts necessary
 to establish the claim are presented. We have repeat-
 edly held that the Especialencia alone was not suffi-
 cient to establish a valid title, as it did not contain
 the party to a confirmation. The document itself which
 was delivered to the grantee must be produced and its
 proved or its absence duly accounted for and its
 delivery to the party and the contents of the instrument
 shown.







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My name is Ignacio del Valle. I am 57 years old, and reside in Los Angeles. I am one of the owners of a tract of land called "San Francisco", and was a resident thereon previous to 1846, and was well acquainted with the country in the vicinity.

In advance of San Francisco towards the interior there is a particular locality known by name of "La Cenega". This name and place was well and notoriously known in and previous to 1846.

The particular spot called "La Cenega" is the source or origin of the River Santa Clara. The water first rises at "La Cenega" then again sinks. I do not know the precise distance of this point from the boundary lines of San Francisco, but should suppose the distance to be about four or five leagues. I know of no other locality in this direction to the interior of San Francisco called "La Cenega".
