



The Petition of Jesus Machado respectfully represents that on or about the eighth day of July 1845  
Sir Pio Pico then Governor of California in the name  
of the Mexican Nation by virtue of powers given him  
vested the Laws of Mexico then in force the usages and  
customs of the Country effecting grants of land in Cali-  
fornia granted in full property unto Felipe Tuba  
an Indian of the mission of San Luis Rey the tract of  
land and Rancho situated in the present County  
of San Diego and known by the name of Belmacosta  
containing about one half league of land more  
particularly described in the papers and maps  
relating to said grant of land

The original papers  
are now in possession of your Petitioner ready to be  
produced and sworn before your Honorable  
Board and copies thereof filed herewith as part  
of this petition

And your Petitioner further shows  
that said Felipe Tuba conveyed said land  
and premises by deed dated December 19th 1850  
to William Dunn and the said Felipe with said  
William Dunn and wife sold and conveyed said  
land and premises by deed dated April 10th 1852  
to your Petitioner that copies of said several conveyances  
are herewith filed as part of this Petition and the  
originals are in the possession of your Petitioner ready  
to be produced and sworn before your Honorable  
Board

And your Petitioner further shows that said  
Felipe was placed in judicial possession of said  
lands and premises by the proper officers having  
jurisdiction of such subject matter and the said  
Felipe and those claiming under him have been  
in the continued occupation of said lands from the  
date of said grant to the present time

will be pleased to grant me this small piece  
of Land in ownership mine I believe to be suitable  
to it because being a native of this Mission  
where I have labored so much

pray you Excellency to accede to my solicitation  
as being mine what I ask according to the news  
say & admitting this in common paper for  
want of stamping me






