



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Be it Remembered, that on this Twentyfirst day of October, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-two, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Joaquin Ruiz, for the place named "La Bolsa Chica" was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 405 and is as follows, to wit;

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To The Board of Commissioners for ascertaining and settling Private Land Claims in California.

Your Petitioner Joaquin Ruiz of the County of Los Angeles in the State of California respectfully represents to your Honorable Board that he claims a certain tract of land called Bolsa Chica containing two cities of Rancho Mayor situated in the County of Los Angeles in the State aforesaid, that he claims the same in fee by virtue of a grant made to himself under the authority of the Mexican Government by John B. Alvarado Constitutional Governor of the Department of the California bearing date the thirty first day of July one Thousand Eight Hundred and forty one.

Your Petitioner would further represent that judicial possession of said tract of land was given to him on the twenty fifth day of April 1844 and the boundaries thereof designated and defined and that he and those claiming under him have been in the peaceable possession thereof ever since; and that he has no knowledge of any interfering claim.

Your Petitioner presents herewith the original grant of said land in the Spanish language together with a translation of the same, also certified copy of map and certificate of judicial possession and translation thereof and will, make further proof of Title if required by the Board.

Your Petitioner prays your Honorable Board to take into consideration his claim to said tract of land and decree his title to be valid and confirm the same.

In answer to inquiries by counsel for the claimant, the witness testified as follows:

My name is Abel Stearns, my age is fifty four years & I reside in Los Angeles I have resided in California over twenty three years.

A paper is now shown me purporting to be a grant to Joaquin Ruiz dated 31<sup>st</sup> of July 1841, and a map & a testimonial of judicial possession.

I am acquainted with the signature of Juan B. Alvarado, Manuel Jimenez, Mariano Botello, Manuel Michelena, Christoval Aguirre, Joaquin Ignacio Coronel & Leonardo Gato.

Their signatures on said paper I believe to be genuine.

Christoval Aguirre was an acting Alcalde at the date of said possession, said paper is hereto annexed & marked

G.G. St. 1.

Joaquin Ruiz is in possession of the said land called La Bolsa which,

he has occupied it for a number of years. I cannot say how long. He lives there with his family. He has a small stock of cattle and horses.

In answer to questions by the Associate Law Agent,

A part of this land is covered by a Title to Catalina Ruiz. I acted as Surveyor

when judicial possession was given her.  
 The whole of this land is included  
 in her title while I have same,  
 The claims of said Catalina Ruiz have  
 been presented to the Commissioners,  
 The claim is under an old grant  
 to Manuel Nieto.

Inasmuch as the Citizen Joaquin Ruiz  
has solicited for his own benefit and that  
of his family the place known by the name  
of "Bolsa Chica" bounded on the east by  
the "Tulares" and "Conejos" situated at  
or towards the low hills, on the west  
by other Tulares and Marshes, on the  
North by Willow Trees, and on the  
South by the Sea Coast; having pre-  
viously complied with the obligations,  
and made the investigations required  
by the Laws and regulations concerning  
them.

In virtue of the powers conferred upon  
me, in the name of the Mexican nation.  
I have concluded to grant him the land  
above mentioned declaring it his property  
by these presents subject to the approval  
of the Excellent Departmental Junta and  
under the following conditions.

2<sup>nd</sup> He shall request the proper Judge to give him juridical possession in virtue of this Instrument, by whom shall be marked the boundaries, on whose limits shall be placed at the proper points for landmarks, some bush or forest trees of some utility.

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3<sup>rd</sup> He may enclose it without prejudice to the crossroads and servitudes, enjoy it freely and exclusively, using or cultivating it in the manner most agreeable to himself but within one year he shall build a house on it, and have it inhabited.

4<sup>th</sup> The land of which mention has been made is of two "sitos de ganado mayor" as explained by the plan or design annexed to the respective Expediente.

The judge who shall give the possession, shall have it measured conformably to ordinance providing for the remainder which reverts to the nation for its convenient uses.

4<sup>th</sup> If he contravenes these conditions, he shall lose his right to the land, which may be denounced by another.

In consequence I orders that this Title being held firm and valid, be recorded in the proper book, and be delivered to the interested party for his security and further purposes.

On the same day and being at the Bolsa  
 Chica for the purpose of surveying and  
 giving possession of the lands belonging  
 to Joaquin Ruiz, all the requirements  
 of the law having been previously  
 complied with, and being present with  
 the assisting witnesses and the (chain  
 bearers) I had a chain measure  
 measuring one hundred varas, which chain  
 being by me examined and acknowledged  
 I tied stakes at the ends, calculations  
 and observations being previously made  
 according to my instructions, the  
 rope was extended from a willow which  
 was on the sea shore, in an easterly  
 direction one thousand six hundred  
 varas were measured and counted  
 to the borders of an inlet, and not being  
 able to cross it, the experts calculated  
 from that point to the top of a hill on  
 Maya, two thousand four hundred  
 varas, which was marked off by  
 a land mark from that point the chain  
 was drawn along the whole base of the  
 hill, in a northly direction, bearing to  
 the North East eight thousand five  
 hundred Varas were measured and  
 counted off which terminated at the old

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corral of San Gabriel being on the side of a road where a Land mark was ordered to be placed, from that place the chain was drawn in a northwesterly direction and four thousand three hundred varas were measured ending on a small sand hill being the boundary of the Coyotes Almitos, and the Rancho of the Senora Catrina Ruiz, from that point the chain was drawn in a south westerly direction all along the boundary line of the Almitos and eight thousand and two hundred varas were measured and counted ending at the Land mark where the measuring began.

Whereby terminating the operations I do the satisfaction of the interested parties which I have authorised and signed with the assisting witnesses according to law.

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Opinion by  
Commissioner  
Alpheus Delch

The Claimant has given in Evidence a grant of the land claimed made to himself by Juan B. Alvarado Governor of the Department of the California under date of July 31, 1841.

This grant required the grantee to build a house on the land within one year and have it inhabited.

The proof of the occupancy of the premises by the Grantee is as follows:

Abel Stearns swears that he has occupied it many years, and lives there with his family and has horses and cattle on it. A. P. Coronal swears that the grantee had a house on the place in 1845 in which he lives and in which he has lived to the present time, having his stock on the premises and occupying the land.

In 1844 an application appears to have been made to the Governor, and the grant being presented to him he made the following order upon it:

Monterey March 5<sup>th</sup> 1844,

Give him the possession he needs without its being again necessary, when the Excellent Departmental Assembly shall approve the same, in consequence of his long occupation of his property by the petitioners.

It would appear from this decree which was delivered to the party that the Governor based it on a showing satisfactory to him that the grantee had at that time

been long in occupation of the land and he fully recognised his existing rights under the Grant.

This is the only proof of the occupancy prior to 1845, from which time it is shown that he has continued to live there.

If the requirement of building a house or occupying the land had been permitted at the date of the Decree in 1844, it was no doubt in the power of the Governor still to revise or continue the rights of the grantee by allowing further time to perform the conditions.

In this decree he has done more, he has not only recognised it as valid and subsisting; but also gives as a reason for so doing the fact of his long occupation of the land, without this statement in the Decree I think it would be a sufficient segregation by the granting power of the subsisting validity of the Grant, to entitle the party by a subsequent performance of the condition within a reasonable time - perhaps the time originally limited to retain the land. With this statement and the evidence of his actual occupancy of and residence upon the place from the following year to the present time, I cannot hesitate to regard the equities of the grantee as fully established.

By the testimonial of the official act introduced in evidence, it is proved that judicial possession of the premises was given to the claimant April 24, 1844, and the boundaries appear to be designated in such a manner as to avoid difficulty in locating the land.

One of the witnesses testifies

that the Land claimed in this case is situated within the limits of Lands previously granted to one Catarina Ruiz the Sister of the present claimant.

In the testimonial of juridical possession it is certified that said Catarina was present and made no objection whatever to the claim of her brother to the land and its admeasurment to him, and the Expediente in the Archives shows that she made a formal relinquishment of her right to that portion of her Rancho for which he obtained this grant.




Antonio de la Torre being duly sworn testifies  
and says in answer to question by V. E. Howard

Ans Name as above. 43 Years of Age, resident of Monterey  
and am a Shoemaker

Are you acquainted with the Ranchoes of Alamitos  
and Los Bolosas

Ans Yes I do by personal knowledge  
I have been on them

Sook at the Map in Case 372 or Deseno in said  
Manuscript where those Ranchos are represented and  
say whether you are acquainted with the places there  
described as Esteros and describe their character

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Ans I do know them and are acquainted with the places  
thus marked. The point most to the westward and  
on the Alamitos fork as represented on the Map  
at high tide the water enters the fork - At low tide  
they are left Mud flats. I myself have crossed one of  
these forks on horseback. The Creek is not wide it  
is narrow. where I crossed it was about 8 varas wide

The second Estero and the most Eastward  
one on the Alamitos is also entered by the tide and  
is covered with Tules a tule swamp

At low tide this Estero is left like the other one Muddy  
The most Westward Estero in the Bolsas is an entrance  
to a small lake. And further up stood the Old house  
of Joaquin Ruiz, between two settle ponds this on  
the tract called "Bolsa Chica". The tide entered this  
Estero also but very slightly the water is nearly fresh

The second Estero in the Bolsas being the  
Eastward one is a tule swamp and runs up near a  
large bald hill. I cannot say whether the tide enters  
this Estero or not, as I have never been up the Mouth

of it. I have been about the head of it in passing from the Bolsas house and the Alamitos House

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Ans No there are no Bays only small creeks as I have already testified

On the Bays thus represented Navigable

Ans A vessel cannot enter I consider that they are not Navigable as they are very narrow. I do not know how deep they are. A small boat might go in at high water. At low water the creeks are a mud bed with a very little water and only a very narrow channel in the Middle

Look at the Official Map 208 Dist Court, being plat of the Bolsas. And say if you know a locality represented thereon as Bitter Water Lake

Ans I take that to be identical with a point that we called a Cienega or Marsh and the water of which at high tide might be brackish

Quest Is there any grass on that Cienega

Ans Along the North Eastern edge I have seen Tule
