



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Yours Petitioner Juan  
Ramon Malo of La Pimisima in the State of  
California respectfully represents to your Honorable  
Board that he claims a certain tract of land  
called Santa Rita containing three square leagues  
a little more or less situated in the County of  
Santa Barbara and State of California. that he  
claims the same in fee by virtue of a grant  
made to him under the Authority of the Mexican  
Government to the Governor of the Department  
of the Californias bearing date of the 12<sup>th</sup>  
of April AD 1845 and having been approved  
by the Departmental Assembly on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day  
of June AD 1846.

Your Petitioner would  
further represent that judicial possession was  
given him on the 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> days of October  
AD 1845 and the boundaries thereof were dis-  
puted and disputed and also that he and those  
claiming under him have been in peaceful pos-  
session of the said land ever since without any  
knowledge of any interfering claim.

Your Petitioner presents herewith  
with a traced copy of the Expediente duly  
Certified by the U. S. Surveyor General. the original  
document of judicial possession as also  
the original title together with the respective  
translations of the same and will proceed to  
make such further proof as may be required  
by your Honors.

Your Petitioner prays your  
honorable board to take into consideration  
his title to said tract of land and to declare  
his title to be valid and to confirm the same.

He also had cattle horses, carriages &c. and has ever since occupied it till last November when I left home and I suppose he is still there. Owned a ranch in the high - broken land and was familiar with the place.

3<sup>d</sup> Question

Did said Malo live with his family in the house which few stages was on the Rancho in January or February 1846?

Answer -

He did live there with his family at that time.

Ques Examined by the U. S. Law Agent.  
1<sup>st</sup> Question -

How often did you visit the Rancho in question in the year 1846?

Answer.

It is impossible for me now to say Santo Rosario is on the road between Santo Barbara and San Luis Obispo which I frequently travelled. I saw it several times that year and afterwards much more frequently on my visits to my own Rancho.

2<sup>d</sup> Question

What description of house was on the Rancho when you first saw it in 1846?

Answer.

It was a house built of sticks and stones and mud what we call in Spanish (Palo Parado). The size I cannot state there were some small huts depending on it.

3<sup>d</sup> Question

How many cattle had Malo on the place at that time?

Answer - I do not know how many

he had mares and horses and cattle  
but their number I do not pretend to know.





The petitioner has filed in support of his claim an original grant by Gov. Pit Seco dated April 12<sup>th</sup> 1815 certifying to the grantee Ramon Mato the place known by the name of Santa Rita to the extent of three square leagues a little more or less. Also the original record of an act of Mineral possession of the land granted executed by Nicholas a New Judge of 1st Instance of Santa Barbara on the 30<sup>th</sup> of October 1813.

The genuineness and authenticity of these documents are established by satisfactory testimony. The boundaries of the land are described with sufficient certainty in the act of Mineral possession which also shows the quantity to be a small fraction over three leagues.

The conditions of the grant appear to have been complied with in due season.

The evidence is deemed sufficient to entitle the claimant to a confirmation and a decree will be entered accordingly.



Your petitioner further represents and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimant, presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further denies that the said claimant has any valid right or title to said land claimed as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

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And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said petition to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision confirming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

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
