

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Be it Remembered, that on this sixteenth day of October, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-two, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Andres Ybarra for the place named "Sos Encenitos." was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 395 and is as follows, to wit:

San Francisco September 19<sup>th</sup> 1853.  
Case no. 395 was called, and, on motion of the counsel for the claimant, was ordered to the foot of the Docket.

under the authority of the Mexican Govern-  
ment by Don P. Alvarado Governor of the  
Department of the California bearing date  
the third day of July A.D. 1841 -

Your petitioner further  
shows that he was placed in judicial  
possession of said land on the twenty second  
day of July in the same year and the bound-  
aries thereof designated and defined and  
that he has been in the peaceful possession  
thereof ever since and that he knows of  
no conflicting or interfering claim.

Your petitioner presents here-  
with a copy of the original grant of said  
land in the Spanish language together with  
a translation of the same together with a  
map of the land and will make such  
other and further proof as may be required  
by the Board.

Your petitioner prays Your  
Honorable Board to decree his claim  
to said tract of land to be valid and confirm  
the same -

Aminio & Jose R. Arquillo. The said  
signatures appearing on said paper I believe  
to be genuine. Said paper is hereto annexed  
and marked H. H. No 5.

A paper is now shown  
me purporting to be dated 22<sup>d</sup> of July 1841  
I am acquainted with the hand writing of  
Jose Anti Goujora. The whole of said  
paper is in the hand writing of said Goujora  
who was a Justice of the peace at the date of  
said paper. It is hereto annexed and marked  
H. H. No 2.

I am acquainted with the  
Rancho Los Encinos. It has been ac-  
quired by Andus Mena ever since the  
year 1830 or 1840.

He has a house there in

which he has lived since that time & is  
Cultivating ground of his own stock on the  
land.

to ascertain and settle the Private land Claims  
in the State of California personally appeared  
Santiago Aguello a witness in behalf of  
Andres Ybarra claimant for the land  
named Rancho Encinitas having land on  
the docket of said Board with No 395 who  
upon oath deposed and stated as follows.

What is your name age and place  
of residence? -

Answer.

This Name is Santiago Aguello I  
am Sixty three years old and reside certain  
miles South of San Diego.

Question No 2.

Are you acquainted with the Rancho of Encinitas in San Diego County if yes state all you know about its boundaries and accusation by Indians Yerana?

Answer.

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I know the Rancho the first  
line North from the house of Yerana are  
some notable rocks from which runs down  
down the Canada Bataquitas which is  
the Northern Boundary the Second or Southern  
boundaries are also some rocks where there  
is standing water which is the ravine known  
by the name of San Algo, the eastern boundary  
is the mouth of the Lake San Algo, the east-  
ern line of the lake of Bataquitas formed  
by the ravine of the same name which forms  
a square embracing all our lot but they measured  
but one half which is embraced in the above  
boundaries. Jose Ma. Orozco Alcalde of  
San Diego measured the land, I attending as  
Inspector of the Second district, this possession  
judicial was given during the year 1842 or 1843  
when Micheltorena was Governor, since the year  
1844 or 1845 it has been accused by the claimant  
who lived there with his family in an adobe house  
which consisted of a hall and two rooms over  
down and a number of animals on the Rancho  
together with a galan and a mafand. I know  
that Yerana is now in possession of said Rancho  
and has been in quiet possession since  
1844 or 1845. I have visited the Rancho fre-  
quently since that time -

 of land towards the South the want of which  
 I have suffered until the present time because  
 I have not been put in possession thereof -

Wherefore I pray Your Excellency  
 will be pleased to allow me the cession of  
 the said grant on the part of the East and  
 moreover to adjust to me the ownership  
 of the cession of the land which may result  
 as a surplus in the same auction which is  
 entirely unoccupied (Valdo) and besides being

small it is composed of hills and in consequence  
of this incommunie will travelled over.

No damage will result  
thinks to any person and gain Excellency will  
confer upon me a benefit because my stock  
is already accustomed to pasture upon these  
lands, therefore I hope not to be disengaged  
by the generosity of your Excellency -

I swearge and beg to be  
pardoned the paper because there is none of

In his petition the claimant alleges  
that the land claimed being one square league  
was granted to him by Governor Juan B Alvarado -  
so on the 30th day of July 1812 and that judicial  
possession was given to him and the boundaries  
designated and defined on the second day of  
July in the same year.

The grant duly proved  
is given in Evidence - A document is also produced  
which appears to be a copy of the concluding  
sentence of a testimonial of judicial  
possession dated July 22 1812. If such was  
the true character of the instrument its mutilated  
condition would be evident for the purpose  
for which it was designed.

It contains no statement  
of the act done by the Alcalde in Mea-  
suring the land and no description of the premises  
so designated. It affords no aid therefore to  
the claimant in establishing a separation of the  
premises claimed.

The testimony in the case  
however shows that judicial possession of the  
place was given to the grantee and the witness  
who as Prefect attested to the official act  
gives a description of the boundaries of the  
Rancho which were designated as far main-  
tained the testimony at the time. The land  
included within the designated limits is stated  
as one square league with the quantity granted.

The witness states after

specifying the boundaries of the square leases  
that they measured but one half of the same.

We find some difficulty in  
understanding fully the reason for or character of  
this limitation; but as the boundaries appear to  
be well defined the premises being located  
according to the grant and embracing only the  
quantity granted, and as no substantial rea-  
son appears why the grantee should be de-  
prived of any portion of it, we are of opinion  
that the segregation of the land is sufficient  
and the entire lease embraced within the  
limits described must be regarded as assigned  
to him under the grant.

The proof shows that  
the claimant has lived with his family on  
the place and has cultivated and improved  
the land during the last fourteen years. It has  
been his homestead ever since 1841.

The genuineness and authenticity of the grant is fully proven. — The grant describes the land by ~~metres~~ certain exterior boundaries and is for one square league within those boundaries, there seems to have been judicial possession given but only the few last lines of the act are offered in evidence, if it was intended to prove the segregation by this ~~unintelligible~~ document, it must fail, as there is no boundaries of description contained in it, this is attributable to be supplied by the parol evidence of Ayuello who was present at the time and who says he was ~~as~~ the attendant at the time of giving the judicial possession, and testifies to the boundaries as they give, but that they only measured one half of the tract he gives no reason why this was done. Indeed I do not think that much is to be derived from his testimony even if it were admissible, but it is not necessary in this case to rely upon that testimony, the Grant itself well defines the boundaries and calls for the quantity of one square league within those boundaries, which is sufficient to bring the case within the rule in the Freeman Case in 17<sup>th</sup> Hen. The claimant is therefore entitled to a confirmation of his claim and a decree will be entered accordingly.
