



the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San  
Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America,  
the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Thomas Blanco's Heirs,  
for the place named  
A lot of land in Monterey County  
was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 631, and

before Commissioner Richard Hall, with document marked  
H. H. A. 1, annexed thereto, was filed.

To the Board of Commissioners for ascertaining and settling  
private Land claims in the State of California  
Your petitioner Charles G. Haven Public  
Administrator of Monterey County California respectfully  
presents:

That Thomas Blanco deceased received  
a grant of Land of the Extent of four hundred Varas  
in latitude (N & S) by six hundred in longitude  
adjoining the Land of Thomas Cole, On the Northern  
Bank of the Salinas River, where the Main road  
crosses said River, in the said County of Monterey;

That said grant was made by Manuel Michel  
Lorenzo Governor of California on the 27<sup>th</sup> of August  
1844. That said Blanco took possession of said Land  
improved and occupied it until his death in the  
Month of 1850. That said Blanco died intestate  
leaving legitimate Children his heirs, all minors.  
That your petitioner is the legal Administrator having  
charge of said Blanco's Estate. That on behalf of the  
said legal heirs of said Blanco, he prays that  
the said grant of Land, made as aforesaid may  
be confirmed by your Honble Board and general  
relief.

Land of the date of the 27th of August 1844. and  
State if the Signatures attached thereto are genuine?

Answer. I know the Signatures of Man  
uel Michelofence And Manuel Jimeno upon said  
Document. I have often seen them write and their  
Signatures are genuine

Question 3<sup>rd</sup>. Did you Thomas Blanco the person  
mentioned in said Document, and if yes do you  
know anything about his Occupying the Land  
mentioned in said Document? (Not answered)

In answer to Enquiries by the associate Law agent  
the witness says the body of the grant is in the  
hand writing of an Englishman named George  
Allen who died four years ago or more —

This day before Commissioner R. A. Thompson came Thomas Cole a witness on behalf of claimants Thomas Blanco's Holes No. 681 who after being duly sworn deposes as follows

Testimony On behalf of Clement  
Present P. Ord Esq Claimants Atty & R. Greenhaw Esq  
Associate Law Atty.

In answer to questions witness  
states that his name is Thomas Cole his age forty  
three and residence Monterey Cala

Question by claimants Atty  
Did you know Thomas Blanco and if so, since  
when did you know him?

Answer. I knew him from 1842 to the time  
of his death in 1851.

Question. State what you know in relation to his  
obtaining a grant of Land from the Governor of  
California & his Occupation & Cultivation of the same

Answer. I knew of his getting a grant of land  
from Gw. Michellano in the year 1844. Near  
Monterey or Salinas River. It appears a tract  
parallel to me in 1842 to the North East immedi-  
ately back from the river. My land is bounded  
on the South West by the San Joaquin River and to  
South East by the Old Road from Monterey to  
San Joaquin. Blanco's grant is bounded on the  
South West by my land and on the South East  
by the same road. It runs 400 varas in the road  
from my line and 400 varas parallel with my  
back line in a westerly direction. The whole  
tract was enclosed by Blanco with a ditch which  
still remains.

Immediately after getting his grant, he went upon  
the Land, built a house and lived in it and cattle  
pastured the Land until his death.


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Seal Whereas Don Thomas Blanco Mexican  
de California by Naturalization, has asked for his per-  
sonal benefit and that of his family, for  
a piece of Land of four hundred Varas in latitude  
by six hundred in Longitude adjoining the Land  
of Thomas Cole, having performed the necessary  
requisites, in Conformity to the Laws and regulations  
and in the Name of the Mexican Nation, I concede  
the Land mentioned, Subject to the approbation  
of the Excellent Assembly of the Department Subjected  
to the following Conditions

- 1<sup>st</sup> He shall not sell give hypothecate or otherwise  
encumber the same.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> He shall enclose it without prejudice to the  
roads, paths and servitudes.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> In virtue of this title he shall ask the respec-  
tive Judge, that the Land may be measured  
& marked accordingly.
- 4<sup>th</sup> Should he violate these Conditions, he shall  
lose his right to the Land & it may be demanded  
by Others"

in the respective Record & then it shall be delivered  
to the grantee for his benefit

Opinion.

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A grant is given in evidence  
made by Green in Mechillorona to Tomus Blanco  
on the 27th day of August 1844. The premises granted  
are described to be a piece of Land from his  
heredades in latitudes by six hundred in longitude  
adjoining the Land of Thomas Cole. By the  
testimony of Thomas Cole it is shown that said  
Blanco had his Land adjoining the Illinois's  
residence and of the dimensions mentioned in  
the part, enclosed with a ditch, which still  
remains, and that immediately after recovering his  
part he built a house on it and resided in it  
and cultivated the Land until his death -  
The grant was evidently intended to cover the  
Land thus described and occupied by the  
Spaniard.

Blanco died in 1850, and from a certified  
copy of an Order of the Probate Court of the County  
of Monterey, it appears that administration of the  
estate was committed to the Public Administrator  
of the County and that he assumed that  
trust -

He is the petitioner in that capacity, in the  
case. The authority of the Public Administrator  
over the property belonging to Estates committed to  
his charge is the same as in other cases of admin-  
istrators; and we have before had occasion to  
hold that under the Statutes of California, the  
Administrator had authority under the Statutes  
of California, sufficient to enable him in his  
judicatory character to present a claim before this  
Commission and to receive a confirmation of  
land belonging to the estate - The same principle  
applies in the case under consideration -

We think the claim is a meritorious one and  
shall enter a decree of confirmation

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The Land of which Confirmation is hereby made is situated in Monterey County and is the same occupied by said Blanco in his lifetime as his residence and is bounded and described as follows; to west; Bounded on the South West by the Land of Thomas Cole and on the South East by the road leading from Monterey to San Juan; the said land extending from hundred yards on said road from said Cole's Land and six hundred yards parallel with said Cole's Back line in a westerly direction, the whole of said Land hereby confirmed being surrounded and inclosed by a ditch



The Petition of ~~Pacificus Ord~~,<sup>Cameron E. Thom,</sup> a resident of said City, County, and State, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, who petitions in this behalf for the United States, and being present here in Court, in the name and behalf of the United States, represents as follows: That heretofore, to wit: on or about the 25<sup>th</sup> day of February A. D. 1853, Charles G. Harron Public Adm<sup>t</sup> for the Heirs of Thomas Blaneo

presented a petition to the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the private land claims in the State of California, when sitting as a Board, claiming a tract of land in

in the County of Monterey, State of California, which said petition is referred to for a description of the land claimed, a copy of which appears in the transcript hereafter referred to. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 26<sup>th</sup> day of December A. D. 1854, the said Commissioners confirmed, by final decision, the said claim of said petitioner. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 6<sup>th</sup> day of June A. D. 1855, a duly certified transcript of the proceedings and decision of the said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and evidence on which the said decision was founded, was filed in the Office of the Clerk of the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, and marked No. 630,; reference to which it is prayed may be had and made part of this petition. That on or about the 14<sup>th</sup> day of June A. D. 1855, the Honorable Caleb Cushing, Attorney-General of the United States, received a duly certified duplicate of said transcript of the proceedings and decision of said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and

evidence on which said decision was founded. That thereafter, to wit:  
~~about~~  
on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of October — A. D. 1855, the said  
Attorney-General of the United States filed, or caused to be filed, in  
behalf of the United States a notice with the Clerk of said District  
Court of the United States, that the appeal in said cause from the said  
decision of the said Commissioners, in the District Court of the United  
States for the Southern District of California, would be prosecuted by the  
United States. Your petitioner further represents, that the land claimed,  
as aforesaid, is situate in the Southern District of California, and within  
the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court. Your petitioner further represents  
and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said  
Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for  
many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified  
transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said  
cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all  
and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimants  
presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further  
denies that the said claimants ~~has~~ <sup>have</sup> any valid right or title to said land claimed  
as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

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And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said pe-  
tition to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision con-  
firming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

said claim should have been rejected by them. And the said claimants having no valid right or title derived from the Spanish or Mexican Governments, to the land claimed as aforesaid, the lawful right and title in and to the said land was acquired by, and it now belongs to the United States, by virtue of conquest, and the Treaty of peace, friendship, limits and settlement, between the United States and the Republic of Mexico, made at the City of Guadalupe Hidalgo, February 2d, A. D. 1848.

Wherefore, the said ~~Pacificus Ord~~, <sup>Cameron E. Thorn, Acting</sup> Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, for and in behalf of the United States, by reason of the premises, and in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California," approved March 3d, A. D. 1851, and the laws and statutes in such case made and provided, prays that the said claimants or ~~his~~ <sup>their</sup> attorneys may be served with a copy of this petition; and that this Honorable Court will review the said decision of said Commissioners, and reverse the same; and decide on the validity of the <sup>said claim</sup> ~~same~~, and decree the alleged title to be invalid: with costs and general relief.
