

Be it Remembered, that on this twenty fourth day of December, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-~~thru~~, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

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The Petition of Pedro C. Carrillo, for the place named "Los Alamos y Agua Caliente," was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 498 and is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco, February 3^d 1853.
In Case no. 498, Pedro C. Carrillo for the place named "Los Alamos y Agua Caliente," the deposition of W^m C. P. Hartnell, a witness on behalf of the claimant, taken before Commissioner Hilana Hale, with document marked H. H. no. 1, annexed thereto, was filed:

The petitioner ^{respectfully} Sean O'Carillo respectfully represents,

Petition

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That on the second day of October AD 1853 Manuel Micheltorena Governor of California by virtue of authority in him vested Granted to the petitioner the tract of land called "Alamos y Agua Caliente" as described in the grant. And accompanying Map which are submitted herewith marked "A" with a translation marked "B".

The petitioner further represents that said tract has been for the last nine years and now is in his legal possession in virtue of the aforesaid grant or patent.

That he desires for confirmation of title upon the original papers submitted herewith upon the records and minutes in the archives of the former government how in the Chancery of the Superior Court and upon such other and further proofs as may be advised are necessary.

Wherefore he prays the Commissioners to California to have the aforesaid tract of land.

qual se demuestran los lienzos en cuyos limites
pondrá á suas de sus hijosernos algunos arboles
frutales ó silvestres de alguna utilidad.

3º El terreno de que se hace mención es de la
extencion que demuestra el diseño que corre aguas abajo
en el expediente respectivo. El Juez que otorgue la
posesion lo hará medir conforme a ordenanza que
quedo el sobrante que resulte á la Nacion para los
usos convenientes.

4º Si contruyiere á estas condiciones perderá
su derecho al terreno y sera denunciable por otro.

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Title Manuel Mictetrona owner of
the Infantry of the Mexican Army Governor
& Commanding General of the Department of
California -

Whereas Don Pedro Carillo has for his
own personal benefit and that of his family
partitioned forth land known by the name of
Las Almias y Agua Caliente, with the boundary
is shown in the Map which goes with the
Expediente the proper measures and claim-
ations being previously made, as required by
laws and regulations using the powers which
are granted to me in the name of the Mexican
Nation I have granted him the aforesaid
land, declaring to him the ownership of it by
these presents, subject to the approval of
the most Excellent Departmental Assembly
and to the following conditions -

1st - He may Enclose it without prejudice to
the property walls and servitudes he will en-
joy it freely and exclusively making such
use or cultivation of it as may best suit him
but within one year he shall build a house
and it shall be inhabited -

2a. - He shall ask the proper Magistrate
to give him the judicial possession in virtue
of this patent by whom the boundaries will be

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marked out in the limits of which he will
place some fruit or forest trees of a useful
character -

3d. The land of which donation
is made is of the extent shown in the map
which goes to the respective Expediente -

The Magistrate who may give
the possession will cause it to be measured
in conformity with the ordinance leaving the
surplus which may result to the Patron for its
convenient uses.

4th. If he contravenes these conditions he will
lose his right to the land and it will be liable
to denunciation by another person -

In consequence I order that
this present serve him for a title and being
held as firm and valid. Note be made of it in
the respective book and it be delivered to the
person intrusted for his safety and other purposes.

That on the 24th December
1832, he filed his petition claiming
said lands and praying for a con-
firmation thereof, to which Petition
236 SD and to the evidence file in support
PAGE 22 thereof, before the United States Board
of Land Commissioners to ascertain
and settle the private land
claims in California, while sitting
as a Board, Appendant hereby re-
fers for a further description of
said lands;

That thereafter, on the 7th
day of November 1834, the said
Board entered its final decision
rejecting the said claim of the Pe-
titioner and adjudging the same to
be invalid.

That thereafter on the 8th
day of June 1835, an appeal was
taken from said decision of said
Board to your Honorable Court, by
the Secretary of said Board filing
in the office of the Clerk of said Court
a certified transcript of the proceed-
ings and decision of said Board
in said case, and of the papers and

Evidence upon which said Decision
was founded, which Transcript Pe-
titioner hereby refers to and prays to
make the same a part of this his Pe-
tition.

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That thereafter, Your Petitioner
on the 23^d of October 1855, and within
six months after the filing of said
Transcript, filed in the Office of
said Clerk, a notice of his intention
to prosecute the said appeal.

And now Your Petitioner,
avowing that his claim to said land
is good and valid, and that said
Decision of said Board is erroneous
and should be set aside, prays that
the Proceedings of said Board in
the premises may be reviewed by Your
Honorable Court, and their decision
in all things reversed, and that the
Claim of Your Petitioner to said land
may be decreed to be valid and the
said land confirmed to him, and
further prays for costs herein ex-
pended, and such other and fur-
ther or general relief as shall be
agreeable to Equity and good Con-
science on the nature of the case
may require - And, as in duty
