



3 Petition

To the Honorable Commissioners to Settle Private
Land Claims in California.
The Petitioner I. Asibio Boronda respectfully
presents.

That on the first day of February AD 1840
Juan B. Alvarado Governor of California by virtue
of Authority in him vested granted to the Petitioner
the tract of Land called "Rincónada del Sanguí"
in the present County of Monterey, containing one and
a half Squar Leagues, a little more or less, according
to the Grant and accompanying map, a certified
Copy of which Grant with the act of judicial pass-
escau, is submitted herewith marked "A" with a
translation marked "B".

And the Petitioner further
represents that he has been for more than 13 years, and
now is, in the quiet and peaceable possession of
said tract of land, and that he knows of no
conflicting claim. That he relies for confirmation
of title upon the original title and papers sub-
mitted herewith, upon the former Government, and
upon such other and further proofs as he may
be advised are necessary.

When he prays the Com-
missioners to confirm to him the aforesaid tract
of Land.

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My name is W. E. P. Hartnell
my age is 55 years. and I have resided in California
thirty years.

I am acquainted with the writing of
Michael Jimeno. Jose Eusebio Boronda.
Teodora Gonzales. Francisco Rio. Manuel Castro.
Santiago Macero. Juan B.R. Leopoldo and Remedio
Espinosa. these signatures to the paper before me
marked Exhibit No 1 and filed herewith. are
genuine.

I am acquainted with the land described
in these papers. the claimant has occupied
it at least ten years to my knowledge with a
house and stock. He occupies it now

for taking testimony to be used before the Board
of U. S. Land Commissioners in said State Benito
Diaz a witness in behalf of the claimant Eusebio
Boronda in Case No 532 on the docket of said
Board and said witness being sworn deposed
in Spanish which is interpreted by the interpreter
to said Board as follows.

The U. S. Associate Law Agent is present.
Question by Clark Halluc for claimant

Mr. Question. What is your name, age
and residence?

Aus. My name is Benito Diaz, my age
40 years. My residence Monterey California.

2^d Question. Do you know the Rancho
called "Rincónada del Sangui" claimed by Jose
Eusebio Boronda, if you state where it is situated
and what you know of its occupation?

Aus. I do know the place. It is situated
in the County of Monterey. I know that said
Boronda has been in the occupation of the place
since the year 1839. He settled there in that year
and commenced his improvements. He has lived
there ever since. He petitioned for a grant and
obtained it in 1840. He had there in 1840 a house,
Corral, horses and cattle. He had a portion of
the land enclosed and cultivated, and he has
lived there with his family and cultivated the land
ever since.

3^d Question. Is Jose Eusebio Boronda
known by any other name, if you, what is it?

Aus. His name is sometimes abbreviated
by those who are familiar with him. They call him
Eusebio Boronda, and for brevity "Siba Boronda"

Ques Examined by U. S. Associate Law Agent,
1st Question. How do you know of the
occupation of which you have spoken and of
the quantity of Land Cultivated and the manner
of Cultivation?

Aus. I live in the neighborhood and was
frequently there at Barandas and was familiar
with his improvements.

2^d Question. When were you last there?
Aus. About two months since.

3^d Question. How much Land was in
Cultivation on the Island in 1841, 1842?

Aus. I saw two enclosures in Cultivation
in Corn and wheat. But I do not know the
quantity of Land.

José Barro State of California ³ S.C.

San Francisco Oct 20 1854

This day came before Peter Lattt Commissioner
for taking Testimony to be used before the Board
of U. S. Land Commissioners in said State José
Barro a witness on behalf of the claimant -
Eusebio Baranda in Case No 532. on the Docket
of said Board, and said witness being sworn
deposed in Spanish which is interpreted before
an Interpreter to said Board as follows.

The U. S. Associate Law Agent is present

1st Question. What is your name, age, and place of residence.

Aus. My name is Jose Lautino age 46 years. My residence Monterey California.

2^d Question. Are you acquainted with Eusebio Boronda, and with the Rancho claimed by him in this case called "Rincónada del Sanguin". If yes, how long have you known them?

Aus. I have known said Boronda 40 years, and the land of the Rancho since my early childhood. I lived near it in my youth.

3^d Question. Do you know of a grant of land said having been made to said Boronda and state what you know of the occupation and settlement thereof by him?

Aus. I was Prefect of San Juan Bautista in 1840, and the petition of said Boronda was referred to me for report. I reported favorably to the grant. It was a petition to Gov. Alvarado for a grant of this land, and after I made my report Boronda told me he had obtained his grant. Boronda moved on the Rancho about a month before he received his Grant. He had a house, and corral and planted some small patches of ground. He had horses and cattle on the place and from that time to the present he has continued to live there.

4th Question. Do you know the boundaries of said Rancho, if yes, describe them.

Aus. Yes. I know the boundaries. It is bounded on the East by the "Lasso de las Gatas" on the west of the Rancho of Juan Cooper, on the South of the "Sangre del Aliso" a natural ditch or gully, and on the North of the Rancho of Jimidav Espinosa. The "Sangre del Aliso" is a large gully like the bed of an old Creek, at some seasons it is full of running water. It is dry the greater

part of the year. It extends the whole length of
said Rancho on its Southern Side.

5th Question. What separates this Rancho
from Juan Cook's Lands.

Aus. I am not certain whether it is the
Main Road from Monterey to San Juan. Called
the lower Road, or whether it is designated by
land marks.

6th Question. What separates this Rancho
from that of Trinidad Espinosa?

Aus. I know of no other boundary
than except some small elevations or hills
called (mesas) which run along the side of the
Rancho.

7th Question. What is the "Paisal al-
las Gatos"?

Aus. On the plain there is a small Lake
with willows about it. Called by this name, which
makes the division between this Rancho and
the Rancho called "Paisal". There was a small
strip of land between the "Paisal" de las Gatos"
and the Rancho "Paisal" which belonged to no
one. Moreno lived on my Father's Rancho, was
married to my Sister.

Classed Examined by U.S. Ass't Land Agent.

1st Question. What is the length of the
Eastern boundary of the Rancho in question
in this case?

Aus. I suppose from what I have
seen of it, that it more than a League, perhaps
a League and a half.

2^d Question. What is the length of the
"Paisal" de las Gatos" and the Lake there?

Aus. The Lake may be about 1000 Varas
in circumference and there are a few trees near
it.

3^d Question. What is the form of this Rancho
and its average length and breadth?

Aus. It is an irregular oblong form, about a half League wide, and a little more than a League in breadth.

Witness being sworn deposed in Spanish which
is interpreted by the Interpreter to said Board
as follows

The U. S. Associate Law Agent is present
Questions of Mr Racy for Claimant
1st Question. What is your name, age
and residence?

Aus. My name is Juan B. Alvarado
My age 45 years. My residence Contra Costa
County California.

2^d Question Are you acquainted with
Eusebio Boronda, and with the Ranchos

Called "Rincónada del Sangre" of you. State whether you recollect while Governor to have made a grant of said Rancho to said Boronda?

Aus. I am acquainted with said Rancho and said Boronda and I recollect granting the Rancho to him when I was Governor of California.

3rd Question. State what you recollect of the contents of said grant especially when it was made, what Land was granted, what were the conditions of the grant and to whom it was delivered?

Aus. The grant contained an absolute title of the Land. Called "Rincónada del Sangre". I do not remember exactly the description of the land in the grant. It was situated between the Ranchos of Trinidad Espinosa and I think the Ranchos called "Tandil", and some other point which I do not remember. The grant was made in 1840 with the usual conditions and delivered to José Eusebio Boronda the grantee in person & myself at no outray.

4th Question. Do you remember whether said grant was approved of the Departmental Assembly, and whether you gave to said Boronda a Certificate of said approval, if you, in what capacity did you sign said certificate and who signed it with you?

Aus. I recollect the grant was approved by the Departmental Assembly. I think about the latter part of the year 1840 - and I delivered to Boronda a certificate of said approval signed by me as Governor and I suppose my Secretary signed it though I do not now recollect particularly. It was customary and I presume it was so signed.

5th Question. Look at the true copy of the Especial in this case made in the office of the U.S. Surveyor General for the State of California

and filed in this Case on pages 6, 8 and 9, and
say if you recognize that the Copies of the Documents
of which you have testified in your foregoing Answer.

Aus. Yes. I recognize on pages 8 and 9 a Copy
of the Grant and on page 6, a copy of the Certificate
of approval which I issued to said Bonanda.

6th Question. State what you know of the
occupation and Settlement of said Rancho
of Bonanda?

Aus. I know that in the same year after
Grant, shortly after it issued Bonanda went on
the place, erected a house in which he lived with
his family, built a corral, had horses & cattle
on the place and proceeded to enclose and
cultivate a portion of the land.

Crossed Examined by U. S. Dist. Law Agent.

1st Question. Do you see the
Grant since it was issued?

Aus. I have not.

2nd Question. Were there any circumstances
connected with this grant which impressed it
especially upon your memory for so many years?

Aus. Yes. the Grantee was a native
of the same place with myself, we were school
mates, and the Rancho was on the land between
our Mountain and a Rancho I had in the
neighborhood, and I frequently travelled that
way. I stopped there and would with my friends
leave our horses there and get refreshments from
Bonanda.

3rd Question. Was it usual for the Gov.
to certify the approval of the Departmental
Assembly, and state what circumstances
induced you to sign said Certificate in this
Case?

Aus. The Governor signed a Decree

or gave an order to his Secretary to issue a
certified copy of the act of approval. In
this case I pursued this course, because it was
the customary mode of doing the business.

4th Question. When was you on said
Rancho, and what cultivation & improvements
and occupation did you see at that time?

Aus. I was there in 1840 when Branda
was settling the place and have been there
very often till 1847, and I saw in 1840 the cul-
tivation of Corn, beans and such other things
as Rancheros planted and have seen from
year to year all kinds of cultivation used
by Yankees in that part of the country.

5th Question. Did you ever see the
original approval of the Departmental Assembly.

Aus. I have no recollection of having
seen the original act of the Assembly.

San Francisco Oct 20 1854

This day the affiant appeared before me and the following affidavit being interpreted to him by the interpreter of the Board of U.S. Land Commissioners in said State.

José E. Boronda

being duly sworn deposes and says. That he is the owner of the Rancho Called "Recanada del Sangui" situated in the County of Monterey in the State of California and is the claimant in this case. That in the year 1840 he received from Gov Alvarado the title papers for the aforementioned land. That defendant can only with his signature but cannot read writing, and only knew the contents of said papers from being told when he received them from said Governor Alvarado that they were good and complete titles for his said land.

That he left his papers in charge of his wife some two years ago to be delivered to W. E. Hartnell on his attorney Mr. Wallack, and after his wife so delivered his papers, he was informed that the originals given to him by Governor Alvarado were not among his papers - but were lost. That defendant does not know what has become of said papers. That he has diligently searched and made due inquiry but cannot find them and cannot produce them and very believes they have been lost, but does not know when or how they were lost.

13 Affidavit of Henry H. Stelleck being duly sworn
H. H. Stelleck deposes and says, that some two years ago
he received from some person whose name
he does not now remember a small pack
age of papers, sent to him by the wife
of J. E. Eschelby Boronda; said package
purposed to be the latter's papers of the time
claimed in this case; all the papers so
received by deponent were presented to the
Commission, and are now on file in this
case; after noticing that the original title
and cause of action was shown
by the Archives of the former Government of
California, to have been issued to said Br.
onard in the year 1840, were not in said
package so delivered to deponent.

He came to Monterey, and with Mr. H. E.
P. Hartness the agent of the claimant, made
a diligent search for the said missing papers
and was then informed by the wife of the
claimant, and by the said Hartness
that said papers were lost; the claimant
loses them sometime from that part of the
country, but since his return, deponent has
with him, made diligent inquiries and
search for said missing papers, but cannot
find them, and he truly believes they are
lost, and cannot be recovered; that
both the claimant and his wife are very
ignorant and unlettered people, not
knowing the value or contents of papers
The said Hartness is dead

3º The Land whereof donation is made comprises one and a half Spanish Leagues (in litigation made de ganado mayor) a little more or less as appears of the respective plat. The Magistrate who gives the possession will cause it to be measured according to Law leaving the surplus to the Nation for the necessary uses.



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PAGE 62 The claim in this case is founded upon an alleged grant from Governor Alvarado to the appellee bearing date 1st of February 1840.

The original grant is not offered in evidence it is alleged to have been lost. and the affidavits of the claimant and of H. W. Halleck, of course in the case, are offered in proof of the allegation, and the affidavit of Ex-Governor Alvarado is offered to prove its truth. The affidavit of the claimant is to the effect that he received the grant some time in the year ¹⁸⁴⁰, from the Governor, and that about two years before the date of his affidavit, which was made on the 20th of October 1854, he left his papers in charge of his wife to be delivered to Mr. Huntington, or his attorney H. W. Halleck; that afterwards he learned that the papers ~~delivered~~ ^{then} after his wife had deliveded his papers, he was informed that the original title papers given him by Governor Alvarado were not among them, but were lost, that he does not know what has become of them & that he has diligently searched for them but can not find them & therefore can not produce them.

The affidavit of Mr. Halleck is to the effect that a package of papers were delivered to him by some person whose name he does not remember, sent to him about two years before the date of his affidavit a small package of papers, from some person whose name he does not remember, sent to him by the wife of the claimant, that the package purports to contain the title papers of the land claimed in this case, that all the papers so received by him were presented to the Commission and are now on file in this case - that after noticing that the original title and certificate of approval

were not in said package so delivered to him
alleged.

That he went to Monterey, and with Mr Hartnell
the Agent of claimants, made diligent search ~~of~~^{for} said
missing papers & was then informed by said Hartnell,
& by the wife of claimant that they were lost, that claimant
was then absent from that part of the Country, but that
since his return, defendant has with him, made diligent

The grant was approved by the departmental
Assembly on the 19th of May 1840., and in Nov
1842 judicial possession was given.

The grant was for one and a half square leagues
within certain described boundaries, the judicial
possession seems to have followed their location
with much accuracy enough so I think to
show the particular ²⁹ league and a half goes
intended to be granted.

The present situation shows acertaining
of general compliance with the conditions
of the grant. The Appellee is therefore
entitled to a confirmation of his claims
and a decree will be entered affirming
the decision of the Commissioners.
