



To the Board of Commissioners for
ascertaining and settling Private Land Claims
in the State of California.

Your petitioner Juan Gómez
of the County of Los Angeles in the State of
California respectfully represents to your
Honorable Board that he claims a certain
tract of land called "La Paz" and formerly
known as "Mission Vieja" situated in the
County of Los Angeles in the State aforesaid
that he claims the same in full virtue of a
grant to Agustin Olvera under the Authority of
the Mexican Government by Pro-Yico-Governor
of the Department of the Californias bearing
date the fourth (4th) day of April one thousand
said eight hundred and forty five and ap-
proved by the Departmental Assembly on the
thirteenth day of June one thousand eight
hundred and forty six,

Your Petitioner further
represents that the said Agustin Olvera on the
sixth day of April one thousand eight hundred
and forty five transferred his right in said
land to your petitioner.

Your Petitioner further repre-
sents that judicial possession of said tract
of land was given to him as purchaser of the
right of the said original grantee on the
twenty third day of March one thousand eight
hundred and forty seven and the boundaries
thereof designated and defined and that he
has been in the peaceful possession thereof ever
since and that he has no knowledge of any
adjudicating claim to said land.

Your petitioner herewith
presents the original grant to said Agustin
Olvera and his assignment of his interest therein
to your petitioner together with the appraisal

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of the Departmental Assembly in the Spanish language and translations of both with a careful copy of the Map of the land granted to said Oliva and a copy of the Certificate of Simulacal possession given to your petitioner and will make further proof of title if required by the Board.

Yours Petitioner prays from
Honorable Board to take into Consideration
his Claim to said tract of land and decree
his title to be valid and confirm the same.

My Name is Abel Stams. My
age is fifty four years I reside in the City
of Los Angeles & have resided in California
for more than twenty three years.

I am acquainted with the signature

A paper is now shown me purporting to be a grant to Agustín Olana of a tract of land called Mission Brisa dated April 1, 1845, with a memo by said Olana to Juan Pasto dated April 6, 1845.

The signatures of Pio Pier Juan Bondimí & Agustín Olana on said paper I believe to be genuine.

Said paper is hence annexed & marked No. 10, no 1.

A paper is also shown me purporting to be a testimonial of approval by the Departmental Assembly of said tract of land to said Olana dated 13 June 1844.

The signatures of Pio Pier & José M Moreno upon said paper I believe to be genuine. It is hence annexed & marked No. 10, no 2.

A map is also shown me with a certificate of Juan Bondimí upon it dated April 5, 1845, I believe the signature of said Bondimí to said certificate to be genuine. Said map is hence annexed & marked No. 10, no 3.

A paper is also shown me purporting to be a testimonial of judicial possession to Juan Pasto in March 1844.

The signatures of Enrique Ariza, José López & Casado Aguilar upon said paper I believe to be genuine.

I am acquainted with their hand writing & signatures, Ariza was being second Alcalde at the date of said proceedings. Said paper is annexed to the disposition of their Friends taken in case no

1st Question -

What is your name and place
of residence?
Answer.

My Name is A. D. Warner. My
age 44 years. My residence San Diego County
California.

2d Question -

Are you acquainted with
the Rancho of the Mission Vieja or La
Jaz. if yes how long have you known it
where is it situated and state what you
know of its boundaries -

Answer -

I am acquainted with said
Rancho. have known it some 11 or 12 years
It is situated in the County of Los Angeles

It is bounded on the South
East by the line dividing the County of
San Diego from the County of Los Angeles
which runs from the Ocean Eastwardly on the
North East by the base of the mountains usually

Known thine at the Mountain of San Juan
which separates the Valley of Temecula from
the lands on the Coast, to the North west by
the road from the Mission of San Juan
to the Alisos, and on the South west by the lands
set apart for the Municipal lands of San
Juan.

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Cross Examined by the U.S. Associate
Law Agent pt Question -

Are you thine any
natural objects on the line of this Rancho
which forms also the dividing line between
the two Counties named?

Answer.

There are none which are
known as marking the boundaries - The
northern line of the Rancho of Santa Margarita
being the line fixed by Statute as the County
line forms also the boundary being said Rancho
and this Rancho of La Paz.

2d Question -

What was the boundary in the
grant before the County line was established -

Answer.

I have not seen the grant
and do not know what line it describes but
the lands upon which it was granted were
those of San Matio being a part of the
Rancho of Santa Margarita?

3d Question -

If you have saw the grant how
do you know that these were the boundaries?

Answer.

I know it by having for the last
20 years heard the people living about San
Juan and the neighboring Ranchos invariably

whm speaking of the boundaries of Ranchos
in that vicinity give to this Ranchi those
boundaries which I have described -

4th Question -

Is the road from San Juan
to the Alisos, and the Municipal lands of
San Juan marked by any distinct objects
as boundaries?

Answer.

The road is an old travelled
public highway and I have noticed for the
last 11 or 12 years on that road about a
league northward from the Mission a monu-
ment, a large stone placed there which I
have always understood to mark one of the
corners of the Municipal lands of San
Juan the road from thence continues on north
mainly in a Cañada I know of no other
marks of the Municipal boundaries.

This day came before Titus East Commiss-
sioner for taking testimony to be used before
the Board of U S Land Commissioners
in said State Brigido Morello a witness
on behalf of the Claimant Juan Pastor in
Case No 594 on the docket of said Board
and said witness being sworn deposed in
Spanish which was interpreted into English
by the interpreter to said Board as follows.

The U S Associate Land Agent present.

Questions of Claimants Counsel.
1st Question -

Answer. What is your name age and
residence?

My name is Brigido Morello
My age 55 years My residence Las
Angeles County California -

2d Question -

Are you acquainted with the
Rancho of Mission Vieja or La Paz if
so how long have you known it where is it
situated and state what you know of its
boundaries?

Answer.

I am acquainted with Said
Rancho have known it about 35 years It is
situated in Los Angeles County It is
bounded on the west side by the Main
road from San Juan Capistrano to Los
Angeles commencing at the Agua de Canto

(the Indian name of a Spring) at the north westly corner and running southward along the road about 1 mile a little more or less to a point where 3 large stones are set in the ground by the side of the road.

These stones are the well known monuments to mark the boundary between this Rancho and the town lands of San Juan and also between this Rancho and that of Juan Avila at the east, the boundary runs from these stones across the hills and through the lands of Quintin (Quintin de Quintin) to a tree near the bank of an arroyo opposite to said Quintin at that tree is placed a pile of stones and the tree is marked with the brand of Juan Pastor from thence across the hills to a spring called la Soya, which is the boundary between this Rancho and that of Amelio Vigar, the line continues from thence to a stake which is driven at a place called desischo near the beach about man varas from the sea.

From that stake it runs to the high hills de la Canada de la Tafija this last is the boundary of the Rancho of Pio Pico.

The line runs along the side of the hills and then comes down to the Agua Caliente (warm Spring) from the Agua Caliente it crosses the hills to the Agua Rubenallora from thence it runs down a Cañada to there (Also's) Taxis, and from thence to the place of beginning. This last line divides this Rancho from that of Pio Pico.

3rd Question -

State whether the line for mountain

as running from the huerta de Linton and along the command line of Amado Ybar to the line of Pio Picos Rancho is straight or crooked?

Answer.

It is a straight line.

4th Question -

What is the name of Pio Picos Ranch which you refer to?

Answer.

Santa Margarita.

5th Question.

State what you know of the occupation of the Rancho of "Masin Vija or La Paz".

Answer.

It was occupied in 1814 by Don Juan Fatio he built a wooden house on it in that year in which lived the man in his employ. he had 2 canals and land enclosed for cultivation, he had horses and cattle on it, in 1845 he built a large adobe house and moved there with his family and all of his property.

On the year when the Americans came the Indians began to steal his stock and he took his family away from the place for safety. he continued the occupation of the place with his stock till the present time.

Crops Claimed by the W S Associate Law Agent.

1st Question.

When did you first know these boundaries and how did you become acquainted with them?

Answer.

It was about 1844 or near that time, I was present at the measurement of the land.

2d Question.

State what you know of the Indian depredations of which you speak and how you know the stock was kept on the land?

Answer.

I was not present on the Rancho but I knew from common report that Gustavus' stock was stolen by the Indians and that some 3 persons were killed on said Rancho Civilized Indians killed by the wild Indians. I know that Gustavus kept his stock continuously on the Ranch because I was there and saw it. I was in his employment.

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Having minutely examined all
the proceedings I represent to you that to
elucidate the matter in order that the authority

necessary though briefly to make a certain Ex-
planation about the matter and as I stand
in need of my own allegations for to the
best in my power to call the attention to an
intelligible delineation I would wish that in
defending myself I could do it with per-
severity so as not to excite anger nor can I
but surface a prayer that the early concurred
sentiments I am going to display may be
excused -

In the year 1812 last past in the
earlier part of the year the Edicament being
satisfied of the non-occupation of the Lote de
la Mission Piso granted by the Government to
Mr Jose Antonio Estudillo since the time
prescribed by law had passed without the
grantee having complied with the conditions
usually stipulated in making out the corresponding
title of ownership and giving in my letter
above to advance it I made a formal
denunciation before the Prefecturo in your
charge wherein I prayed that it might be

Forwarded to the Government &
After the Judicial proceed-
ings had been carried through and every thing
in consonance with the fundamental law on
which I relied I undertook a journey for this
principal object to the place of Montevideo where
the government resided and placed the Expedi-
tio brought about in the hands of His Excellency
the Governor.

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His Excellency having examined
the matter answered me, that there was no
occasion for my solicitation since notwithstanding
that it was proved that the location was
in a vacant State it was requisite for a grant
that the person was entitled to a certain con-
sideration of the government by having been
accused in affairs respecting under the said
government which might hinder him from
attending to his individual affairs and there
would be fixed a time for the future and if within
that time he failed I should be foremost
in the class of claimants that I should
go to make an agreement with Mr Estudillo
and mutually overcome this difficulty since
it was certain that he would consent to re-
augment the benefit of the land in my favor.

By this solution I demanded
the return of my papers and I was told
that every kind of Expediencia of this nature
remained in the archives of the Secretary's Office
of the government and that consequently the
latter had ordered it to be filed in the ar-
chives -

When I returned from Montevideo
which I did as soon as I had an opportu-
nity, I had an interview with Dr Jose Anto-
nio Estudillo to which gentleman I ingeniously
communicated the result of my claim and he

represented to me that he would think of the manner in which we could make an appointment in the understanding that he would not fail to yield to my wishes but as at that time he was compelled to go to the said place Montevideo the matter remained unsettled and in the former steps until after some months when he had occasion he promised ^{my} Babalys that he would ride said location deliver his pack mula to me and deliver to mother documents necessary for my security.

At last after repeated admonitions which I made him to which he was pleased to answer me with laps, he saw fit to transfer to me the right he had to same land failing to deliver me the respective title and for this he did not do so as he was ignorant or could not bear in mind where it might be so that I always remained ambulatory to possess it truly.

In consequence of my stay in Montevideo for the sake of the business which is always discussed his Excellency the Governor at that time found it convenient to appoint me Commissioner for the settlement of this Pueblo which was of a new creation handing me several documents about the matter and in continuation I was appointed Justice of the Peace in the same place and having entered on the discharge of my functions I had to set aside the practical care of my Orucans and business though small they were -

This attitude on my part for the common benefit and not yet having succeeded in getting Mr Josi Antonio Estrella formal concession which we had agreed on gave occasion to that in the year last

past said location had not been occupied
as far as my care is concerned.

For the present year when
I still supposed this sitio to be primo &
ever continued as Justice of the Peace up to
the 8th of May when I was relieved. Notwith-
standing that up to this moment I am in want
of the title and owing to its having been lost
by the former owner to which is added that
on account of having been charged with
the care of the landed property of this establish-
ment by superior order and agreement with my
attending to subsequent orders emanating from
the government purporting that the Missions
should be put to the disposal of the Rened
Hathus this being included in the number of
the others and it having been indisposseble
to me to settle some affairs relating to this
subject before making the above, I approached
the govtmmt to effect it which it delayed
many days enough before obtaining it
by reason of the many calls on its attention
this hindering me from attending to my
own affairs.

This attendance to different public
affairs (though I have been discharging them
busily) and the difficulty in not consider-
ing myself safe in the Mission house
reason of retaining the title is a reason why in
this location from the month of January which
is the time from whence I consider to have
on my part has not been undertaken any works
Notwithstanding that I always was resolved
to occupy it in the year since I casually was
setting out for the place San Felipe to seek
Indians for the purpose of undertaking some
works when I received this promise.

If formerly the land has been

accout I ought not to meddle with this circumstance especially when the government which was satisfied therewith caused me not to desire Mr Jose Antonio Estudillo of it and refused the denunciation and if it has continued to be so from the time it was said to me it is for the reasons indicated and that owing to any tardiness ignorance or want of good will to uphold it -

Nevertheless if there be made allowance for the ground taken by Mr Antonio Mac Lomasa for the denunciation he infers that the persons in possession thereof have not complied with the conditions of law and if it is desired to apply this law in all its rigor on me I think that in my case the year allowed to occupy a tract of land granted does not expire and if the former owner failed and there is occasion for a denunciation I consider myself foremost as the first informer and in view of the government having thus promised it me it is therefore to be inferred that in whatever hypothesis I am the legitimate owner of the Mission Rifa -

On the other hand if at that time when I announced there was no occasion considering the service which Mr Jose Antonio Estudillo rendered to the government setting aside the gift made me by an individual I consider myself entitled to the same merit so that I do not dispoiled of a thing which I calculate as my property so much so that well considered there is still more to ally in this matter and the governor with his qualified judgment can decide whether there has been any ground or not for what has

been intimated to the effect that on my part
the location should in a certain manner be
disaccupied and therfore in view of what I
have represented I pray you that you like-
wise will please to bring it to the knowledge
of his Excellency the Governor who may see fit

1st. He may enclose it without interfering with







It appears from the Expediente in the archives of the Mexican Government in California a duly Certified Copy of which is filed in the Case that the land claimed in this Case was originally Granted about the year 1811 to Jose Antonio Estudillo.

On the 8th of Sept 1813 Antonio Ma Lomas presented his petition to Gov Micheltorna denouncing the land upon the ground that the former Grantee had not Complied with the conditions of the law.

This petition was referred by the Governor to the Prefect of the 2d District Don Manuel Dominguez for his report on the subject.

The Prefect after making the proper Enquiries reports that Jose Antonio Estudillo had transferred his interest in the premises to Don Agustin Olvera but that up to that time it was without any building or sufficient stock so as to be considered Ground or occupied.

The Expediente was then before the Governor transmitted to Don Agustin Olvera for his statement in relation to it.

In reply to this Reference Don Agustin Olvera made a long communication setting out that in the year 1812 he had denounced the land on the ground that the former Grantee had not Complied with the conditions of the Grant within the time stipulated in the title.

That after the proper judicial proceedings had been carried through and

Something being done in Conformity to the fundamental Laws on the subject he proceed-
ed to Montevideo and placed the Expediente
in the hands of the Governor who after having
examined it informed him that although
it was found that the situation was vacant
yet the former Governor having been employed
in public Offices under the Government
which might have prevented him from
attending to his individual interests a certain
time would be allowed him and if he failed
within that the Petition should then have the
preference in his Annunciation but advised
him to enter into an Agreement with Senor
Estudillo by which the difficulty might be
overcome.

That in accordance with this
advice he applied to the said Estudillo
for a transfer of his interest to him and that
finally after a good deal of delay the said
Estudillo had in the Month of January 1843
ceded to him all his rights in the premises that
failed to deliver the original title as he was
ignorant at the time where it was.

He further states that about
the time of his visit to Montevideo he was ap-
pointed Governor Commissioner of the New
Pueblo of San Juan Capistrano and Subse-
quently Justice of the Peace of the same which
latter Office he had held until the preceding
Month of May.

That in consequence of these
appointments and the public duties which
they had imposed upon him he had been
compelled to neglect his private affairs
and had consequently been unable to occupy
the land for

This Communication bears
date July 22, 1843.

After a further reference
and report from the Superintendent and
President Frans Merciso Roman the Gover-
nor on the 23d of February 1843 made the fol-
lowing order.

"As Mr Oliva justly de-
mands there is no occasion for the Amunecation
contained in this Espediente and made by
my Assistant Don Anto Ma Lomasa,

The Secretary of State
will cause the necessary communications to be
made in consequence of this Answer from the
undersigned Commandant General.
Buenos Ayres -

The following also appears in the Espe-
diente -

"Hon Excellency the Governor and
Commandant General of this Department
on the date 3d of October last communicated
the following to me.

"It appearing to be justi-
fied by the documents presented by Don
Agustin Oliva and which are attached to
the Espediente at the instance of Lieutenant
Don Antonio Ma Lomasa in Amunecation of
the land called La Mission Yujo that this
belong lawfully to said Mr Oliva I have
resolved to grant it him in ownership and
mean while the Secretary of the Government
issues the Corresponding title you will allow
him to build a house on the land in
question saving the right of Lieutenant
Lomasa to solicit a vacant land."

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A formal grant of the land was issued to Don Agustin Olvera by Gov Pio Pico on the 15th of April 1815 which was approved by the Departmental Assembly on the 12th of June 1846 and a certificate of the same signed by the Governor of Sordans delivered to the party on the 13th of the same month.

The genuineness of the signatures to all the documents is fully established. by the testaments and the boundaries of the land are so clearly laid down on the map according to which the grant was made as to remove all difficulty in their ratification and location.

The only doubt as to the validity of the claim arises from the fact that no occupation or cultivation is shown on the part of the grantee from whom the present claimant derives his title -

His failure to occupy and improve the premises during the year 1843 may the right acquired by the transfer from the first grantee Estudillo was clearly excused by the Governor for the reasons set forth in his communication in reply to the order of reformed made by that Office and his right to a formal grant of the land fully recognised in the order to the Prefect of the 3rd of October of that year and the decree of the 23rd of February 1844.

The subsequent occupation and improvement of the premises and

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Cultivation of the Land in the year 1844 was by the present Claimant to whom Oliva assigned all his right title and interest immediately after the closing of the formal Grant by Mr Pio Pico in April 1845 according to my view of this subject the object of the Mexican Colonization laws was the settlement and improvement of the Country by cultivation and the occupation of the lands by cattle then the only profitable branch of agriculture known to the inhabitants of California -

Hence the conditions of occupation or cultivation annexed to all grants of lands made under those laws.

That being the object and scope of the law it was a matter of indifference to the Government whether it was accomplished by the Grantee in person or by another acting in his name and by his authority -

In the present case it is obvious from the facts presented by the documents on file that the occupation by H. Stro during the year 1844 was by the authority and in behalf of Oliva whose rights in the premises had first been recognised by the Government and the subsequent issuing of the grant without the usual conditions of building a house &c, and its approval by the Departmental Assembly in the following year creates a strong presumption that the Mexican authorities considered the conditions of the law as substantially complied with -

But whether this be so or not the grant of the 4th of April 1845 with the approval of the Departmental Assembly and the "certifying document" of that fact subsequently issued to the Grantee by the Governor was sufficient according to the strictest ruling to

invest him with a full Estate in the premises which under the assignment of the 6th of April 1815 would enure to the benefit of the present claimant -

The right thus acquired was a vested and subsisting interest at the time the territory was ceded to the United States and as such it is protected by the treaty and entitled to a confirmation by this Commission -

The Petitioner of *Pacisius Ord*, a resident of said City, County, and State, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, who petitions in this behalf for the United States; and being present here in Court, in the name and behalf of the United States, represents as follows: That heretofore, to wit: on or about the 16th day of October A. D. 1852, Juan Foster

presented a petition to the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the private land claims in the State of California, when sitting as a Board, claiming a tract of land called *Mision Vieja o La Paz*,

in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, which said petition is referred to for a description of the land claimed, a copy of which appears in the transcript hereafter referred to. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 31st day of October A. D. 1854, the said Commissioners confirmed, by final decision, the said claim of said petitioner. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 2nd day of July — A. D. 1855, a duly certified transcript of the proceedings and decision of the said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and evidence on which the said decision was founded, was filed in the Office of the Clerk of the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, and marked No. 396; reference to which it is prayed may be had and made part of this petition.

That on or about the 16th day of March A. D. 1855, the Honorable Caleb Cushing, Attorney-General of the United States, received a duly certified duplicate of said transcript of the proceedings and decision of said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and

evidence on which said decision was founded. That thereafter, to wit: on the ^{or about} 21st day of July — A. D. 1855, the said Attorney-General of the United States filed, or caused to be filed, in behalf of the United States, a notice with the Clerk of said District Court of the United States, that the appeal in said cause from the said decision of the said Commissioners, in the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, would be prosecuted by the United States. Your petitioner further represents, that the land claimed, as aforesaid, is situate in the Southern District of California, and within the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court. Your petitioner further represents and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimant, presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further denies that the said claimant has any valid right or title to said land claimed as aforesaid, or any part thereof.
