



Claims in California
The Petitioners, Conspicui Picio de lauille widow
Joaquin lauille Jose Antonio lauille Maria lauille

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That in the 1st day of October A.D 1834 Jose Figueroa
Gouverneur of California by virtue of authority in
him vested granted to Domingo lauille and
Eusebio Domingo in the tract of land called Las
Niguis in the former District of Los Angeles com-
prising from square leagues a little more or less as
described in the grant and accompanying map
as is fully shown in the original Expediente No 34
which the archives in charge of the Gouver-
neur and which is hereby found to exhibit a
translation of which will be submitted to this
Board and marked Exhibit B.

That said grant
was duly approved by the Departmental Assembly
August 29th A.D 1835 as shown in the Expediente
above referred to. that said tract of land was
duly surveyed and the judicial possession of it
given to the grantees on the 10th day of June A.D
1835 a duly authenticated copy of which act of
possession is submitted herewith marked C with
a translation marked D

That in the year 1837
the said Domingo lauille died in California
leaving his petitioners his heirs and legal
representatives. That the Petitioners own two
sons whom they have had for 18 years
in possession and occupation of the said tract
of land

That they have no conflicting claim
that they rely for confirmation of title upon
the original papers submitted herewith and referred
to in this Petition upon the records in the archives
of the former Gouverneur now in the hands of
the Gouverneur and upon such other
and further proofs as they may be advised
as necessary. Whereupon they pray the Commiss-
ioner to confirm to them the heirs of the aforesaid
tract of land called Las Niguis and duly describe

Melido que pusiesen los bueyes en dichos sitios como en efecto se cumplio.

Dicen estos bueyes que la Mission no necesita de estos sitios, a que responde qd. que la Mission se reduce al puillan no qd. coste para el mes de Junio siendo buenas las Aguas, no havian el marq^m para traerse de donde se signo por temor las mareas como el Gomel se retiraron para el pueblo y para donde pueden de modo qd. el llano queda desierto de animales. Aora pmas. agradece mas al llano la Caballada qd. esta en las Virgenes nos no haren otro sitio qd. tenga puesto y mas dos bueyes qd. estan en las Virgenes y agua Amarilla y si sigue qd. que el clima desfuerze y si lo vere el qd. para el mes de marzo veamos morir de hambre caballos Bueyes y oemas como sucedio no solo en el llano el nivio mucho dañando pero tam bien en los sitios especiales murieron mucha Bueyada por falta de pastos en el entro 25 - y

de aquí se si fuera el que no hacía car
ne para los Indios ni llana para re-
ntos; dejarlo más moleado que cucho
sitios son necesarios por la Mz. Voz
o privilegar que los Ciudadanos no
en si pierdan los intentos que mani-
festán en sus Asambleas y cultivo.

En efecto el finado Miguel Ortega hom-
bre muy aplicado para ese sembrado
de temporal mas luego lo dejó y no en
cañuti porque en estos tiempos siendo el
año de muchas aguas como es necesario
para demorar el temporal de estas
muchas inundaciones resultan las
muchas inebriadas y de estas el achar-
guistarse y perdiere el frigo, también
me creci dentro un poco de Maiz
pero vencio que se lo perdiera por falta
de agua a pesar de que entonces amig-
puese muy poquita su agua la pudo
aprovechar lo que no en el dia porque
los barrancos que se formaron en el
25. dejaron perdida mucha tierra
imposible las decaidas de las aguas por su
grande profundidad del finado
Barra con 1100, y visitando los assem-
blas en el pueblo de los Angeles por con-
siguiente no avea sitio para si
entra ni cultivo alguno y en los años
que las aguas o lluvias deven cesadas
ni hay fuente. Es quanto pinedo de-

the Report received of me upon the petition
of the Citizens above mentioned relative to
the places "Las Virgenes", "Aguaamanga" and
"Ticemfo" I can state that in the year 17 the
three said sites were vacant and although
"Las Virgenes" had belonged to an endorced
Noche Clead, whose son after the death of his
father abandoned and left it, for which
reason it should be considered Vacant -

The Petition of this Mission concerning in the
aforementioned year that he could not subsist
without clothe the Indians for want of a place
upon which to place the stock necessary for
this purpose, represented the said necessity
to the Sinn Gwano, Don Pueblo Vicente de Solá,
and asked in the said places. The Governor
called together from the Pueblo of Los
Angeles, the Commissioner, the Alcalde one
Reydon and several others, and asking them
if they knew whether they would predecide
the Pueblo they unanimously answered "Nay"
He then read to them the petition of the said
and ordered them to fix the boundaries of
the said places, which was done.

These Citizens say the Mission has need
of the said places, to which I reply
that the Mission is confined solely to the
plain, that this, during the month of June
although it rain sufficiently, does not
produce anything whence it follows
therefore that the horses as well as the cattle
go back to the Pueblo or wherever they can.

in such a manner as that the plain is deserted of animals; Now therefore, the horses which are at "Las Virgenes" collect upon the plain more because there is no place which affords pasture, and also the sheep which are at "Las Virgenes" and "Agua Amarga", and it will follow that on the plain, whether strong or not, those that survive the month of March, we may see die of hunger, horses, sheep and everything else as it happened, not only on the plain that our cattle or stock die, but also on the aforementioned places a great many sheep die in the month of pasture in the year 25, and whence it may be deduced that there was no need for the subsistence of the Indians, neither wool to clothe them.

Therefore having proved that the said places are necessary to the Indian - I am going to prove that the said Indians do not communicate the intentions which they manifest relative to the planting and cultivation. First it appears that the deceased Miguel Ortega, a man of application, sowed wheat on his lands, but he immediately left it and it did not produce straw, because upon these lands the year was very dry as is necessary for sowing. These excessive heatwaves produce a great deal of dust, and from this the twisting up of the tops of wheat. I am also told that he planted a little corn, but seeing that he lost it for the want of water, notwithstanding there was very little rain at that time of which he made himself free because not so, because the gullies which were formed in 25 by their great depth for long time prevented the water from being diverted therefrom, the said deceased had as is said, and known to any body his residence at the Pueblo of Los Angeles - Therefore the said place is not suitable for planting or any cultivation and when the rains are scarce there is a spring. This is all I can

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Say upon the Subject.







are shown ever to have been cultivated lands
uninhabited in the place and although it is stated
that Domingo the other grantee did live there
with his family it was long after the lapse
of time contemplated by the law for the per-
formance of the conditions

We decline the dis-
tinctions insufficient to entitle the claimants
of said lands to a confirmation of the title
of the land in lease Number 344 which
has first been adjudicated the land claim-
ed on this lease has been confined to
Maura Antonio Machado


