



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Be it Remembered, that on this twentieth day of April, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-two, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Frederick Billings et al; Assignees of Bezar Simmons for the Place named Island or Peninsula at the Port of San Diego was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 188, and is as follows, to wit;

San Angeles October 8th 1852.
In Case no. 188, Frederick Billings et al; Assignees of Bezar Simmons for the place known as the Island or Peninsula at the Port of San Diego, the deposition of Santiago Arquello, a witness in behalf of the claimants, taken before Commissioner James Wilson, with document marked I. W. no. 1, annexed thereto, was filed.

To the Honorable Commissioners to settle private land claims in California.
The petitioners, Frederick Billings, James R. Bolton and Henry W. Halleck assignees of Bezer Simmons, respectfully show:

Petition.

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That on the 15th day of May A. D. 1846, Pio Pico, Governor of California, by virtue of authority in him vested, granted to Pedro C. Camillo, the Island or Peninsula of San Diego, situate in the present county of San Diego, containing 2 square leagues, with the boundaries described in the grant, a copy of which is submitted herewith marked A. with a translation marked B. —

That on the 20th day of October 1846, the said Pedro C. Camillo sold and conveyed the said tract of land to the said Bezer Simmons, a copy of which conveyance is submitted herewith marked C. with a translation marked D. —

That on the 3^d day of September A. D. 1852, the said Bezer Simmons, by deed of assignment conveyed the said tract of land to the petitioners, a copy of which deed of assignment is submitted herewith marked E. —

And the petitioners further show that the said land has not been surveyed by the Surveyor General of the United States, such survey, from the nature of the case being unnecessary, the boundaries being natural, and not to be mistaken.

That since the year 1846, the said Pedro C. Camillo, Bezer Simmons, and the petitioners have been, and the petitioners now are in the quiet, peaceful,

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and undisputed possessors of the said
tract of land;

That they know of no conflicting
claim.

That they rely for confirmation of
title upon the original papers, copies of
which are submitted herewith; upon the
records and minutes in the archives
now under the charge of the Surveyor
General; and upon such other and fur-
ther proofs as they may be advised as
necessary.

Wherefore they pray the Commis-
sioners to confirm to them the said
tract of land.

This day came before Peter Scott, Commissioner for taking testimony to be used before the Board of U. S. Land Commissioners in said State, Thomas D. Johns, a witness on behalf of the claimants, Frederick Billings et al, in case No 188, on the docket of said Board, and said witness being sworn deposed as follows.

The U. S. Associate Law Agent is present.

Question by Capt Halleck for claimants.

1st Question

What is your name, age and
residence?

Answer.

My name is Thomas D. Johns,

my age 29 years, my residence San Francisco, California.

2^d Question.

Do you know the place called the Island or Peninsula of San Diego, if yes, where is it situated, and what are its boundaries?

Answer.

I know the place mentioned, it is a peninsula bounded on the South by the Pacific Ocean, on the North and West by the Bay of San Diego, and on the East by the main land. The boundary line on the East is marked by a sandy beach, a scant half mile wide a low neck of land which separates said peninsula from the main land.

3^d Question.

Do you know of any improvement made on this land, if yes, what are they and by whom made?

Answer.

I know of three houses having been erected on different points of the Island in the summer or fall of 1850 by the agent of William H. Cleggwall.

4th Question.

How much land is embraced in said Peninsula?

Answer.

I suppose there are about 1000 acres altogether.

5th Question.

What was the name of that

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Agent, and what was the object of building those houses?

Answer.

His name is Charles P. Johnson, & the houses were built to keep possession and keep off squatters.

3^d Question.

How long is said pinnaculat?

Answer.

It is about 8 miles long.
4th Question.

How do you know said Johnson was Aspinwall's agent?

Answer.

He told me he built those houses under orders from Mr Robinson of this place who is Aspinwall's agent here; he (Johnson) was also Agent of the Pacific Mail Steam Ship Company at San Diego.

duly sworn, deposed as follows.

1st Question.

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What is your name, age and
place of residence?

Answer.

My name is Frederick Billings, my
age thirty one years, residence San Fran-
cisco, in California.

2^d Question.

Did you ever know Bizer
Simmons, and if so, is he living, and if
not, when did he die, and who were his heirs?
Answer.

Bizer Simmons was my brother
in law, we came to California together—
knew him most intimately. He died on
the 25th or 26th day of September A.D.
1850 in San Francisco. His wife died
before him, and they had no children—
His father and mother are both dead—
they formerly lived at Woodstock, Vermont.
His heirs are his brothers and sisters and
their names are Owin Simmons, Henry
Simmons, Nathan P. Simmons, Benja-
min F. Simmons, Priscilla Simmons,
Ann B. Ryder, and Augusta S. Barthole-
mew— I know them all personally except
the latter— her I only know through in-
formation derived from the Mort. One
sister, Polly is dead, she died a widow and
left one child. I think the name of
her husband was McCall, but the chris-
tened name of the child I do not re-
lect.



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(seal) Whence Don Pedro Camillo, has for his personal benefit and that of his family petitioned for the land known as the Island or Peninsula in the Port of San Diego, the proper examination being previously made, using the faculties which are conferred on me in the name of the Mexican Nation, I have granted him the aforesaid land in decree of this day, declaring to him the ownership of it by these presents, in conformity with the law of August 18th 1824, and the Regulation of Nov 21st 1828, subject to the approval of the Most Excellent Departmental Assembly, and under the following conditions,

1^o He may inhabit without prejudice to the crossings, roads and utilities, and enjoy it fully and exclusively, making such other cultivation of it as may best suit him.

2^o He shall request the proper Magistrate to give him judicial possession in virtue of this order, by whom the boundaries will be marked out.

3^o The land of which donation is made is two square leagues, and is bounded on the North by the estero of the port of San Diego towards the town, East by the end of the rancho of San Agustin Melisio, South by the sea, and West by the bay or anchorage for ships, as explained by the map which goes with the expediente. The magistrate who may give the possession will cause it to be measured in conformity with the ordinance.

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In consequence I order that the
present title being held as firm and valid,
note be made of it in the corresponding book,
and it be delivered to the party interested
for his security and other purposes.

In the town of San Diego, Territory of California, on the twentieth day of the month of October eighteen hundred and forty six, before me, citizen Enrique Domingo Fitch, second Alcalde of this town and its jurisdiction, and before the witnesses of my assistance with whom I act in virtue of my office, besides the witnesses to the Translation instrument who will at the end be named, of Conveyance appear Don Pedro Camillo, neighbor and resident of this town, whom I certify I know, and said; that with the knowledge of his wife, and in virtue of a contract entered into with the Captain of the North American Ship Magnolia, Don Bizar Simmons, citizen of the United States of the North, his residence in the State of Vermont, on the twentieth of the present month and year, who also was present, in which he sold all the land of his ownership in the Island or Peninsula which is formed by the Harbor of San Diego, until it touches the lands of Santiago Encadrin Arguello, which land contains two square leagues as shown by the title issued by his Excellency the Governor of the Department, Don Pio Pico for the sum of one thousand dollars in cash, the only price at which it has been valued, no person having offered him more, and he not finding any person who would give him more, and if it is worth more, he cedes and makes donation of it, in favor of the said Don Bizar Simmons, of his free and spontaneous will, and that of his said wife, so that the contrary cannot be maintained by any law or title, for he renounces all

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that can favor him, and binds and compels himself from this time for himself and in the name of his heirs and successors and of whosoever of them may have title, right or claim in any manner, from this moment be conveys, transfers and gives in perpetual alienation with the right of inheritance forever to the said Dm Bizar Simmons and to his heirs, the right of ownership which he has in the said Island or Peninsula, delivering the corresponding title, dated the fifteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty six; which land he declares has not been sold, alienated or pledged, and that it is free from all tribute, religious or charitable tax, entail, pledge or other incumbrance, real, personal, special, general, tacit and expressed, and as such he cedes and transfers and from this time forth forever, dispossesses himself and desists from, takes away and separates from his heirs and successors the dominion, ownership, title, right, income and every other right which he has in the said land of the Peninsula, and cedes, renounces and transfers thins with the actions, real and personal, mixed, direct and effective in favor Bizar Simmons, and in whosoever may represent his person, that he may possess, exchange, alienate, and dispose of it at his pleasure as of his own property acquired with legal and just title; he confers on him inviolable power with free, full and general administration, and

constitutes him attorney in fact in his own cause, that without of his own authority or judicially he may enter upon and possess himself of the said Island or Peninsula, and take and seize the real tenure and possessions of it which by law belongs to him; and that he may not need to take it, he prays that an unauthenticated copy of this present be given him, by which without any other act of taking, it will be seen that he has taken and seized it, and it has been transferred to him, and in the meantime he constitutes himself his tenant and temporary possessor in legal form - and by binds himself that said Island or Peninsula shall be certain sure and effective, and no person shall molest him or bring suit against his ownership, enjoyment and benefit, whether or shall any encumbrance appear against it, and if he should be molested, or suit brought or an encumbrance appear, so soon as the grantor or his heirs and successors may be called upon in conformity with law, they will come forward in the defense in all courts and tribunals until they obtain judgment in his favor, and leave the said Dr. Bezar Timinus and his, wife, quiet and peaceful possession; and if not being able to obtain it, they shall give him another equal in value, & in want of such, he will restore its value, the improvements useful and necessary which at the time he may have, the greatest value and estimation which with time they may acquire, & all the costs, expenses and damages,

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which may follow or accrue to him;—
 all which shall be executed upon them
 in virtue of this writing, and the oaths
 of him who possesses it, or of whom ever may
 succeed him, to whom he leaves it to
 fix the amount, and he relieves him
 from other proof. And for the assurance
 of all the foregoing, the grantor binds
 his person, his property which he now has
 or may hereafter obtain, and with it
 submits himself, and renounces the
 laws in his favor and defense, with
 the legal exceptions in form, and he
 confers ample power in the Magistrates



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In this case the claimants have offered in evidence traced copies of the leasehold and grant to Don Pedro Camillo. The grant was issued by Pio Pico Governor, and is dated the 15th day of May 1846.

The claimants have also offered in evidence a deed of conveyance from the said Camillo and his wife, of the premises to Don Bezar Simmons dated the 20th day of October 1846.

Also a deed of assignment from the said Simmons to the said Billings and others, the present claimants, bearing date the 3^d day of Sept 1852.

The genuineness of all said documents is satisfactorily established by the proofs in the case.

The grant contains the usual conditions, and it now remains to be seen whether those conditions have been complied with. There is no evidence whatever that the original grantee ever did anything whatever in the line of improvement or that he or any other person ever inhabited the same up to the day of his sale to the said Simmons. But it does appear from the documentary evidence that he sold the same before he had performed any of the conditions of inhabitation or cultivation,

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in violation of the terms and conditions of the grant. Thomas D. Ihns is the only witness in the case produced on the part of the claimants to prove the performance of the conditions of the grant. He testifies that he is acquainted with the premises in question and that he knows that three houses were erected sometime in the summer or fall of 1850 and that they were erected by the agent of William Chapman in order to keep possession of the Island and keep off squatters.

It is the opinion of the Board that the conditions of the grant and the law under which the same was issued have not been complied with and that the claim is invalid and that the same should be rejected, and a decree will be entered accordingly.




