



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Be it Remembered, that on this thirteenth day of November,
Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-two, before
the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in
the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San
Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America,
the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Care I. Coutts, for the place named
La Soledad, was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 485 and
is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were
had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco December 5' 1854.
Case no. 485, Care I. Coutts for the place named
"La Soledad" was ordered to be placed at the foot
of the 3^d class Cases on the Trial Docket.

San Francisco Dec. 18' 1854.
In the same Case the deposition of Santiago E.
Urquello, a witness in behalf of the claimant,
taken before Commissioner Stephen Felt, was
filed.

To the Board of Commissioners for ascertaining
and settling private Land claims in the State
of California.

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Your petitioner James I leowitz a
resident of the County of San Diego State of
California respectfully represents to your Honor
able Board, that he claims a certain tract of
Land called "La Soledad" situated in the
County of San Diego in said State of California
concerning One, "Siete de quinientos Mayas" more or
less; that he claims the same by purchase from
Francisco Muniz Alvarado, a Mexican by birth
to whom said Land was granted under the
Authority of the Mexican Government by Don
Joaquín Antonio Jiménez provisional Governor of
the Department of the California under date
of April 13th 1838. The transfer of said Land
from the said Francisco Muniz Alvarado
to the said James I leowitz was made on
the day of -

Your petitioner would further
represent that his full possession of said Land
was given to said grantee on the day of
and the soon after thereof designated and
defined, and that he and those claiming under
him, have been in the peaceful possession
thereof ever since, and that he knows of
no interfering claim,



On this day before Commissioner Alpheus Felch
came Santiago E. Arqueedo a witness on behalf
of the claimant James J. Gorrie in case No.
485, who after being duly sworn deposed as
follows, his testimony being interpreted by the
interpreter of the Board

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Question 1. What is your Name age and place
of residence?

Answer. My Name is Santiago E.
Arqueedo, my age is forty years, and my residence
is in San Diego County. State of California.

Question 2. Are you acquainted with
the hand writing of Jose Antonio Esteedillo and
of Carlos Antonio Leandero, if Yes, state your
means of knowledge And Look upon the docu-
ment now shown to you marked P.L.
No 1 Exhibited to this deposition and say whether
or not their signatures where they occur on
and upon said document are then true and
genuine signatures?

Answer. I am acquainted with the
hand writing of Jose Antonio Esteedillo and
Carlos Antonio Leandero having often seen them
write. Their signatures where they occur on said
document are then true and genuine signatures -
that of Jose Antonio Esteedillo once and that
of Carlos Antonio Leandero three times.

the taking of this deposition and caused his
right to cross-examine the witness.

To His Excellency The Governor
The citizen Francisco M. Alvarado
resident of this port in the most respectful manner
appears before your Excellency and says:

That populating the "panapa" known
as "Ledes Ponceguitos" which not being large enough
to raise a sufficient number of cattle for the
support of my family I solicit your Excellency
to grant me the land known as "La Soledad"
which is entirely vacant, a plan or map of which
will be hereafter presented. Wherefore I respectfully
request that you grant my request
which I will receive as a favor. Securing
what is necessary &c. Apologizing for this
common not having selected proper

(Marginal Decree)

San Diego April 11th 1838
See this be admitted. See the "encargado" Decree
of this Port ascertaining if the Land Soledad by
Don Francisco M^r Alvarado is the property
of any Mission or any particular person, and if
so granted to him without impediment to
third parties. The formalities having been com-
pleted with the design of the above Land will
be received and attached to this Expediente
and sent to the Government. His Excellency
Don Carlos Antonio Carillo in name of Governor
of the Department of California thus Orders Decrees
and Signs - which I certify

being without lands to raise the crops necessary

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In its subsistence I think it my duty to remark to your Excellency that in the grant to be made to the petitioner a clause should be inserted pertaining to this Community the privilege of raising thin crops on the opposite side of the "Soleada" San Diego - Llote up above

San Diego April 13th 1838

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In consideration of the Solemnization at the beginning of this Especial the information of the Señor of this Port and others received form the same, and in view of the powers conferred upon me in the name of the Mexican Nation I have granted the Land known as the "Soleada" to the Citizen Francisco Maria Alvarez Agreeably to the report of the above named Señor - Carlos Antonio Canello Provisorial Governor of California gave this Decree dated
Signed which I certify -

Carlos Antonio Canello Provisional Governor of the Department of California

In as much as Don Francisco Maria Alvarez a Mexican by birth has solecile for his personal benefit and that of his family the Land known by the name of the Soleada founded by the Pescadores and lands of the Native Indians of San Buenaventura, having previously completed with all the requisites and formalities of the Laws and regulations, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me in the name of the Mexican Nation

I have by decree of this day Conceded to grant to the Señor Francisco Maria Alvarez the aforementioned land "La Soleada" deeming it his property by these presents, reserving it to the approval of the Departmental Assembly and under the following conditions.

1st. He shall submit to the requirements of the regulations in relation to the construction of houses, And at this time the mentioned party shall place no encumbrance whatever

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On the Land granted to him, of a place or other
nature.

2^o. He may enclose it without prejudice to the
crop roads and streets; he shall enjoy it
freely and exclusively, devolving it to the extent
most agreeable to himself, but he shall permit
the inhabitants of the part of San Diego to
raise on it the crops necessary for their
subsistence.

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3^o He shall solicit the proper Judge to give him
the decree of possession in virtue of this
despatch by which shall be marked the
boundaries on whose limits shall be placed
in Land marks four or five trees of some
size.

4^o. The Land hereby granted is of "One Hectare
de ganado Maya" more or less as explained by
the design annexed to the Expediente; the Judge
who shall give the possession shall cause it
measured in accordance with the Ordinance
to fix the boundaries, the manner resulting
to the Nation for its convenient use.

5^o. If he contravenes these conditions he will
lose his right to the land which may be
announced.

In consequence I order that holding
this title as sum and notice, it be registered
and delivered to the interested party in his
Security and further ends.

The Only Documentary Evidence Offered in
Support of this Claim Consists of an Original
Expediente Containing 1st a petition accompanied
by the Swear by Francisco M Alvarado dated
April 10th 1838 Voluntarily before of the Land
Known as "La Soledad" 2nd A Marquee
Decree Enclosed On Same petition dated April 11th
1838 and Signed by Carlos Antonio Carreto refer-
ring the same to the Justice of the Port of San
Diego for the necessary information - 3rd a
Report Signed by Jose de Estudillo dated April
12th 1838 regarding the Land Vacant and
recommending the grant - 4th a decree of
Conception Signed "Carreto" dated April 13th
1838 declaring that landos Antonio Carreto
moreover Governor of California had by virtue
of the Authority Confided upon him granted the
Land Called La Soledad to the Citizen
Francisco Marcos Alvarado - 5th A formal
Title of the same date by which Carlos Antonio
Carreto as moreover Governor of the Departm-
ent of the California grants the Land Called
La Soledad to the Citizen Alvarado and
describing it as bounded by the Ponaquitos
and the Canadas of the Nation Called San Buen
aventura - The 4th Condition of the grant declares
it to be of the Extent of "One Hectare de garacho Mayor
More or Less as Explaned by the Descrip-
tion annexed to the Expediente.

The genuineness of the signatures
of all these documents is proved by the deposit
of Santiago El Arquero This Constitutes the whole
testimony in the case - There is nothing to show
by what authority Carreto exercised the
functions of Governor by virtue of which this
grant purports to be made - There is no
proof that the grantee ever was in possession
of or occupied the premises in any manner
no desco is produced nor is there any other
evidence by which the Socieare leagues of land

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Decree be rendered and its boundaries established
The evidence is clearly insufficient according
to the former ruling of the Commission to
decide the validity of the claim, and an
adverse decree will therefore be entered
