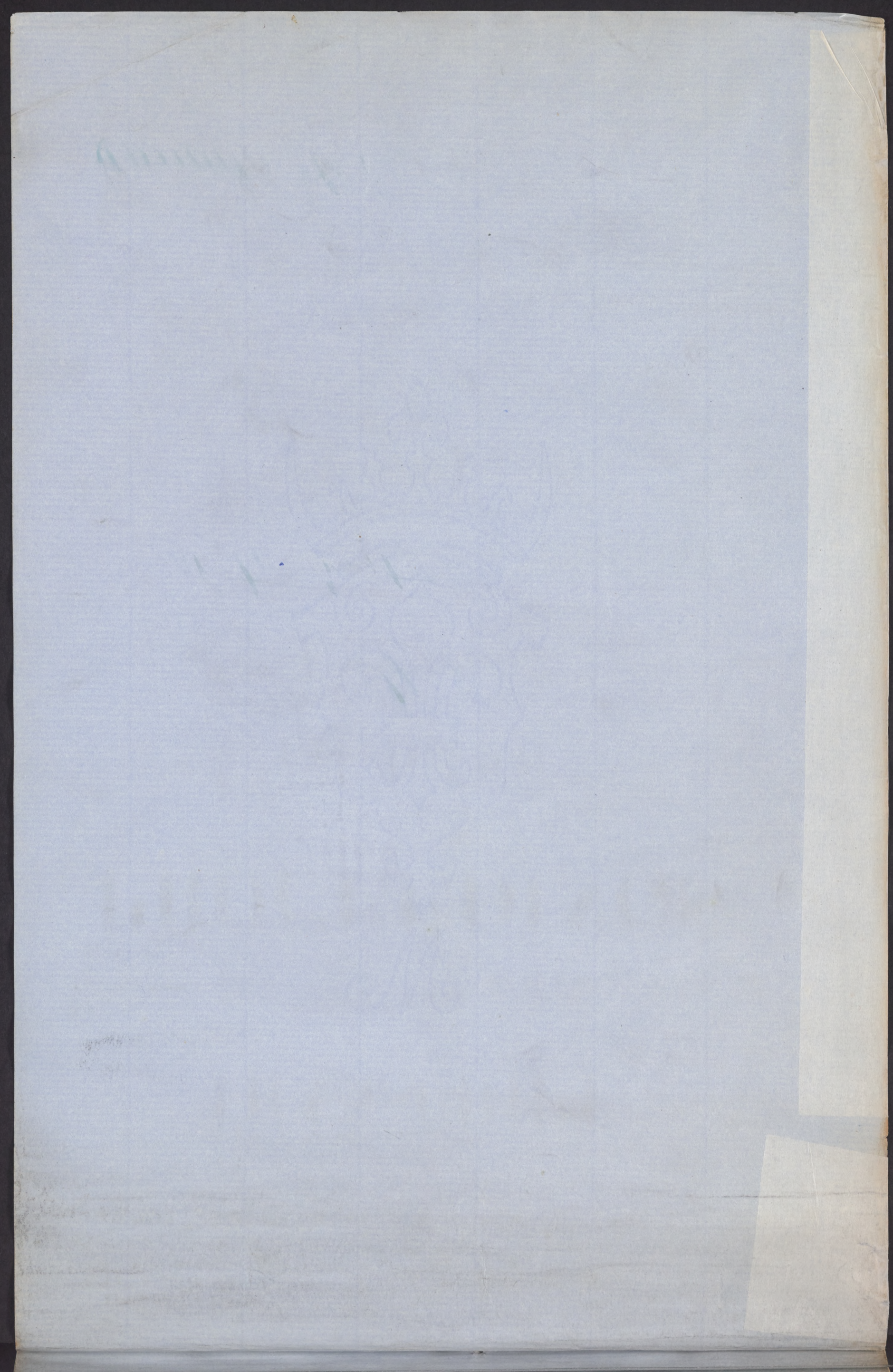

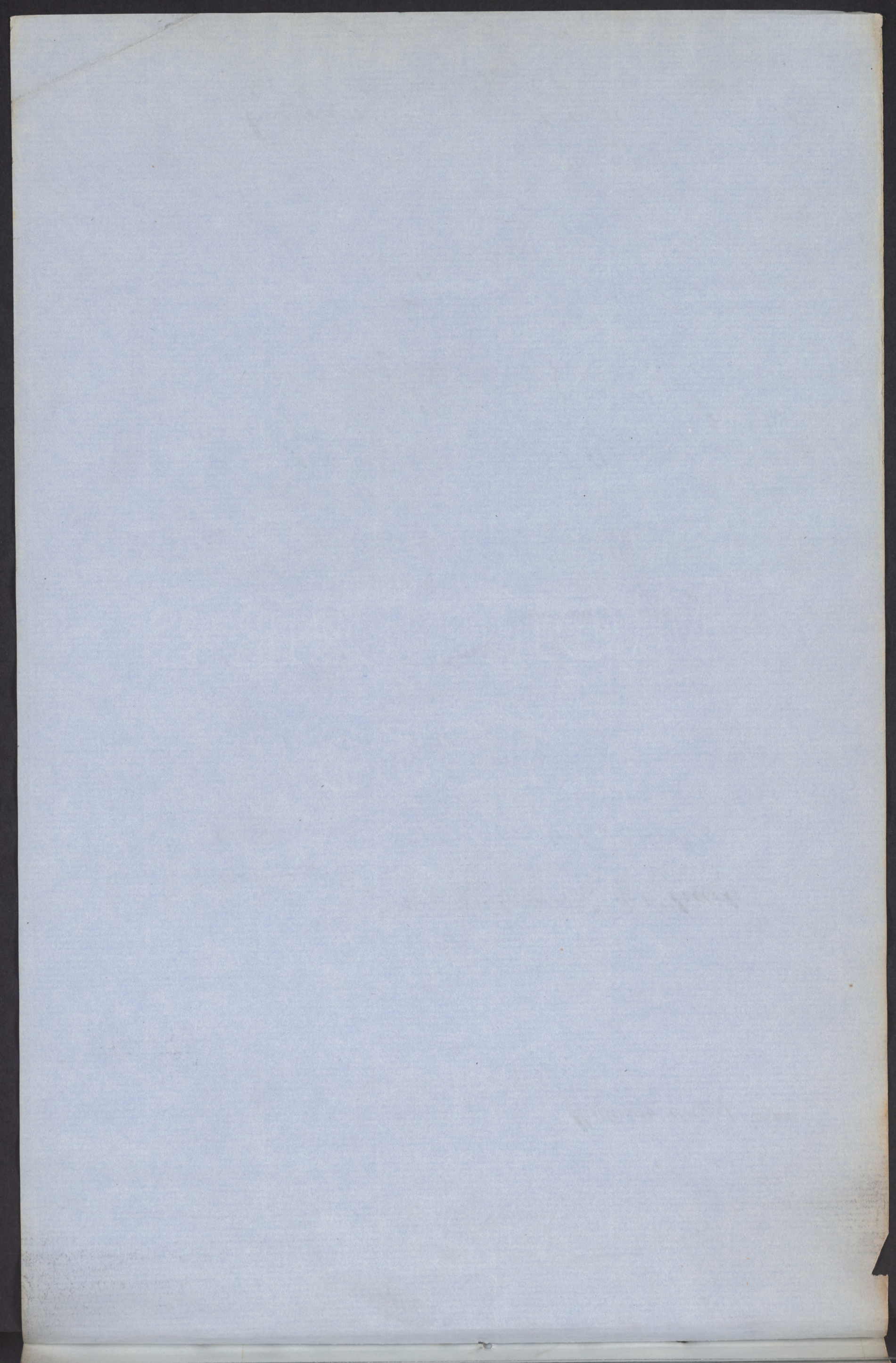

San Francisco December 13th 1852.

In case no. 488, *Anacleto Sestrade* for the place named *"Cañada de los Cochinos"*, the deposition of *Santiago Arzuella*, a witness in behalf of the claimant, taken before Commissioner *Milam Hall*, with documents marked N. H. Nos. 1 & 2, and translations thereof, annexed thereto, was filed.

In the same case the deposition of *Edwin L. B. Brooks*, a witness in behalf of the claimant, taken before Commissioner *Milam Hall*, with document marked N. H. No. 1, annexed thereto, was filed.

San Francisco December 5th 1854.

Case no. 488 was ordered to be placed at the foot of the 3rd class cases on the Trial Docket.

San Francisco December 19th 1854.

Case no. 488 was submitted under the Rule of March 21st 1854 and taken under advisement by the Board.

San Francisco December 26th 1854.

In the same case Commissioner Alpheus Felch delivered the opinion of the Board confirming the claim.

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3 Petition

To the United States Commissioners appointed by Act of Congress approved third of March A.D. 1851 Entitled an act to ascertain and settle the private Land claims in the State of California

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Your petitioner Anacleto Linares a citizen of the United States of America represents unto your Honors that he is the lawful owner of a certain ^{tract} tract of Land in the State of California, that he to wit, on the sixteenth day of August A.D. 1843 Manuel Micheltorena then Governor General and Inspector of the two Californias granted unto Mrs Apolonia Lorenzana by Grant duly executed according to the Laws of Mexico and by virtue of the powers vested in him a certain tract of Land pertaining to the Mission of San Diego in the County of San Diego called and known by the name of "Canales de los Cochinos" containing four hundred Varas on each side. That after wards to wit, on the 12th day of June A.D. 1846 the Departmental Assembly of Upper California confirmed the grant by decree of that date without the conditions mentioned in the original grant made by the said Manuel Micheltorena Governor as aforesaid, and three afterwards on the 15th day of June A.D. 1846 Pio Pico then Governor of California issued his certificate to the said Apolonia Lorenzana causing it to be known that the said Departmental Assembly had decreed the confirmation of her grant as aforesaid

That afterwards on the 14th day of October A.D. 1852 by decree the said Apolonia Lorenzana transferred her interest in said Land to your petitioner. And your petitioner further states that there is no encumbrance claim to his knowledge and that the documentary evidence on which he relies consists in the three transfers mentioned in the petition which herewith accompany the same and upon this evidence and the additional testimony to be taken hereon your petitioner prays your Honors to confirm by your decree the title to the said Land in himself and your petitioner will now pray as in duty bound

On this day before Com. Nelson
Hall came Santiago Arqueles a witness on
behalf of the claimant Anacleto Estrada
petition No. 488, and was duly sworn his evidence
being interpreted by the Secretary

The U. S. Associate Law Agent was present

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In answer to Enquiries by the Counsel for the
Claimant the Witness testifies as follows
My Name is Santiago Arqueles
My age is sixty years & I reside in San Diego
I know the Rancho Canada del
Coches, it is situated five or six leagues from
San Diego. I have known it ever since Judge
Poperson was governor of the place to Apolonario
Lorenzana. I was present at the giving of such
possession, but do not recollect the precise
time. I know the boundaries on the South.
There is a Sycamore tree close to a watering place
called Aguayo de Fuerte. On the North the
Arroyo del Cajon. On the East the Rancho del
Llanaja & on the West the Cajon. It is the top
or bottom, fundo of the Arroyo del Cajon that is
the boundary on the North

A paper is now shown me purporting to be a
grant to Apolonario Lorenzana dated the
16th day of May 1843. I am acquainted with
the signatures of Manuel Melillo and
Francisco Arce. Their signatures to said paper
I believe to be genuine. It is hereto annexed
& marked H. H. No. 1

A paper is also shown me purporting to be
a certificate of approval of the Departmental
Assembly dated the 15th of June 1846.
The signatures of Pio Pico & Jose Mateos
Moran on said paper with which I am
acquainted I believe to be genuine
It is hereto annexed & marked H. H. No. 2

The Rancho Canada del Cochis was accepted
as early as the middle of the year 1844 by

6
Apolinario Senenizario. She had a house there with a Maya como living in it & had a garden and cultivated the land. She has constructed two dams to obtain water for irrigation & has been raising wheat and barley. I do not know that it was occupied after the year 1846. It was occupied until that time in 1846.

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In answer to questions by the Associate Law Agent the witness says she was a single woman & had no children

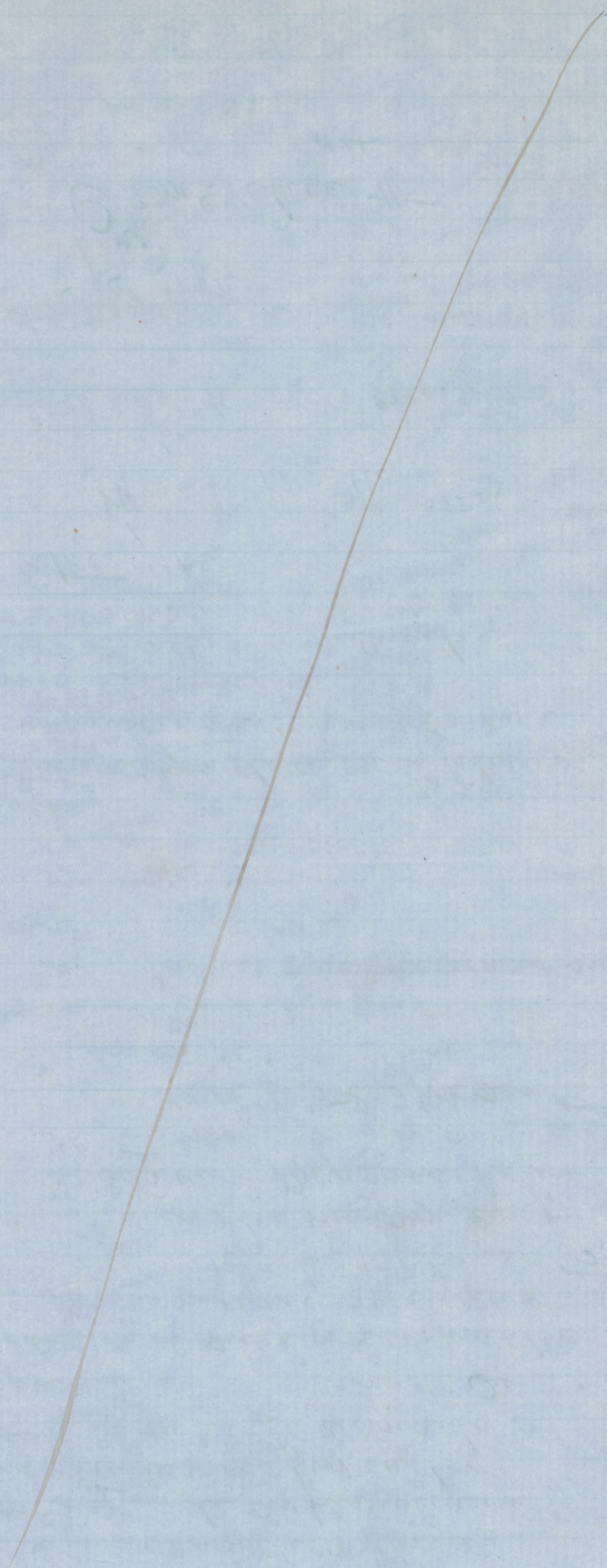

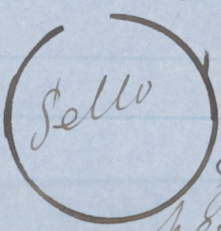

been previously had according to the provis-
ions of the laws and regulations in the
Exercise of the powers conferred on me in
the name of the Mexican Nation I have
Concluded to grant to her the said tract of
Land hereby declaring unto her the ownership
thereof, Subject to the Condition that she
in No wise injure the Mission if at any
time or in any Seasons it has Cultivation on
the said place.

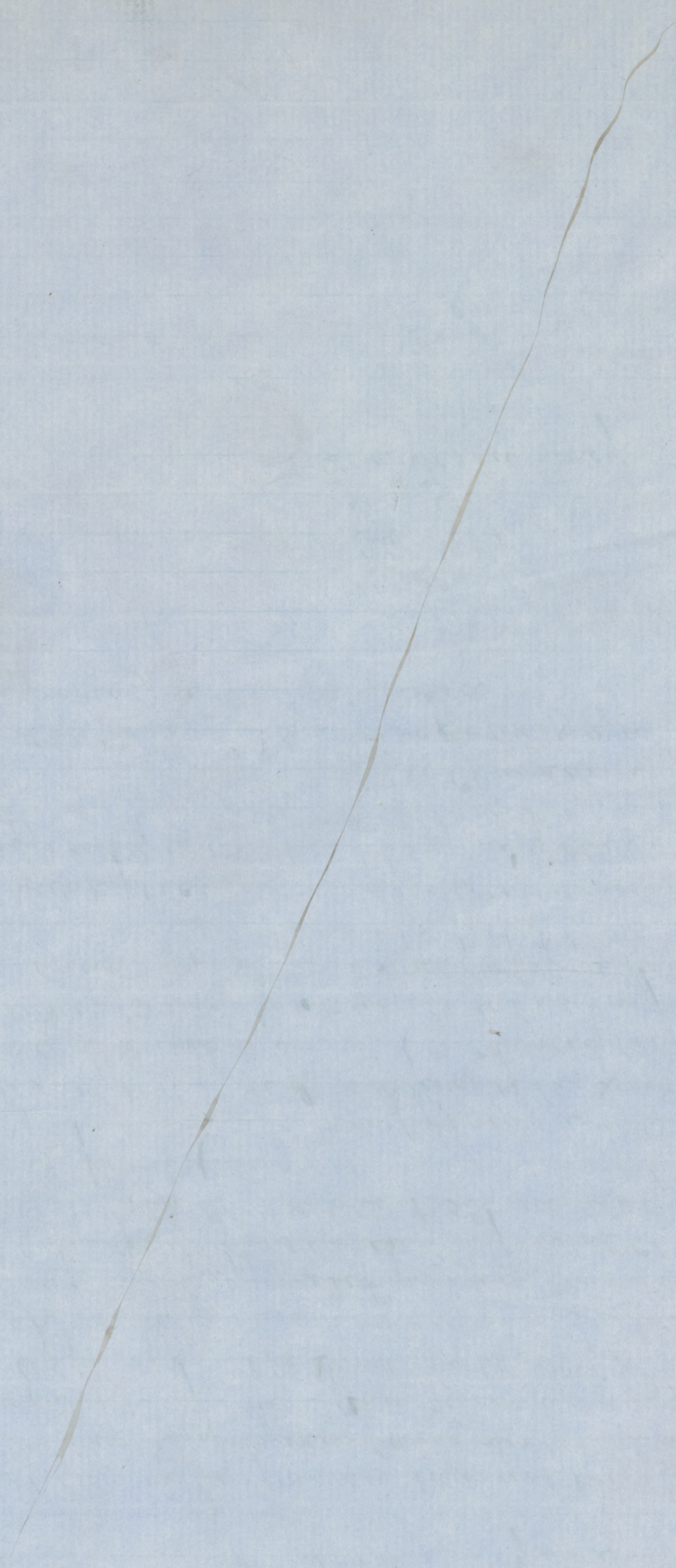

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A grant made by Governor Manuel Micheltorena to Apolonara Loranjana on the sixteenth day of May 1843 is proved and filed a certificate of the approval of the same by the Departmental Assembly on the 12th day of June 1846 and a conveyance of the premises granted, made by said grantee to Lestrada the present claimant on the 14th of October 1852 are also proved and proved.

The proof shows a substantial compliance with the conditions of the Law by building a house upon and cultivating the place. The Alitup Santiago Aguero who was present at the giving of the judicial possession to the grantee, specifies the boundaries of the land with such precision as apparently to obviate all objection in making the survey of it.

The right of the Claimant seems to be established by the proofs and a decree of Confirmation will be entered.

In this case on hearing the proofs and allegations, it is adjudged by the Commission that the claim of the said petitioner is valid, and it is therefore decreed that the same be confirmed.

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The Land of which Confirmation is hereby made is that formerly possessed by Apolinario Lorenzana known by the name of *Canada de los Cochinos*, and situated in San Diego County and is bounded and described as follows; to wit: Bounded on the North by the bottom Lands (Veja) of the Arroyo de los Cajon; on the East the *Canada de Canaya*; on the West by the Cajon; and on the South by a line parallel with said North boundary in which stands a Sycamore tree close to a blating place entitled *Algaray de Huerto*; Each of the four sides of said promises being four hundred varas in length; being the same Land which was granted to said Apolinario Lorenzana by Governor Manuel Micheltorena on May 1843



TO THE HON. ISAAC S. K. OGIER, JUDGE :

The Petition of Pacificus Ord, a resident of said City, County, and State, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, who petitions in this behalf for the United States, and being present here in Court, in the name and behalf of the United States, represents as follows: That heretofore, to wit: on or about the 13th day of ~~December~~ December A. D. 1852, Anacleto Lestrade

presented a petition to the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the private land claims in the State of California, when sitting as a Board, claiming a tract of land called Canada delos Cochis in the County of San Diego — State of California, which said petition is referred to for a description of the land claimed, a copy of which appears in the transcript hereafter referred to. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 26th day of ~~December~~ December A. D. 1854, the said Commissioners confirmed, by final decision, the said claim of said petitioner. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 12th day of July A. D. 1855, a duly certified transcript of the proceedings and decision of the said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and evidence on which the said decision was founded, was filed in the Office of the Clerk of the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, and marked No. 488; reference to which it is prayed may be had and made part of this petition. That on or about the 1st day of August A. D. 1855, the Honorable Caleb Cushing, Attorney-General of the United States, received a duly certified duplicate of said transcript of the proceedings and decision of said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and

evidence on which said decision was founded. That thereafter, to wit: ^{or about} on the 20th day of November — A. D. 1853, the said Attorney-General of the United States filed, or caused to be filed, in behalf of the United States, a notice with the Clerk of said District Court of the United States, that the appeal in said cause from the said decision of the said Commissioners, in the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, would be prosecuted by the United States. Your petitioner further represents, that the land claimed, as aforesaid, is situate in the Southern District of California, and within the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court. Your petitioner further represents and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimant, presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further denies that the said claimant has any valid right or title to said land claimed as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

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And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said petition to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision confirming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

said claim should have been rejected by them. And the said claimant, having no valid right or title derived from the Spanish or Mexican Governments, to the land claimed as aforesaid, the lawful right and title in and to the said land was acquired by, and it now belongs to the United States, by virtue of conquest, and the Treaty of peace, friendship, limits and settlement, between the United States and the Republic of Mexico, made at the City of Guadalupe Hidalgo, February 2d, A. D. 1848.

Wherefore, the said Pacificus Ord, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, for and in behalf of the United States, by reason of the premises, and in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California," approved March 3d, A. D. 1851, and the laws and statutes in such case made and provided, prays that the said claimant, or his attorney may be served with a copy of this petition; and that this Honorable Court will review the said decision of said Commissioners, and reverse the same; and decide on the validity of the ^{said claim,} ~~same~~, and decree the alleged title to be invalid: with costs and general relief.
