



San Francisco December 13' 1852.

In Case no. 488, Anacleto Lestrade for the place named
"Canada de los Coches," the deposition of Santiago Arquello,
a witness in behalf of the claimant, taken before Commissioner Hilard Hall, with documents marked St. No.
Nos. 102, and translations thereof, annexed thereto,
was filed.

In the same case the deposition of Edwin L. B. Brooks,
a witness in behalf of the claimant, taken before
Commissioner Hilard Hall, with document marked
H. H. M. 1, annexed thereto, was filed.

the 3rd class cases on the Trial Docket.

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3 Petition

To the United States Commissioners appointed by
by Act of Congress approved thirs of March A.D.
1851 Entituled an act to ascertain and settle the
private Land claims in the State of California

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Your petitioner Anacleto Lebraza a citizen
of the United States of America represents unto your
Honors that he is the lawful owner of a certain Ranch
or tract of Land in the State of California, that he has
of late, to wit, On the sixteenth day of August A.D. 1848
Manuel Michelena then Governor General and
Inspector of the Two Californias granted unto Mrs
Apolonaria Lorenzana by Grant duly executed
according to the Laws of Mexico and by virtue
of the powers vested in him a certain tract of Land
Land pertaining to the Mission of San Diego in
the County of San Diego Called and known by
the Name of Rancho de los Coches "Concerning
four hundred acres on each side. That offices
lands to wit, On the 12th day of June A.D. 1846
the Departmental Assembly of Upper California
Confirmed the grant by decree of that date without
the conditions mentioned in the original grant made
by the Said Manuel Michelena Governor as
aforesaid, and three offices On the 15th day
of June A.D. 1846 Pio Pico then Governor of
California issued his certificate to the said Apolonia
Lorenzana Confirming it to be known that the
said Departmental Assembly had decreed the
Confirmation of his grant as aforesaid.

That offices On the 14th day
of October A.D. 1852 by decree the said Apolonia
Lorenzana transferred her interest in said Land
to your petitioner. And your petitioner further states
that there is no encroaching claim to his knowledge
and that the documentary evidence on which he
relies consists in the three transfers mentioned in the
petition on which herewith accompany the same
And upon this evidence and the additional
testimony to be taken hereon your petitioner prays
your Honors to confirm by your decree the title
to the said Land in himself and your petitioner
will now pray as in duty bound

5 Deposition of Santiago Arguello Los Angeles Nov. 17th 1853

On this day before Leon Belance
Hull came Santiago Arguello a witness on
behalf of the claimant Anacleto Lestradeo
petition No. 488, and was duly sworn his evidence
being interpreted by the Secretary

The U. S. Associate Law Agent was present

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In answer to Enquiries by the licensee in the
Claimant the witness testifies as follows

My name is Santiago Arguello
My age is Sixty years & I reside in San Diego
I know the Rancho Canada del
Coches, it is situated five or six leagues from
San Diego. I have known it over since 1840
so soon as queen of the place to Apolonio
Lorenzana. I was present at the giving of such
sovereignty, but do not recollect the precise
time. I know the boundaries on the South.
There is a Sycamore tree close to a watering place
called Agua de Fuego. On the North the
Arroyo del Cajon on the East the Rancho del
Cajon & on the West the Cajon. It is the base
or bottom, fundo of the Arroyo del Cajon there is
the boundary on the North

A paper is now shown me purporting to be a
grant to Apolonio Lorenzana dated the
16th day of May 1843. I am acquainted with
the signatures of Manuel Mechillor and
Francesco Rice their signatures to said paper
I believe to be genuine. It is hereunto annexed
& marked H. H. No. 1

A paper is also shown me purporting to be
a certificate of approval of the Departmental
Assembly dated the 15th of June 1846.

The signatures of Pio Pico & Jose Matias
Morales on said paper which I am
acquainted I believe to be genuine
It is hereunto annexed & marked H. H. No. 2

The Rancho Canada del Coches was occupied
as early as the middle of the year 1844 by

Apolinarico Sonenzarco. She had a house there with a Maya domo living in it & had a garden and cultivated the land. She has constructed two dams to obtain water for irrigation & has been raising wheat and barley. I do not know that it was occupied after the fire in 1846. It was occupied until that time in 1846.

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In answer to questions by the Associate Law Agent the witness says - She was a single woman & had no children.

I was present when the said transfer was executed by the said Apolinarico and saw her sign it & I placed my name on it as a witness at the date it bears. I also saw other witness sign it at the same time.

has not been recorded. The instrument was
read to her in Spanish & explained to her by
me.





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Whereas Dona Apolonia Lorenzana has petitioned for her personal benefit and and that of her family a tract of Land four hundred varas square in the place known by the name of Ranada de los Coches belonging to the Mision of San Diego to establish thereon her cultivation. The proceedings and investigations upon the matter having been previously had according to the provisions of the laws and regulations in the exercise of the powers conferred on me in the Name of the Mexican Nation I have Conceded to grant to her the said tract of land hereby declining unto her the ownership thereof, subject to the condition that she in nowise injure the Mision if at any time, or in any seasons it has cultivation on the said place.

Therefore the present being held as a firm and valid title I order that an entry be made of it in the proper Book and that it be delivered to the interested party for her security and other purposes



Anacleto Lestaca

400 Varas Square

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A grant made by Governor Manuel Micheltorena
to Apolonio Soriano on the sixteenth day
of May 1843 is proved and filed a certificate
of the approval of the same by the Departmental
Assembly on the 12th day of June 1846 and a
copy of the premises granted, made by
Secretary to Lestaca the present claim
and on the 14th of October 1852 are also presen-
ted and proved.

The proof shows a substantial
compliance with the conditions of the law by
building a house upon and cultivating the place
The Miller Santiago Arguello who was present
at the giving of the judicial possession to the
grantee, specifies the boundaries of the land
with such precision as apparently to obviate
all difficulty in making the survey of it.

The right of the claimant seems
to be established by the proofs and a decree
of confirmation will be entered

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

TO THE HON. ISAAC S. K. OGIER, JUDGE:

The Petition of Pariscus Ord, a resident of said City, County, and State, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, who petitions in this behalf for the United States, and being present here in Court, in the name and behalf of the United States, represents as follows: That heretofore, to wit: on or about the 13th day of December A. D. 1852, Anacleto Lestrade

presented a petition to the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the private land claims in the State of California, when sitting as a Board, claiming a tract of land called Canada delos Coches

in the County of San Diego — State of California, which said petition is referred to for a description of the land claimed, a copy of which appears in the transcript hereafter referred to. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 26. day of December A. D 1854, the said Commissioners confirmed, by final decision, the said claim of said petitioner. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 12. day of July A. D. 1855, a duly certified transcript of the proceedings and decision of the said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and evidence on which the said decision was founded, was filed in the Office of the Clerk of the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, and marked No. 488; reference to which it is prayed may be had and made part of this petition. That on or about the 1st day of August A. D. 1855, the Honorable Caleb Cushing, Attorney-General of the United States, received a duly certified duplicate of said transcript of the proceedings and decision of said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and

evidence on which said decision was founded. That thereafter, to wit:
~~on about~~ on the 20th day of November — A. D. 1855, the said
Attorney-General of the United States filed, or caused to be filed, in
behalf of the United States, a notice with the Clerk of said District
Court of the United States, that the appeal in said cause from the said
decision of the said Commissioners, in the District Court of the United
States for the Southern District of California, would be prosecuted by the
United States. Your petitioner further represents, that the land claimed,
as aforesaid, is situate in the Southern District of California, and within
the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court. Your petitioner further represents
and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said
Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for
many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified
transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said
cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all
and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimant,
presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further
denies that the said claimant has any valid right or title to said land claimed
as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

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And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said pe-
tition to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision con-
firming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

said claim should have been rejected by them. And the said claimant, having no valid right or title derived from the Spanish or Mexican Governments, to the land claimed as aforesaid, the lawful right and title in and to the said land was acquired by, and it now belongs to the United States, by virtue of conquest, and the Treaty of peace, friendship, limits and settlement, between the United States and the Republic of Mexico, made at the City of Guadalupe Hidalgo, February 2d, A. D. 1848.

Wherefore, the said Pacificus Ord, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, for and in behalf of the United States, by reason of the premises, and in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California," approved March 3d, A. D. 1851, and the laws and statutes in such case made and provided, prays that the said claimant, or his attorney may be served with a copy of this petition; and that this Honorable Court will review the said decision of said Commissioners, and reverse the same; and decide on the validity of the ^{said claim} ~~same~~, and decree the alleged title to be invalid: with costs and general relief.
