



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Be it Remembered, that on this twenty eighth day of January, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Three, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

Petition

To the Honorable Commissioners to Settle Private Land Claims in California

The petitioner Lewis I. Burton and Jose Carrillo respectfully represent
That on the 8th day of April A.D. 1837
Juan B Alvarado Governor of California by virtue
of authority in him vested granted to Lucas Olivera,
Antonio Olivera, and Jose Antonio Olivera the tract
of Land called "Jesus Maria" situated in the present
County of Santa Barbara with the boundaries
described in the grant and corresponding map which
grant was duly approved by the Deputation of Calif
ornia on the 19th day of April A.D. 1837 all of which
is shown by the Original grant map, and approval
submitted herewith marked "A" with translations
marked "B"

That the said tract of Land was duly
surveyed and the judicial papermess of it given
on the 20th day of May A.D. 1840 which judicial
act of papermess and Survey is submitted herewith
marked "C" with translations marked "D"

That on the 17th day of August A.D. 1839
and the 18th day of October 1841 the said Jose A
Olivera and Antonio Olivera sold and conveyed
them in trust (that is, two thirds) in said Land
to Jose Maria Valenzuela which original Deeds
of Conveyance are submitted herewith marked "E"
with translations marked "F"

That on the 11th day of September A.D.
1847 the said Valenzuela sold and conveyed one
third part of said tract of land to Pedro G
Carrillo which original Deed of conveyance
is submitted herewith marked "G" with translations
marked "H"

That on the 5th day of November A.D.
1857 the said Pedro G Carrillo and wife conveyed
the said one third part of said land to the
petitioner Lewis I. Burton which original Deed
of Conveyance is submitted herewith marked "I"

That on the 5th day of May 1857 the said
Jose Maria Valenzuela sold and conveyed his
remaining one third part of the said land to
the petitioner Lewis I. Burton which original
Deed of Conveyance is submitted herewith
marked "J"

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That on the 2^d day of December A.D. 1845 the said Lucas Olivera sold and conveyed his one third part of the said tract of Land to Juan Camarillo which original conveyance is submitted herewith marked "R" with translations marked "T"

That on the 27th day of June A.D. 1846 the said Juan Camarillo sold and conveyed the said one third part of the said tract of Land to the petitioner Jose Canillo which original Deed of Conveyance is submitted herewith marked "M" with translations marked "N"

Thus leaving the petitioner Lewis J. Burton the owner of two undivided third parts, and the petitioner Jose Canillo the owner of one undivided third part of said tract of Land.

And the petitioners further represent that they and those under whom they hold have been for more than fifteen years and the petitioners now are in the just and peaceable and undisputed possession of said tract of Land

That they know of no conflicting claim. That they rely for confirmation of title upon the original traps submitted herewith upon the records and minutes in the archives of the former Government now in the charge of the Surveyor General; And upon such other & further proofs as they may be advised are necessary.

Wherefore they pray the Commissioners to confirm to them the aforesaid tract of Land



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The land was occupied by Lucas Olivera and Jose Antonio Olivera in the year 1837 and has ever since been so occupied by them and by other people. They had houses on the land, cattle and cultivated the land. The other occupants held under titles derived from the Oliveras.

Who have occupied it within the last year
Jose Carrillo occupied it about a year ago and for some time past Burton has occupied it exclusively.

Question by Claimants Atty
Do you know the Ranch called Jesus Maria
claimed by Lewis Burton and Jose Carrillo in
this Case and if so state where it is situated
and all you know in relation to its occupancy,
cultivation and improvement.

Answer. I know said Ranch. It is situated in
the County of Santa Barbara between the Ranch
of Don Gudronas Hartnell called Todas Santas
and that of Antonio Oliveras called Carmall.

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On another side is the Ranch of Joaquin Camillo called Lompos. It was first occupied in 1836 or 1837 by Antonio Oliverao Lucas Alveira and Jose Antonio Olivera. They had two houses in one of which Antonio and Jose Antonio Alvaro father & Son lived and Lucas Olivera in the other. They cultivated a small portion of the land. They had on it also stocks of cattle & horses & corn etc. The houses they first built were of wood they afterwards built of adobe. They continued to occupy it until Antonio and Jose Antonio sold their interest to Jose Maria Valenzuela who immediately afterwards went into occupation of said interests and continued to occupy in conjunction with the other partners until they sold to the claimants.

Question by Sam.

Do you know the boundary between the Rancho Jesus Maria and that of Tudas Santas and your means of knowledge

Answer. I do. I gave the judicial possession of the Rancho of Tudas Santas in my official capacity as Alcalde in doing which I run said line

The Citizens Lucas Antonio and
José Antonio Olivera residents of this town before
the well known justification of your Excellency
as they best may in law make representation,
that needing land in which to be able to dedicate
themselves to the interesting branch of agriculture
in order to seek by this means a subsistence for their
large families they apply for aid from the hands of
Colonization petitioning for the place called "Jesus
Maria" the corresponding Map of which they duly
transmit. This land although it has pertained
to the Exemption of "La Purísima" is at this time
vacant and in a state to be granted in Colonization.
Wherefore they earnestly pray Your Excellency to
be pleased to acced to their petition excusing
them for sending this on common paper there
being none of the Stamps swearing at the same time
whatever may be necessary etc.

Olivera. Petitioning for the place named "Jesus
Maria" in compliance with the decree of the
Government of the 20th of March of this year
representing that the persons interested possess
all the legal requirements to entitle their
petition to be admitted, that the land
they petition for is vacant and in a condition

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to be granted in Colonization agreeable to the Law of August 18th 1824 and to the regulation of November 1828 for although it has been known as the property of the Ex Mission of La Paresemic¹⁰ it is at present vacant without the necessary occupation and consequently in a State to be granted in conformity the Laws referred to. Those who represent are deserving Mexican Citizens. of good character and have property with which to stock it. for which reasons they are entitled to be aided by the Laws and by the consideration of the government to which they make representation

Wherefore the Committee offers for the deliberation of Your Illustrious Body the following proposition

"The Government may grant in fee to the Citizens Lucas Antonio and Jose Antonio Olivera the place named Jesus Maria"

it in Mortmain.

2^o They may enclose it without prejudice to the
Crops, roads servitudes; they will enjoy it fully
and exclusively dedicating it to the uses and
cultivation which may best suit them

3^o When the ownership is confirmed to them, they
will request thy proper Magistrate to give them
judicial possession in virtue of this patent by
whom the boundaries will be marked out, and
they will place the bounds.

4th The land of which donation is made



"^{2^o} They may enclose it without prejudice to the Cross roads and servitudes and enjoy it fully & exclusively, making such use or cultivation of it as they may see fit."

"^{3^o} When the ownership is confirmed to them they shall request the proper Judge to give them judicial possession in virtue of this order, for which purpose the boundaries will be marked out and the bounds placed"

"^{4^o} The land granted them in donation is solely that described in the petition of the parties interested marked on the map which goes with this Expediente, and the Magistrate who may give the possession will report to this Government the number of Setas it contains".





Your petitioner further represents and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimants presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further denies that the said claimants ~~has~~ ^{have} any valid right or title to said land claimed as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

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And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said petition to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision confirming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

said claim should have been rejected by them. And the said
claimants having no valid right or title derived from the Spanish or
Mexican Governments, to the land claimed as aforesaid, the lawful
right and title in and to the said land was acquired by, and it now
belongs to the United States, by virtue of conquest, and the Treaty
of peace, friendship, limits and settlement, between the United States
and the Republic of Mexico, made at the City of Guadalupe
Hidalgo, February 2d, A. D. 1848.

Wherefore, the said Pacificus Ord, Attorney of the United States
for the Southern District of California, for and in behalf of the
United States, by reason of the premises, and in pursuance of the Act of
Congress, entitled "An Act to ascertain and settle the Private Land
Claims in the State of California," approved March 3d, A. D.
1851, and the laws and statutes in such case made and provided, prays
that the said claimants or ~~their~~^{their} attorneys may be served with a copy of this
petition; and that this Honorable Court will review the said decision
of said Commissioners, and reverse the same; and decide on the validity of
the ^{said claim} ~~same~~, and decree the alleged title to be invalid: with costs and general
relief.
