



Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Three, before  
the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in  
the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San  
Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America,  
the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Antonio Olivera,  
for the Place named  
"Casmalia,"  
was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 553 and  
is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were

San Francisco September 29' 1853.  
In Case no. 553, Antonio Olivera for the place named  
"Casmalia", the deposition of W<sup>m</sup> E. S. Hartwell, a  
witness in behalf of the claimant, taken before  
Commissioner Alpheus Felch, with documents  
marked "A. F. Nos. 1+2", annexed thereto, was filed;

San Francisco December 5' 1854.  
Case no. 553 was ordered to be placed at the foot  
of the 3d class cases on the Trial Docket.



the following conditions

1st. He may enclose the aforesaid lands  
without injuring the trees and highways  
and structures he will copy it fully and  
exclusively applying it to the uses and culture  
to which he has shall appear best for  
within a year his land shall always which  
shall be inhabitated

2nd. He will pay four thousand pesos  
the judicial possession in virtue of these  
pursuits for which purpose the boundaries  
shall be designated wherein besides the  
status shall be placed summing up  
possessions of same acre

3rd. The land known by the name of Leasmalva  
consists of grazing land (dos setos o ganaderia  
Major) nevertheless assuring the holder a com-  
pany these pursuits,

The judge who will give the possession shall have the land measured agreeably to the manner the parties choose to run over to the native parts use & if the grantee does not comply with these conditions his/her law and his rights to the land which shall be granted to victims.

Wherefore I do now this day see  
held firm and valid that entry shew  
be made in the proper books and it shall  
be admitted till party for his security  
and otherwise.



of Jesus Maria and having stopped at the  
entrance of the Laguna Verde they said that  
they had measured one hundred leuis off fifty yards  
each at which place a stake was placed as a  
boundary.

This measurement being ended  
it gave as result two square leagues of grazing  
land and a little over and having fixed the  
boundaries as follows

- 1st The entrance of the Laguna Verde
- 2d The top of the range of Mountains of the  
Llano de la Laja
- 3d The hills del Sospe
- 4th The top of the hillside of Jesus  
Maria beyond those presents intersecting  
alluvium up to the witnessess

date I have judged and that in virtue



The Petition of Pacificus Ord, a resident of said City, County, and State, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, who petitions in this behalf for the United States, and being present here in Court, in the name and behalf of the United States, represents as follows: That heretofore, to wit: on or about the 5<sup>th</sup> day of February A. D. 1853, Antonio Olivera

presented a petition to the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the private land claims in the State of California, when sitting as a Board, claiming a tract of land called Carmelita

in the County of Santa Barbara State of California, which said petition is referred to for a description of the land claimed, a copy of which appears in the transcript hereafter referred to. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 6<sup>th</sup> day of March A. D. 1855, the said Commissioners confirmed, by final decision, the said claim of said petitioner. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 4<sup>th</sup> day of October A. D. 1855, a duly certified transcript of the proceedings and decision of the said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and evidence on which the said decision was founded, was filed in the Office of the Clerk of the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, and marked No. 553; reference to which it is prayed may be had and made part of this petition. That on or about the 15<sup>th</sup> day of September A. D. 1855, the Honorable Caleb Cushing, Attorney-General of the United States, received a duly certified duplicate of said transcript of the proceedings and decision of said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and

evidence on which said decision was founded. That thereafter, to wit: on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of November A. D. 1855, the said Attorney-General of the United States filed, or caused to be filed, in behalf of the United States, a notice with the Clerk of said District Court of the United States, that the appeal in said cause from the said decision of the said Commissioners, in the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, would be prosecuted by the United States. Your petitioner further represents, that the land claimed, as aforesaid, is situate in the Southern District of California, and within the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court. Your petitioner further represents and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimant, presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further denies that the said claimant has any valid right or title to said land claimed as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

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And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said petition to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision confirming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

said claim should have been rejected by them. And the said  
claimant, having no valid right or title derived from the Spanish or  
Mexican Governments, to the land claimed as aforesaid, the lawful  
right and title in and to the said land was acquired by, and it now  
belongs to the United States, by virtue of conquest, and the Treaty  
of peace, friendship, limits and settlement, between the United States  
and the Republic of Mexico, made at the City of Guadalupe  
Hidalgo, February 2d, A. D. 1848.

Wherefore, the said Pacificus Ord, Attorney of the United States  
for the Southern District of California, for and in behalf of the  
United States, by reason of the premises, and in pursuance of the Act of  
Congress, entitled "An Act to ascertain and settle the Private Land  
Claims in the State of California," approved March 3d, A. D.  
1851, and the laws and statutes in such case made and provided, prays  
that the said claimant, or his attorney may be served with a copy of this  
petition; and that this Honorable Court will review the said decision  
of said Commissioners, and reverse the same; and decide on the validity of  
the <sup>said claim</sup> ~~same~~ and decree the alleged title to be invalid: with costs and general  
relief.
