






3 Petition

To the U. S. Land Commission for the ascertaining and settling of Private Land Claims in California.

The petition of Sebastian Rodriguez respectfully sheweth that he had obtained a grant of a tract of Land in the year 1823 by Governor Luis Arguello, and has been in possession thereof ever since. That he lose all the documents relating to and showing the execution of said grant in the year 1827; and that being so entirely destitute and unable to make the necessary proof of title, if required so to do, he made and presented a petition in writing to Governor Alvarado on the 27th of September 1837 soliciting the issuance of a new grant for the land so occupied by him.

That said Alvarado by a decree dated the 30th September 1837 acceded to your petitioner's pretensions, under the condition that he should obtain previous possession from the respective magistrate upon the proof whereof the corresponding title and documents should be delivered to him.

That your petitioner fully complied with the concession aforesaid and obtained previous possession of said Land on the 6th of November 1837, and has ever since continued in the quiet and peaceful possession of said Land.

That the records of the proceedings aforesaid were submitted by your petitioner to the Government of California, but that no further measures

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were taken in favor of your petitioner

And your petitioner further saith that
his petition of the year 1827, the Governor's
decree and the documents of your period
ical possession are on file in the archives
of California now in the possession of the
Surveyor General General of the U. S. of
America for the State of California, and
that duly Certified Copies and translations
of the same are herewith submitted and
prayed to be made a part of this petition.

That the land petitioned for
lies in the present County of Monterey
near the Sea Shore between the "Anoys
de Pajaro and Santa Cruz; is known by
the name of "Rancho de Pajaro" or "Bolsa
de Pajaro, and containing about two square
leagues of Land more or less.

That the boundaries as
fixed by the Magistrate giving predecial
possession are as follows:

Commencing at a Point where three poplars
stand on the side of a small lagoon
running South East to the banks of the
River Pajaro, which point is the western
of said Rancho and is about forty four
Cordas of fifty varas each distant
therefrom, running towards the North
West to the Rancho of Jose Amesti, toward
as the North East to the Rancho of
Manuel Jimeno, towards South and
South West to the River Pajaro and
returning the same to a Sump which
obstructs the passage to the sea.

And your petitioner further
saith, that he has been in the quiet and
juste possession of said land, since

Said first grant was made to him in
the year 1823. That he has always ex-
ercised full and uninterrupted ownership
over it, and is now aware of the existence
of any title, conflicting with or paramount
to his own.


He therefore prays that your
Honorable body in consideration of his
having obtained a grant in the year 1823
and in consideration of the decree of
Government Alvarado of the 30th of Septem-
ber 1837. The conditions of which he fully
complied with, and in full consequence
of his long and uninterrupted
possession, confirm and validate his
claim and title thereto.

Deposition of William A Richardson
Office of the Commissioners of
Lands Claims in California
San Francisco Aug. 30. 1853

This day before Commissioner Alpheus Felch
came William A Richardson a witness in
behalf of Clement and Sebastian Rodriguez
Case No. 187 who after being duly sworn
deposed as follows

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Questions by Mr. Clark Attorney for claimant

1 Question. What is your name
age and place of residence.

Answer. My name is William
A Richardson, my age forty eight years
and I reside at Sausalito in Marin
County in the State of California —
I have resided in California thirty one
years.

2 Question. Do you know the
Ranch called Bolsa de Pajaro, If so
state what you know about its location
and its occupation and improvement
by Sebastian Rodriguez

Answer. I know the Ranch,
was first there in 1839. It is situated
on the main road from Monterey to
Santa Cruz at the crossing of the river
Pajaro. When I first saw it, there was
on the premises a large adobe house
and large corral, and there was nearly
two hundred acres in cultivation, in
wheat Corn and other crops. There
were a good many horses and cattle
on the place. The houses were old
fashioned, and looked as though
they had been built a good many years

When I first saw it; the Rancho was then occupied by Sebastian Rodriguez who was living on it with his family.

I was there again in the latter part of the year 1844. Sebastian Rodriguez was still occupying the place and every thing appeared in a flourishing condition on the Rancho.

Mr. Greenhow Ques. Who are you? -
Answer. I am Sebastian. What is your name
age and place of residence?

Answer. My name is Gabriel
de la Tone. I am forty five years of age and

I was born.

3. Question. Do you know
Celestino Rodriguez the claimant in
this case, and if so how long have you
known him?

Answer. Yes I have known
him for thirty years.

3d Question. Do you know the
name of land claimed in this case, and
if so who is it claimed?

Ans. I know the said land
being claimed called Bolsa de Pajaro,
it is situated on the Pajaro River, and
adjoining the lands of Jose Amista,
Manuel Jimeno, and the castros, Juan
Antonio "Vallejo and Jesus "Vallejo

4. Question. Please give present or
the quantity of land possessed by
Celestino Rodriguez, and if so, state
when it was, the name of the Alcalde and
the names of the existing neighbors

Answer. I was present at the
giving of said possession, it took place
on the 3d day of November A.D. 1837.
It was given by Stephen Munnas, second
Alcalde of the Municipality of Monterey.
There was one of the neighbors, the
name of the other was Socorro Gonzales
The Alcalde Stephen Munnas made a
record of the proceedings of said posse-
ssion at the time it was given, and which
Gonzales and myself signed as neighbors

5. Question. How was the land
occupied at the time said possession
in this case given, and what improvements
were made at that time?

Ans. Rodriguez occupied the land by having three houses upon it in which he and his relations lived, he had cattle horses & hogs on the place and cultivated portions of the land, and had corral and fences. The foregoing improvements were all made previous to the time of giving the title paper.

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6. Question. How long had you known Saie Sando before Saie paper was given and how had the land been occupied?

Aus. I have known the land ever since the year 1833 at which time it was occupied in the same way I have described it to have been when paper was given.

7. Question. Has the claimant continued to reside there ever since?

Aus. He has continued to occupy it with his family ever since, now however left the place he first went upon it.

8. Question. Look upon the document now shown to you and marked B. T.C. and state whether it is a copy of the record of preceding paper, and other documents before the Alcalde at the time Saie paper was given?

Aus. I have examined the documents and recognized it as being a copy of the original made at the time the Saie paper was given.

Port of Monterey before Your Excellency with
due respect and as best he may according
to law makes known, that the Governor of
the Province who at time, was the late ^{Don} Lucas
Aguado, granted to him the place called
Bolsa del Pajaro, possession of which was
given to him by the released Lieutenant Don
Jose Estrada, in the year Eighteen hundred
and twenty three, and that in the year
Eighteen hundred and twenty four, when
Don Escham de ^o Colle in the Rancho
papers, those of Your petitioner were lost,
and being without any document to prove
that the above mentioned place belongs
to him, he applies to your Excellency's known
privy, in order that you would be pleased
to grant to him the above named place
so that he may secure the subsistence
of his numerous family. I therefore request
and entreat that Your Excellency would
be pleased to grant me the favor which
I implore, securing not to act through
Injustice, and that which is necessary

Whereas the party
interested in this petition has quietly and
peaceably held possession of the land
known by the name of Bolsa del Pajaro
for the space of fourteen years with just
title, with the knowledge of the former
Governors of California, which documents
he says were lost in the respective offices, and

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that in consequence thereof, he forces himself
deprived of the necessary security to remain
on his possessions, I do therefore by these
presents accede to his pretensions, to which
I hope said party interested shall comply
with the following Concessions

1^o. He shall present himself with this decree
and the plot of the land to the civil
magistrate, and ask for general possession
of the place mentioned.

2^o. Said magistrate shall with the
convenience of the owners of the respective
accompanying Remahos, cause the same to be
measured, according to Ordinance, express-
ing the number of varas which may
result in his favor.

3^o. This operation being concluded he will
return this Especial to the Government
in order that the party interested may
receive the corresponding title, and the docu-
ments be filed in the archives.

^wPetition,

To the U.S. Land Commission for the ascertaining and settling of Private Land Claims in California.

The Petition
of Sebastian Rodriguez, respectfully sheweth that he had obtained a grant of a tract of land in the year 1823, by Governor Louis Arguello, and has been in possession thereof ever since. That he lost all the documents relating to, and showing the operation of said grant in the year 1824; and that being so entirely destitute and unable to make the necessary proof of title, if required so to do, he made and presented a petition in writing to Governor Alvarado, on the 27th of September 1834, soliciting the assurance of a new grant for the land so occupied by him.

That said Alvarado by a decree, dated the 30th, September 1834, acceded to your petitioner's pretensions, under the condition that he should obtain judicial possession from the respective Magistrate, upon the proof of which, the corresponding title and documents should be delivered to him.

That your petitioner fully complied with the condition aforesaid, and obtained judicial possession of said land on the 6th of November 1834, and has ever since continued in the quiet and peaceable possession of said land.

That the records of the proceedings aforesaid were submitted by your petitioner to the Government of California, but that no further measures were taken in favor of your petitioner.

And your petitioner further saith that his petition of the year 1824, the Governor's decree, and the documents of giving judicial possession, are on file in the Archives of California, now in the possession of the Surveyor General of the U.S. of America, for the State of California,

and that duly certified copies and translations of the same are herewith submitted and prayed to be made a part of this petition.

That the land petitioned for lies in the present County of Monterey, near the Sea shore, between the "Arroyo del Pajaro" and "Santa Cruz", is known by the name of "Rancho de Pajaro" or "Bolsa del Pajaro", and contains about two square leagues of land, more or less.

That the boundaries as fixed by the Magistrate giving judicial possession are as follows:

Bounding at a Point where three poplars stand on the side of a small lagoon running South East to the banks of the River Pajaro, which point is the widest of said Rancho, and is about sixty four cords of fifty varas each distant therefrom, bordering towards the North West to the Rancho of José Amesti, towards the North East to the Rancho of Manuel Jimeno, towards South and South West to the River Pajaro, and towards the West to a swamp which obstructs the passage to the sea.

And your petitioner further saith, that he has been in the quiet and undisputed possession of said land, since said first grant was made to him in the year 1823. He has always exercised full and unlimited ownership over it, and is not aware of the existence of any title conflicting with or paramount to his own.

He therefore prays that your Honorable body in consideration of his having obtained a grant in the year 1823, and in consideration of the Decree of Governor Alvarado of the 30th, of September 1837, the conditions of which he fully complied with, and in further consideration of his long and uninterrupted possession, confirm and validate his claim and title thereto.

Questions by Her Black Attorney for Plaintiff,

1 Question. What is your name, age and place of residence,

Answer. My name is William A. Richardson, my age fifty eight years, and I reside at San Sito, in San Joaquin County in the State of California. I have resided in California thirty one years.

2 Question. Do you know the Ranch called Bolsa de Pajaro, if so state what you know about its situation, and its occupation and improvement by Sebastian Rodriguez.

Answer. I know the Ranch, was first there in 1839. It is situated on the main road from Monterey to Santa Cruz, at the crossing of the river Pajaro. When I first saw it there was on the premises a large adobe house and large corral, and there were nearly two hundred acres in cultivation, in wheat, corn and other crops. There were a good many horses and cattle on the place. The house was old fashioned, and looked as though it had been built a good many years when I first saw it; the Ranch was then occupied by Sebastian Rodriguez who was living on it with his family.

I was there again in the latter part of the year 1844. Sebastian Rodriguez was still occupying the place, and every thing appeared in a flourishing condition on the Ranch.

William A. Richardson,
No. Navarro appeared for the Law Agent on behalf of the United States, at the taking of this deposition, but pro= =pounded no questions to the witness.

Reposition of Gabriel de la Torre.

Dom^t Thompson Campbell came Gabriel de la Torre a witness in behalf of Sebastian Rodriguez, Petition No. 184, and was duly sworn his Evidence being in Spanish, was interpreted as follows;

Noz question as to an Agent was present.

1 Question. What is your name, age and place of residence.

Answer. My name is Gabriel de la Torre I am forty five years of age, and I reside in Monterey and in which place I was born.

2 Question. Do you know Sebastian Rodriguez, the Plaintiff in this case, and if so, how long have you known him.

Answer. Yes, I have known him for thirty years.

3. Question. Do you know the tract of land claimed in this case, and if so, where is it situated.

Ans. I know the said land herein claimed called Bolsa de Pajaro, it is situated on the Pajaro river and is adjoining the lands of Jose Amesté, Manuel Jimeno, and the Castros, from Antonio Vallejo, and Jesus Vallejo.

4. Question. Were you present at the giving of juridical possession to Sebastian Rodriguez, and if so state when it was, the name of the Alcalde, and the names of the assisting Witnesses.

Answer. I was present at the giving of said possession, it took place on the 3rd, day of November A.D. 1839, it was given by Stephen Munro, second Alcalde of the Municipality of Monterey. I was one of the assisting Witnesses, the name of the other was Theodore Gonzales. The Alcalde, Stephen Munro, made a record of the proceedings of said possession at the time it was given, and which Gonzales and myself signed as Witnesses.

5. Question. How was the land occupied at the time said juridical possession was given, and what improvements were made at that time.

Ans. Rodriguez occupied the land by having three houses upon it, in which he and his relations lived,

he had cattle, horses & hogs, on the place and cultivated portions of the land, and had corrals and fences.

The foregoing improvements were all made previous to the time of giving said possession.

Q. Guest, How long had you known said land before said possession was given, and how had the land been occupied?

A. I have known the land ever since the year 1833, at which time it was occupied in the same way I have described it to have been when possession was given.

Q. Guest, Has the claimant continued to reside there ever since.

A. He has continued to occupy it with his family ever since, never having left it since he first went upon it.

Q. Guest, Look upon the document now shown to you and marked B. G. C. and state whether it is a copy of the record of juridical possession, and other documents before the Alcalde at the time said possession was given.

A. I have examined the signatures and recognized it as being a copy of the original made at the time the said possession was given.

Questions by Associate Deau Agent.

Question. On what direction do the lands of Vallejo lie from this tract.

Answer. They lie on the other side of the Pajaro river, said river being the dividing line.

In answer to questions, Witness states that his name is José Abrego, his age is 40 years, residence Monterey, and has lived in California 19 years.

Question by Plaintiff's Atty.

I look upon the document now shown you marked B, and with the initials R. J. purporting to be a traced copy of an Expediente in the Archives of California, now in custody of the W. S. Surveyor General, and state if you have compared said traced copy with said Original - if so, state what you know of the genuineness of said original and the signatures thereto.

(United States Law Agent objects to all proofs of the genuineness of the document, unless the same is produced.)

I have compared said traced copy with the said original in the Surveyor General's Office, and find it to be a true copy. I have also carefully examined said Original, and know it to be a genuine document. The petition which appears on the second page of said document was written in my presence by Jacinto Rodriguez, the son of the petitioner, Sebastian Rodriguez, and was signed by him in behalf of his father who was sick at the time. The marginal decree on said page and the signature thereto, are both in the hand writing of Juan B. Alvarado, then Governor of California.

The petition on the 4th page of said document, to the Alcalde, and the signature thereto, are in the hand writing of Sebastian Rodriguez. The remaining portion of the document, except the signatures of J. del Torre, Sebastian Rodriguez, and Teodoro Gonzales, are in the hand writing

of Esteban Munras, at that time Alcalde of Monterey.
The said signatures wherever they occur on said document
as well as that of Esteban Munras, are their genuine sig-
natures. I know the hand writing of each and all of
them, having often seen them write.

Question by same.

State if the document now produced
and shown you by the Surveyor General of California, is the

Answer. It is the same document, and upon

Design ad honorem, of the Company of Cavalry of the Port of Monterey, before your Excellency with due respect and as best he may according to law, makes known, that the Governor of the Province, who at that time was the late Don Luis Argüello, granted to him the place called Bolsa del Pajaro, possession of which was given him by the retired Lieutenant Jose Estrada, in the year Eighteen hundred and twenty three, and that in the year Eighteen hundred and twenty seven, when Senor Echandia called in the Ranchos papers, those of your petitioners were lost, and being without any documents to prove that the above mentioned place belongs to him, he applies to your Excellency's known quiet, in order that you would be pleased to grant to him the above named place, so that he may secure the subsistence of his numerous family. The Petitioner in this case, states that in the year 1823, he obtained a grant to the place in question, from Governor Donis Arguello, and that said grant was lost,

and the proof shew that he went into possession of the same about the year 1823, and built a house upon it, and lived in it with his family, and put a large amount of the land in cultivation, and has lived on the place ever since.

That on the 27th day of September 1837, he presented his Petition to Governor Alvarado for a further grant, setting forth the facts of the loss of the former one, and in pursuance thereof the said Governor Alvarado did on the 30th day of the same month, issue a grant to the said Petitioner for the land, and directing judicial measurement of the same, and stating in said grant that it was a matter notorious with the Governor for many years past, that the applicant had been in possession of the place, and thereby dispensing with the usual conditions of occupancy and cultivation.

D. 1855, the Honorable Caleb Cushing, Attorney-General of the United States, received a duly certified duplicate of said transcript of the proceedings and decision of said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and

evidence on which said decision was founded. That thereafter, to wit: on the 20th day of November A. D. 1855, the said Attorney-General of the United States filed, or caused to be filed, in behalf of the United States, a notice with the Clerk of said District Court of the United States, that the appeal in said cause from the said decision of the said Commissioners, in the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, would be prosecuted by the United States. Your petitioner further represents; that the land claimed, as aforesaid, is situate in the Southern District of California, and within the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court. Your petitioner further represents and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimant, presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further denies that the said claimant has any valid right or title to said land claimed as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

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And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said petition to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision confirming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

said claim should have been rejected by them. And the said claimant, having no valid right or title derived from the Spanish or Mexican Governments, to the land claimed as aforesaid, the lawful right and title in and to the said land was acquired by, and it now belongs to the United States, by virtue of conquest, and the Treaty of peace, friendship, limits and settlement, between the United States and the Republic of Mexico, made at the City of Guadalupe Hidalgo, February 2d, A. D. 1848.

Wherefore, the said Pacificus Ord, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, for and in behalf of the United States, by reason of the premises, and in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California," approved March 3d, A. D. 1851, and the laws and statutes in such case made and provided, prays that the said claimant, or his attorney may be served with a copy of this petition; and that this Honorable Court will review the said decision of said Commissioners, and reverse the same; and decide on the validity of the ^{said claim} ~~same~~, and decree the alleged title to be invalid: with costs and general relief.
