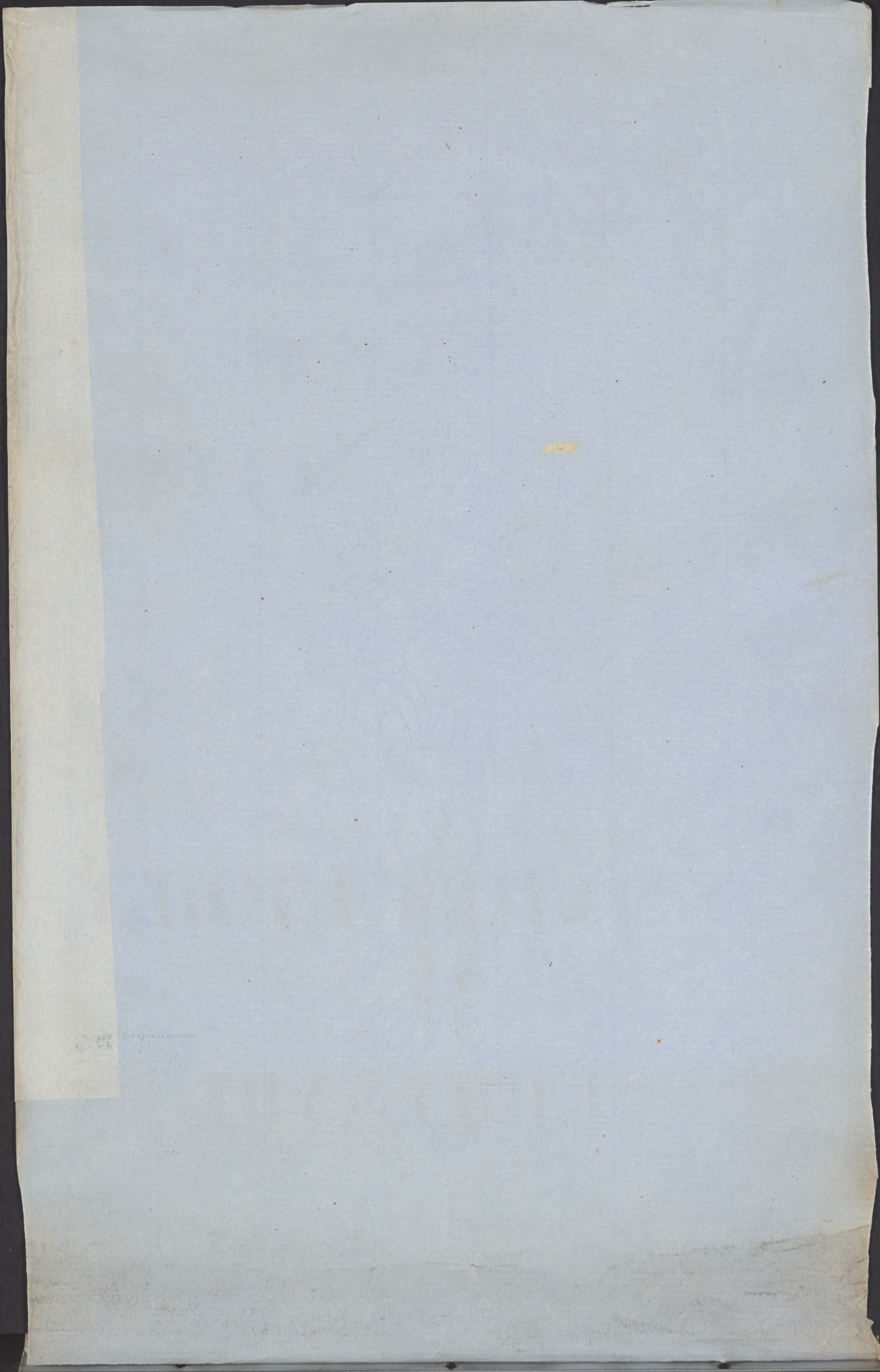

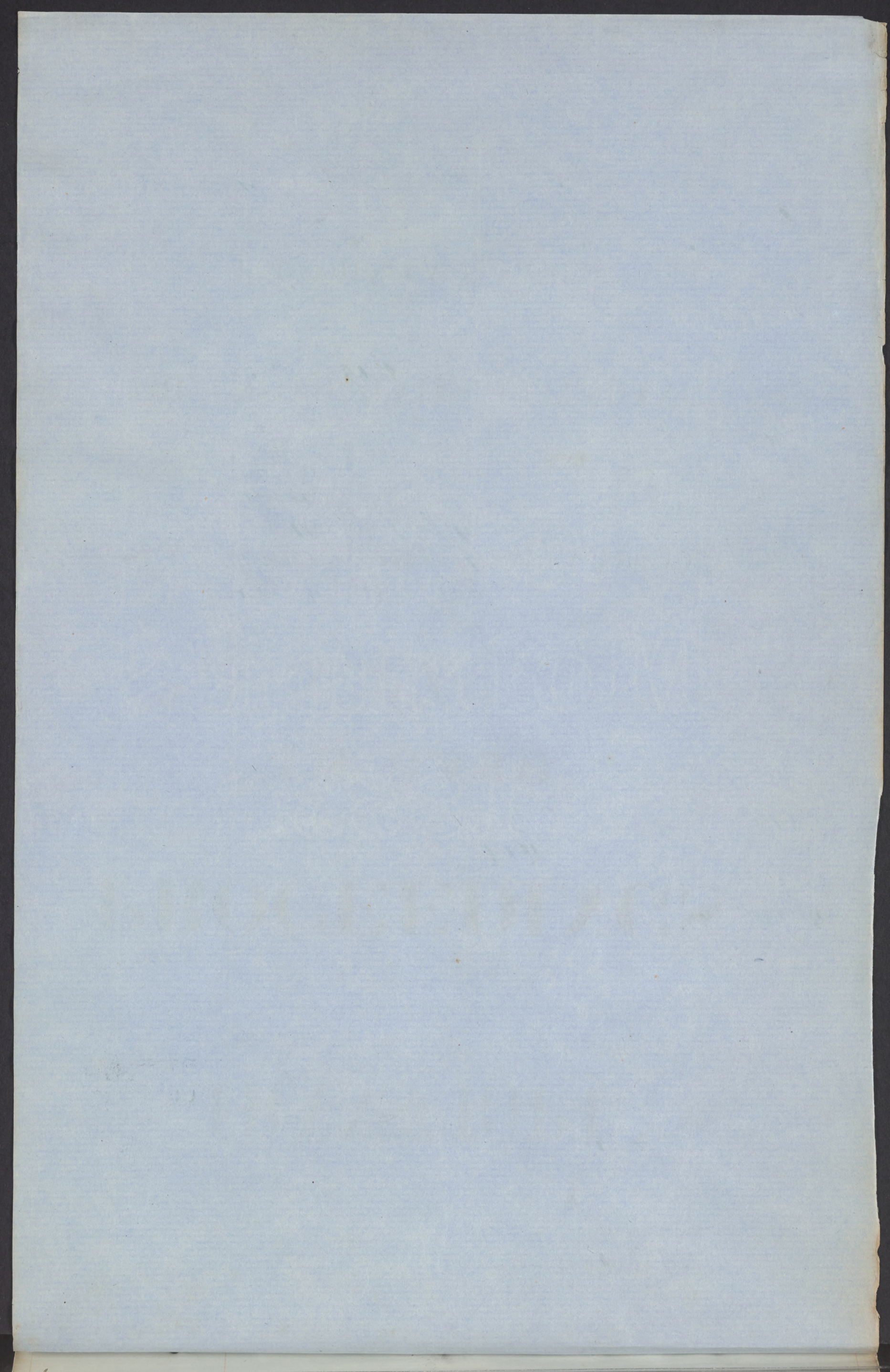

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Be it Remembered, that on this fiftenth day of January, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-three, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Francisco Estevan Quintana
for the Place named
"Viña,"
was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 513 and is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco December 5 1854.
Case no. 513, Francisco Estevan Quintana for the place named "La Viña", was ordered to be placed at the foot of the 3^d glass case on the Trial Scket.

San Francisco December 19 1854.
Case no. 513 was submitted under the Rule of March 21 1854 and taken under advisement.

San Francisco February 27 1855.
In the same case Commissioner S. B. Farnell delivered the opinion of the Board rejecting the claim;

Petition

Before the Board to ascertain and settle Private Land claims in the State of California

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The Petition of Joaquin E. Quintana Saito that on the 4th day of January 1842 Juan B. Alvarado then Constitutional Governor of the California granted to him a tract of land containing one square league

Situated near the Ex. Mission of San Luis Obispo in the said State and called La Vina. Said Grant was made by authority to of said in accordance with the Law of colonization of the 18th of August 1824 and the Mexican Executive Regulations of 1828

A copy of said Grant is hereto annexed and petitioners prays it may be cause apart thereof

The original will be presented together with the evidence

Petitioner prays confirmation to him of said tract of land

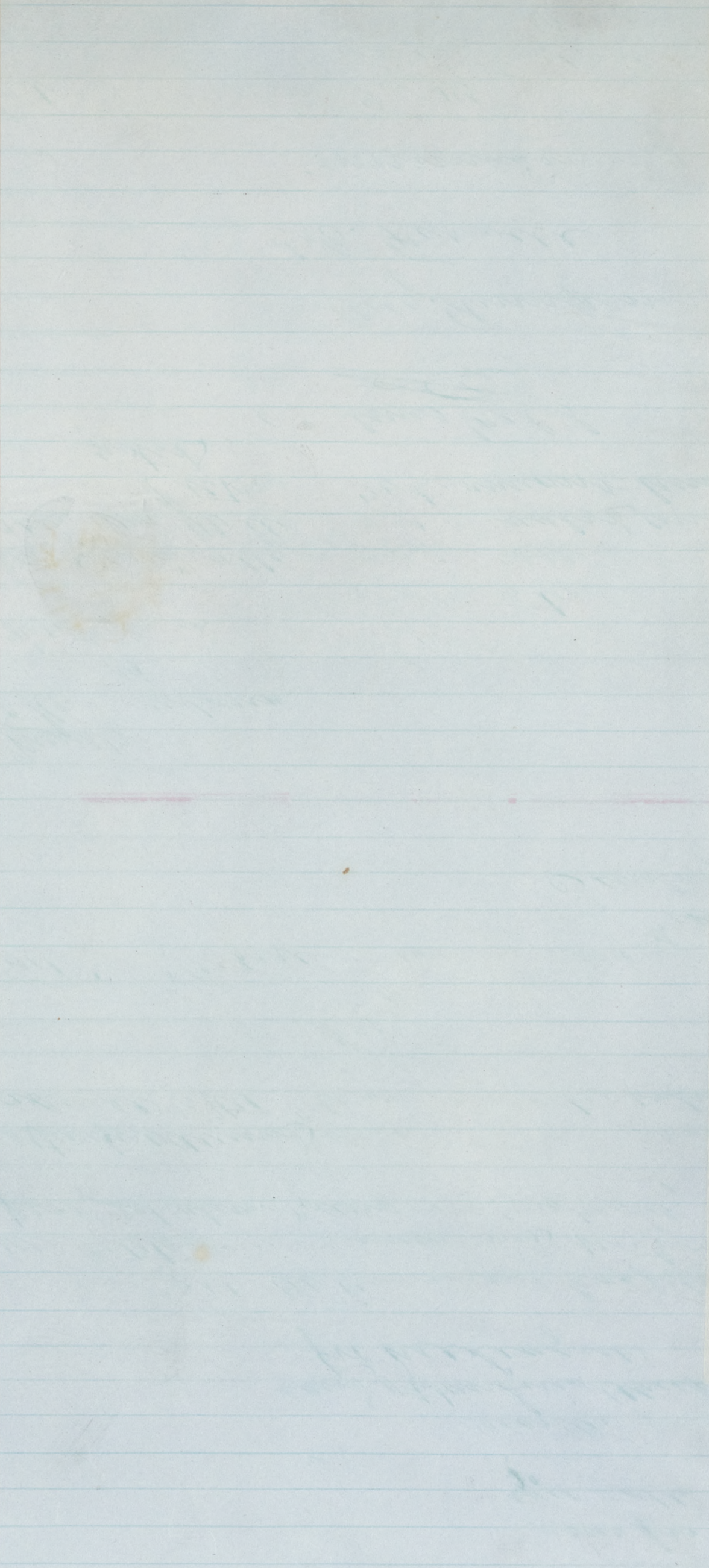

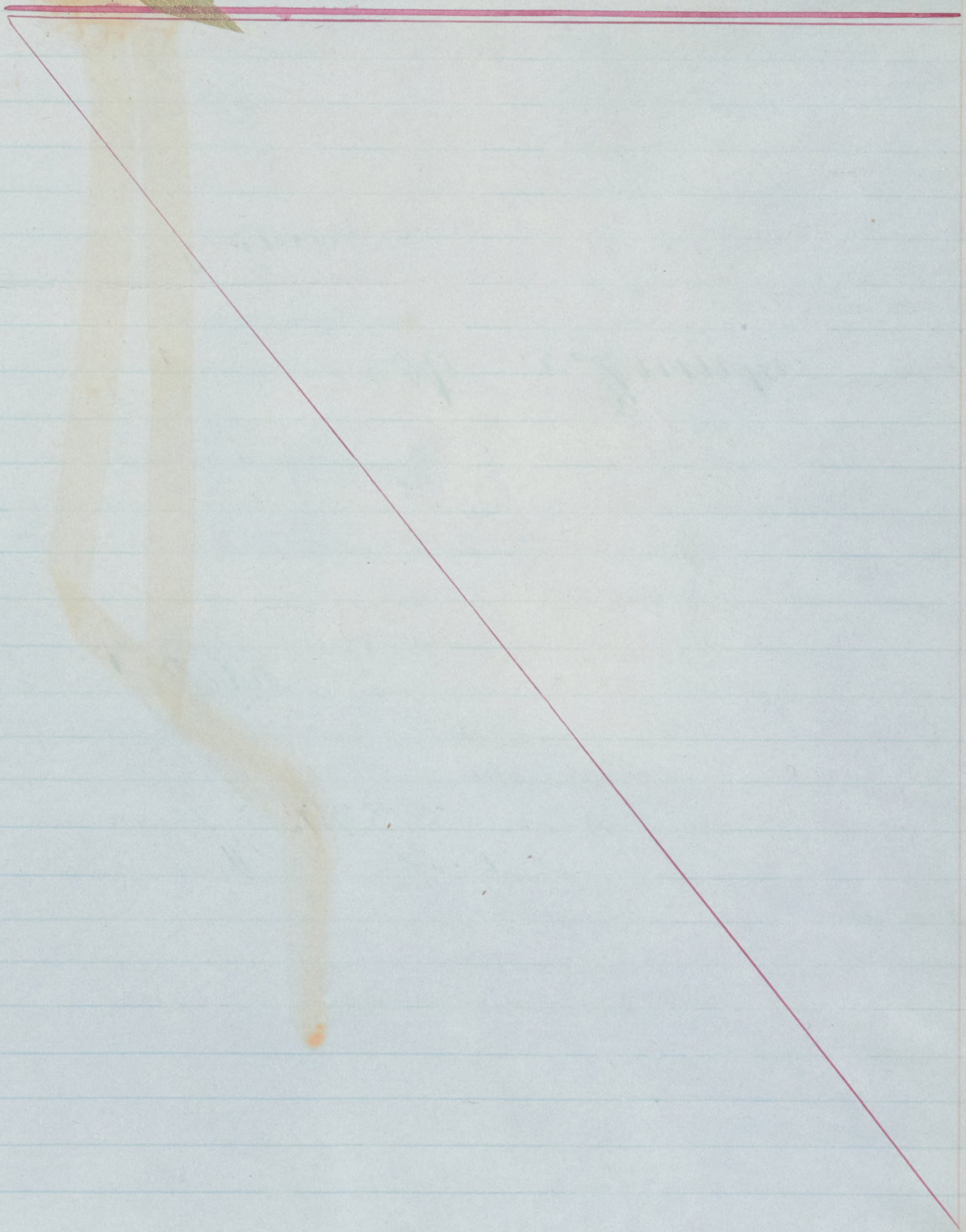
