



Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America,

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To the Hon'ble Commissioners for
ascertaining and settling private land
claims in California.

Petitioned

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Bernardo Cortes respe-
cts that on the 8th of April 1839 Juan B
Alvarado then Governor of California under au-
thority conferred upon him by the laws then
in force granted to Juan Bandino a tract
of land called the Rincon containing one league
more or less situated on the Santa Ana River
and within the limits of the present County of
Los Angeles. And on the 30th of May 1840 the
said grant was duly approved by the Depart-
ment of State.

On the 6th of October 1840 judicial
possession of the land was formally delivered to
the grantee and the boundaries of the land
marked out.

On the 11th of January next the
said Bandino conveyed a portion of the land
to the petitioner and on the 8th of April 1843 he
conveyed the remainder to David Alexander
who sold and conveyed all his interest on
the 25th of February 1844 to Isaac Williams
under whom the petitioner now holds by due
date Sept 25, 1844.

He knows of no other claim
to any part of this land.

He files herewith a document
marked "Exhibit A" containing the act of
judicial possession and the several conveyances
under which he claims with a translation
thereof marked "B".

In support of his claim he relies
upon the papers now filed the originals of
which will be produced and such further
evidence as he may offer.

And he prays that his title

de Rincon which claim is No 381 on the
docket of said Commissioners who being
 duly sworn testified as follows.

My name is Agustin Olvera. I
am thirty two years of age and reside in Los
Angeles.

Question Second.

Are you acquainted with the

Answer -

I am.
Question Third -

Question Third.

Examine the document on file in this case marked "Exhibit A" and say whether or not the signatures of those persons appearing therein are genuine.

Answer.

The signatures of Juan B. Sandoval on page 14th of said document which I have examined of Juan Bandini and David D. Alvarado, on page 5 of Antonio P. Coronel on page 16 of David D. Alvarado on pages 16 and 17, and of Julian Williams on page 18 are all genuine.

The signature of Juan B. Sandoval to the act of judicial possession on page 11, was made in my presence and I signed the instrument as an assisting witness.

The signature of Julian Williams also on page 18 was made in my presence or acknowledged before me and I signed this document too as an assisting witness.

Question Fourth.

What office did Juan B. Sandoval hold if any in the month of October 1841.

Answer.

During the whole year 1841 he was a Juz de Paz of Los Angeles.

Are you acquainted with the signature of Jose del O. Lugo? If so examine said document, Exhibit A and say whether or not his signature on the 11th page is genuine?

Answer.

What is your name and age
and where do you reside - If in California
how long have you resided there.

Answer.

My Name is Antonio Coronel
I am thirty three years of age, I reside in Los
Angeles California and have resided in California
about 18 or 19 years.

Question Second.

Examining the document on
file in this Case marked "Exhibit A" and
which is shown you and say whether or not
the signature on page 16, respecting to 16
years is genuine? If yes was the original
and of which that preceding your certificate
on page 16 is a copy executed by Juan
Pandino and signed by the witnesses in your
presence? Did you hold any office in Los
Angeles on the 15th of April 1843? If yes what
Office?

Answer.

I have Examined the document
referred to. It is my genuine signature
which appears on page 16. The original and
was executed and signed by the parties,
Juan Pandino and the witnesses in my
presence. At the time mentioned the 15th of
April 1843 I was Just Alcalde of Los
Angeles.

Question Third -

Do you know where the Rancho
called "El Pincón" is - If yes have you been
there often; what improvements are in it?

whom were they made? Is this place occupied when was it first occupied? When and by whom?
Answer.

I know the Rancho El Rincon It is situated in this County on the River San Bernardino - I have been often at the place. There is an adobe dwelling house and some land enclosed & under cultivation, the improvements were made by Juan Pandini about the year 1839 or 40.

From that time to the present the house has been occupied as a dwelling, the land has been cultivated & stock kept there. The occupation has been by Pandini & those claiming under & from him.

The Document marked A before referred to is annexed to the deposition of Agustin Alvaro.

Question Inst.

What is your name and age
where do you reside? If in California how
long have you resided here?

Answer.

My Name is Abel Stevens my age
is fifty four and I reside in Los Angeles
& have resided in California for over twenty
three years.

In answer to further questions by
the Counsel for the Claimant the witness
testified as follows.

I am acquainted with
the Rancho called "El Rincon" It is situated
on the Santa Ana river in the County of
Los Angeles. It was occupied by Juan
Bandini from the year 1839 to the time he
sold it in 1843. He had built a large
adobe house with 8 round out buildings &
cows. His cultivation quite an extensive
piece of ground raising wheat corn &
other things -

He had cattle & horses on it.
The cultivation was from the year 1840 until
the sale of the land - I think the house was
occupied soon after the land was conceded
to him & finished say in 1841 or 1842
Bandino I think had a temporary house there
by the Spring of 1840 & round rooms were
prepared for his family in the large house
and held in before the residue of the house
was completed. I think he went onto the

the place with his family in the latter part of 1841 or early in 1841 & he had servants occupying the place earlier than I have passed the place since. Banani sold it & have always been it occupied. The houses improvements here mentioned were on the tract called "El Rincon".

know of the existence of any grant. I asked
for it at the time of purchased through my
attorneys and Williams told me that he
had delivered all the papers that he had
received.

I have made search for it since
that time. I applied to Juan Pancioni for
the title who told me that he had delivered
the title to David W Alexander when he
sold him the Rancho. I applied to Alexander
for the title who told me that he did not rec-
ollect with the papers that he had delivered
to Williams but there was a paper with the
Government Seal affixed.

missioners to ascertain and settle the Private
Land Claims in the State of California
personally appeared Juan Bandini a witness
in behalf of Bernardo Yorba Claimant for
the land named "El Rincon" numbered on
the docket of the Land Board with No 384
who upon oath deposes and saith as
follows.

Questions asked by Counsel for Claimant.
Question 1st.

What is your name age and
place of residence?
Answer.

My Name is Juan Bandini. I
am fifty four years of age and I live in the
County of Los Angeles, San Diego.
Question 2d.

State fully and particularly
what you know of anything about the original
grant of the land claimed in this case by
Bernardo Yorba together with its date signatures
and cautions with a description of the land
granted therein -
Answer -

Yes I know because the place
deposited to me that there was an original
Title given by the Government of California
from Pantiste Alvarado then being Governor
as also the Extracted of the affidavits of
said title by the Comptroller Department - I.

Know of the Existence of the paper because I had
them in my possession. The grant to the best of
my knowledge was dated in the year 1839. I do
not recollect the month. The title was signed by
the Governor Don B. Alvarado. to the best of my
recollection it had the signature of the Secretary
Monseñor. I know that it contained the
cession made by the Government to my solic-
itude for a grant of one sitio of ganada Major
or one league of land in the place known by the
name of the Rincon.

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I do not recollect of any other
exception in the grant except that it was an
extension of a Rancho belonging to the called
Inapa. Mentioning its boundaries.

It is bounded on the North
side by the lands of the Rancho of Chino on the
East it is bounded by Jurupa. I wished to
change the name of the whole of the Rancho
called it San Juan del Rio. On the South it
is bounded by the River of Santa Ana, on the
West by the Rancho of San Martin the property
of Bernardo Gómez. There is a ditch on the
west side of the Rancho which belongs to the
Rancho of the Rincon, and the limits run
amongst the hills still farther west than the
ditch. I do not know anything more of
what has become of the grant than that I de-
livered it to David W. Alexander -

(Question and Answer Objected to as to
how on the ground of being leading and
secondary.)

Question No 3.

Did you or not receive judicial
possession of the lands so granted to you and if
so by whom, and at what time.

Answer.

I received judicial possession
of the land mentioned and granted to me
from Juan Bartolome Landry who was then
Alcalde of this plazuela. I do not recollect the
month but it was in the year 1810 a short
time subsequently to my having received the
original title together with the approbation of
the departmental assembly. To the best of my
recollection it was in the year 1810, my sojor-
tude was made a long time previous to the
rest of my recollection. I did not receive the
original title together with the approbation of
the Assembly Departmental until in the year
1841.

Question No 4.

Are you acquainted with the
signatures of Juan B Alvarado and Manuel
Domino. And if so were the signatures to the
title papers you speak of those genuine signa-
tures or not. And did you or not ever receive
more than one grant for said tract of land?

(Question objected to by C. E. Thom. Atty.
for plaintiff)

Answer.

Yes I am acquainted with the
signatures mentioned above. I have no doubt
but that the signatures were genuine.

I have received but one
grant from the Government and one from the
Assembly being the approval of said grant
from the Government. The Exhibit which I
now present and marked A. G. I. B. is one
of them and the signatures therunto affixed
of Juan B Alvarado and Manuel Domino
are other genuine signatures. I received
this document this day from David W
Alexander.

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Question No 5 -

Please you or not recently searched among your papers for the original title to said tract of land and if so, at whose request and state whether or not you found such title -

Answer -

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I had no doubt that I had delivered the papers to Mr Alexander when I sold him the lands but notwithstanding at the request of Bernard York, did I recently did recently examine my papers and found no such document.

Question No 6.

State fully and explicitly what you know if any thing about the building of a house upon the said tract of land and if the same was ever occupied. State by whom and in what manner and at what time -

Answer.

I know that there was a house built upon these lands which I commenced in the year 1810 to the best of my recollection it was in the month of April.

I previously having the lands occupied in cultivation which occupation was previous to my having received the original title in consequence of a special dispensation which I received from the Warrener I now present the dispensation marked Exhibit B. L. J. B and my signature and the signature of the Warrener Alvarado affixed to said exhibit are both genuine, and my cattle and horses were in the habit of pasturing in these lands previous to their belonging to me and continuing to do so afterwards they

pastured on those lands on consequence of their adjoining the land of Grapra which belonged to me as soon as I got special permission from the Governor I proceeded to cultivate the land and raised crops on them which consisted of wheat, barley, beans, pumpkins &c.

I lived in the house which I rented about three years. In the year 1811 I was owner of about two thousand head of cattle and about two hundred and fifty head of horses and mares which animals pastured on the lands of Grapra and the Pnicin -

Questions asked by C. C. Thom attorney
Law Agent -
Question No. 1.

Names of the persons who were present at the time you received judicial possession of the Ranch of the Pnicin.
Answer -

I remember that the Alcalde Juan Pantaleon Leandres was present but do not recollect of others except that who carried the rope at the time they measured the land whose names I do not recollect
Question No 2.

Did you ever reside with your family on the Ranch of the Pnicin for what length of time -
Answer -

Yes, I lived on the Ranch with my family for the space of three years - I went there about the year 1811 or 1812 and resided there until the year 1813.

The house that I built there was of adobe walls, the roof was of

Cane and covered with pitch.

Question No 3.

How many cattle had you on the Rancho of the Pincon at that time -

Answer.

I cannot state how many cattle I had on the Rancho as they were running together with other cattle at Jurupa, but I had cattle on the Rancho the whole time.

Examination in Chief resumed by
Counsel for Ottumah.

Question No 4.

Do you know if the house which you say you built now exists upon the Rancho and who is now in occupation of said Rancho.

Answer.

I know that the house still exists and is inhabited and the Rancho is occupied by Bernardo Yorba by purchase.

Cross Question resumed by C. E. Thom
Acting Law Agent.

Question No 5.

When did you visit the Rancho
of the Pincon last -

Answer.

I passed by there in January of last year and saw the house. I did not see that it was inhabited. I passed at such a distance that I could see the house but not the people.

Questions asked by C. O. Thom Comr
for Plaintiff -

Question No 1.

What is your name age and
place of residence?

Answer -

My Name is David W Alexander
I am fifty years old and reside in the
County of Los Angeles -

Iustim Pv 2.

Do you know the lands claimed
in this case by Bernardo Dorca and who
you leave the owner of the same and to whom
did you sell said lands.

Answer.

I know the lands well claimed in
this case and was formerly owner of the
same and resided on them for nearly one
year in 1843 & 1844 in the same house built
by Bandino and sold them to Isaac
Williams -

Iustim Pv 3.

State particularly all you
know in regard to the original title to said
lands.

Answer -

I received a number of documents
relating to that land from Juan Bandino
when he sold to me which I looked upon
and considered a good title from him to
me -

I recollect that one of the papers
was a manato due from him to me I also
recollect that one of said papers had the
government seal do not recollect if any
other of the papers had or not, they were all
in the Spanish language and were read to
me, but I do not recollect the contents of
any of them sufficiently well to testify.

When I sold to Williams I passed
to him as I thought all the papers which I
had received of Bandino but afterwards some
considerable time in investigating my old papers
I found those which Juan Bandino filed
yesterday and marked A. & B. C. & D. and
attached to the deposition of Juan Bandini

in this case and found the determination of handing them to Isaac Williams as belonging to him which however from myself I did not do. Notwithstanding I had done under the impression that I had done so and have assumed the application of Bernard Soroka on several occasions for said original title papers that I had delivered them all to Williams.

The reflection occurring to my mind only yesterday at the hand of Mr. Ober P. N. that a possibility existed that such papers still might remain in my possession

I immediately proceeded to examine an old trunk containing quantities of old papers belonging to me and to my surprise found the two documents above described which I immediately handed to Mr. Pandini on my meeting with him in presence of this Commission I cannot swear positively whether these are all of the papers I received from Pandini or not, but to the best of my knowledge and belief they are from the fact that amongst my old papers I have not been able to find anything else the papers which I received from Pandini remained in my possession up to the time I sold the Ranch of the River to Williams subsequently to which sale I delivered to Williams documents which I then considered were all I had pertaining to the title to said Ranch but found on yesterday that this impression was erroneous from the fact of finding those two papers which I have before stated still in my possession, and which two papers I positively affirm have not been out of my possession at any time since I received them from

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from Bondini up to yesterday.

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En la Ciudad de los Angeles del Departamento de California o los once días del mes de Octubre de mil ochocientos cuarenta y uno a la solicitud del ciudadano Juan Baumlin apuró que se le diera la correspondiente posesión en el aumento de una legua mas de terreno al que actualmente posee sufrido Josephus Lucy aumento quien salió la vega del río le fue concedido por el Superior Gobierno en sta. Oficio de libro de mil ochocientos treinta y nueve y aprobado por la Secretaría Departamental en título de sta. Secretaria de Mayo último del presente año. Pasó por mi el Juez con los testigos de oficio al expresidente terreno y practicase aclarar la posesión invadiendo prenda citación de colindantes y mostrándose el expresidente título o despiece que le ha sido conferido. 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This is a Claim for one square league of Land situated in the County of Los Angeles and purports to be founded on a Grant made by Governor Juan B Alvarado On the 8th of April 1839 to Juan Bencini from whom the present petitioner claims to derive his title by proper legal Conveyances. The Original grant is not produced but full proof of its due Execution is made, and that the claimant after diligent search and inquiry has been unable to find it, or to ascertain its present existence.

The proofs on this point are sufficient to establish the fact of the instrument and to lay the foundation for the introduction of secondary evidence of its contents.

These so far as they are material to a proper understanding of the terms of the grant are fully proved by the deposition of Juan Bencini the Original grantee and by the documentary Evidence filed in the Case.

The claimant has also filed the following Documentary Evidence in relation to the Original title, First a Trace Copy of the Especial from the Archives in the Custody of the United States Surveyor General Concerning the proceeding of the Departmental Authorities upon the Original application for the grant, A map or drawing of the premises granted, The Original decree of Concepcion, signed by the Governor dated April 28th 1839, the proceedings of the Departmental Assembly in Approval of the same dated May 9th 1840 and the Order of the Governor directing a certificate

Copy of Deed of Approvall to be delivered to the
grantee, dated June 11th 1840 -

Second. An original petition from Juan
Bunceini to the Govrnor praying for a tem-
porary regale of occupation of the premises
petitioned for, until the final action of
the Government on his application for a
legal title, and Marginal decree of the
Govrnor granting the same dated the
January 2d. 1839.

Third. The original
certificate of the approval of the grant
by the Departmental Assembly dated May
30th 1840.

Fourth. The original record of
the judicial possession of the premises
executed by Juan B. Sánchez 2d Justice
of the peace of the Jurisdiction of Los
Angeles dated Oct. 9th 1840.

The documents are
all properly authenticated and prove
and if not sufficient to invest the grantee
with the legal ~~title~~^{Estate}, would certainly
create a strong equity; taken in connection
with the oral testimony, they establish
the validity of the original title beyond
a reasonable doubt.

The Concessions of
Occupation and Cultivation appear to have
been fully complied with, and the Land
is described in the decree of Concession and
Title of Judicial possession with sufficient
certainty to segregate it from the public
domain.

The present claimant derives his
title to the premises first by a deed from
the original grantee to him conveying all
that portion of the same lying West of
a ditch running through the Rancho
from North to South, and between the
Soda ditch and the lances of the Soda

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Claimant.

3d. A Deed from the said grantee
to David Alexander Conveying to the
latter all his remaining interest in the
premises.

3d. A Deed from David Alexander
Conveying the same to Isaac Williams.

4th. A Contract Executed before Jose
de Carmel Seago 1st October and before
of the 1st Instance of the City of Los Angeles
and its jurisdiction by which Williams
transfers all his interest in the premises to the
present Claimant in Exchange for the sum of
One Baja Y. Mexican.

Those Conveyances
are properly proved and authenticated
and are sufficient to invest the Claimant
with the rights of the original grantee in
the premises.

The claimant's right to a Confi-
rmation is fully sustained by the testimony
and a decree to that effect will be
entered.



TO THE HON. ISAAC S. K. OGIER, JUDGE:

The Petition of Pacificus Ord, a resident of said City, County, and State, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, who petitions in this behalf for the United States, and being present here in Court, in the name and behalf of the United States, represents as follows: That heretofore, to wit: on or about the 9th day of October A. D. 1852, Bernardo Yorba

presented a petition to the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the private land claims in the State of California, when sitting as a Board, claiming a tract of land called El Rincon

in the County of Bernardino State of California, which said petition is referred to for a description of the land claimed, a copy of which appears in the transcript hereafter referred to. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 13th day of February A. D. 1853, the said Commissioners confirmed, by final decision, the said claim of said petitioner. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 4th day of October A. D. 1853, a duly certified transcript of the proceedings and decision of the said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and evidence on which the said decision was founded, was filed in the Office of the Clerk of the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, and marked No. 384; reference to which it is prayed may be had and made part of this petition. That on or about the 27th day of August A. D. 1853, the Honorable Caleb Cushing, Attorney-General of the United States, received a duly certified duplicate of said transcript of the proceedings and decision of said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and

evidence on which said decision was founded. That thereafter, to wit: ^{on the 20th}

~~on the 20th~~ day of November A. D. 1855, the said Attorney-General of the United States filed, or caused to be filed, in behalf of the United States, a notice with the Clerk of said District Court of the United States, that the appeal in said cause from the said decision of the said Commissioners, in the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, would be prosecuted by the United States. Your petitioner further represents, that the land claimed, as aforesaid, is situate in the Southern District of California, and within the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court. Your petitioner further represents and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimant, presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further denies that the said claimant has any valid right or title to said land claimed as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

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And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said petition to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision confirming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

said claim should have been rejected by them. And the said claimant, having no valid right or title derived from the Spanish or Mexican Governments, to the land claimed as aforesaid, the lawful right and title in and to the said land was acquired by, and it now belongs to the United States, by virtue of conquest, and the Treaty of peace, friendship, limits and settlement, between the United States and the Republic of Mexico, made at the City of Guadalupe Hidalgo, February 2d, A. D. 1848.

Wherefore, the said Pacificus Ord, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, for and in behalf of the United States, by reason of the premises, and in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California," approved March 3d, A. D. 1851, and the laws and statutes in such case made and provided, prays that the said claimant, or his attorney may be served with a copy of this petition; and that this Honorable Court will review the said decision of said Commissioners, and reverse the same; and decide on the validity of the ~~same~~ ^{laid claim}, and decree the alleged title to be invalid: with costs and general relief.
