

Be it Remembered, that on this Sixth day of November,  
Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-two, before  
the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in  
the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San  
Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America,  
the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Jose Justo Morello, and  
wife                         , for the place named  
"Las Bolsas,"                           
was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 459 and  
is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were

Los Angeles, November 13<sup>rd</sup> 1852.  
In case no. 459, Jose Justo Morello et al; for

Hall, with concurrent marker H. S. no. 1  
and a translation thereof marked —

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Petition

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454.

To the Honorable  
The United States  
Commissioners for Ascertaining and Settling  
private land claims in California -

Your petitioner, Justo  
Pinto Minillo and Maria Olivas Pinto his  
wife residents of the County of Los Angeles  
State of California respectfully represents,

That they claim that the  
said Maria Olivas Pinto as her at law  
of Justo Antônio Pinto late of the County  
aforesaid deceased is owner in fee simple of  
the Rancho of the "Bolsas" subject to the hereditary  
rights of Estanislao Ruiz de Pinto as therein  
hereafter stated said Rancho is situated in  
the County of Los Angeles containing about  
several hundred acres of land and bounded and de-  
scribed as follows to wit

Bounded on the South  
by the Sea coast, on the East by the river Santa  
Ana, on the North by the lands occupied and  
claimed by Juan Pacifico Antiveros and  
the Rancho of the "Coyotes", and on the West by  
the Rancho of the "Alquites".

Your petitioner states that  
the aforesaid Rancho of the "Bolsas" is part  
and parcel of a tract of land formerly  
owned and occupied by Manuel Pinto the  
grand father of the said Maria Oliva  
Pinto -

That the said Manuel Pinto during  
his life time was the owner and possessor  
of all the lands situate in Los Angeles County  
now known as the Ranchos of the "Coyotes"  
Santa Gertrudis "Santis" Alquites and  
the above described Rancho of the "Bolsas" -

That he held all the lands  
comprising the aforesaid Ranchos by grant or

Concession made to him about the Year 1784  
by the Governor Pedro Fages then Governor  
of the Californias and approved by the  
Viceroy of Spain for Mexico.

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That the said Manuel  
Pinto occupied the whole of the aforesaid  
lands from about the year 1784 up to the  
time of his death which took place about the  
Year 1804.

That at the time of his death  
he left Four Children to wife, Juan Jose' Pinto,  
Antonio Maria Pinto, Manuel Pinto  
and Jose Antonio Pinto, the Father of Your  
Petitioner Maria Cleofas Pinto who were his  
only heirs -

That all of the aforesaid heirs  
continued to occupy the lands constituting  
the Afore-mentioned Ranchos until the death  
of the said Jose Antonio Pinto which took  
place about the Year 1832.

That at the time of his  
death he left a Widow by the name of Catania  
Ruiz and two Children his only heirs, Maria  
Cleofas Pinto Your Petitioner and Pedro  
Pinto.

That after the death of the said  
Jose' Antonio Pinto and about the Year  
1834 a division was had between all the  
aforesaid heirs of Manuel Pinto of the tract  
of land constituting the Ranchos aforesaid  
and that by such division the above descri-  
bed ranch of the "Bolsos" was allotted to  
the heirs of the said Jose Antonio Pinto, con-  
sisting of his widow the said Catania Ruiz  
Your Petitioner Maria Cleofas Pinto and  
Pedro Pinto aforesaid, the last of whom  
died subsequent to said division without

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5—  
mariage and without and without issue.

Consequently there is no other  
child of the said José Antonio Ruiz living but  
your petitioner María Clorinda Ruiz —

That in the 22<sup>o</sup> day of May  
A.D. 1834 José Figueroa Governor of the  
Californias Exequated to the brother of your  
petitioner last aforesaid Catatumbo Ruiz a title  
conforming the right of the said Catatumbo as written  
of the said José Antonio Ruiz and of his heirs  
to the aforesaid Rancho of the "Bolsas" according  
to the division hinc tempo mentioned between the  
heirs of Manuel Ruiz.

That your petitioner  
and the said Catatumbo Ruiz have continued  
to occupy said ranch all the while since said  
division up to the present time.

That on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of  
July 6<sup>th</sup> 1841 Juan B. Alvarado Governor of the  
Californias granted to Joaquín Ruiz without  
the consent of the heirs of the said José Antonio  
Ruiz and as your petitioner also testifies an-  
thirty of law, that part of said Rancho of the  
"Bolsas" called the "Balsa Chica" containing two  
leagues taken from the eastern part of said  
Rancho of the "Bolsas". And that the said  
Joaquín Ruiz has filed his petition No 1115 in  
the Secretary's Office of San Benito Board  
claiming confirmation to him in fee simple of  
that portion of the Rancho of the "Bolsas" called  
"Balsa Chica", as in said petition is more fully  
ascertained and set forth.

Wherefore your petitioner  
would ask leave to introduce as against the  
claim of the said Ruiz —

Your petitioner would  
further state that on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of December  
A.D. 1849 the said Catatumbo Ruiz executed a

and of Country and to Ramon Gorbea his brothers  
and Sisters of all his right to the Rancho of  
the Palas and that by vesting of said land  
of Country and said Rancho Gorbea his brothers  
and Sisters to wife, Domingo Gorbea, Dolidad  
Gorbea de Abila wife of Juan Abila Dolida  
Gorbea de Aguilar wife of Christopher Aguilar  
and Julian Chavis have presented their peti-  
tion found in the Secretary & Office of Your  
Honorable Board praying for confirmation  
to them of all the right of the said Catarina  
Ruiz de Ruiz in and to the said ranch of the  
Palas which she undivided half thereof which  
she inherited from her child the said Ruiz, who  
died as aforesaid intestate -

Your petitioners would ask  
leave to interpose as against the said Claim of  
Ramon Gorbea Chavies as Your petitioners  
claim the entire right of the said Catarina  
Ruiz de Ruiz after her life time, which  
she inherited as aforesaid.

Your petitioners know  
of no other interfering claim. Said ranch has not  
been Surveyed by the United States Surveyor  
General for California. They will rely upon the  
following Documentary Evidence find herewith  
to support their claim and they pray that Your  
Superior wisdom and sense of Justice will con-  
sider Copy of original grant marked "A"  
2<sup>d</sup> Copy of grant to Domingo Ruiz marked "B".  
Translations of the same marked 182.

Your petitioners will further  
rely upon such other Documentary Evidence  
and oral testimony as may be thought necessary  
to support their claim and they pray that  
Your Superior wisdom and sense of Justice  
will confirm to them the foregoing claim.

My name is Abel Stans. My age  
is fifty four years. I reside in Los Angeles and  
have lived in California about twenty three years.

A paper is shown me purporting  
to be a protest of Maria Chicas Rito da -  
tut Decr 29 1852.

The signatures of Juan Sepul-  
veda, Francisco Ocampo & Jesus Gurado  
on said paper I believe to be genuine -

I am acquainted with their  
signatures. Said Sepulveda was acting Alcalde  
at the date of said paper.

On this day before your Hiland Hall  
Came Manuel Dominguez a witness in behalf  
of the claimants Jose Justo Mirelo et al  
Petition No 450 and was duly sworn his evidence  
being interpreted by the Secretary.

The W. S Associate Law Agent was present

In answer to Dominguez by Counsel for the  
Claimant the witness testified as follows.

My name is Manuel Dominguez  
My age is forty nine years & I reside in the County  
of Los Angeles.

I know the ranch called Las  
Balsas. It is situated in this County about  
ten leagues from this place in a South Easterly  
direction - I know Maria Chosa wife of  
Mirelo - She is the wife of Jose Justo Mirelo  
She was daughter of Gaspar Antonio Ruiz &  
Octavia Ruiz, Manuel Ruiz was the  
father of Gaspar Antonio Ruiz,

I know the land formerly  
occupied by Manuel Ruiz - I have known  
it since 1804.

I have always understood from  
old people that the boundaries of the tract of

the Ritos were the river San Gabriel  
and the river Santa Ana. the old main  
road leading from this place to Santa Ana  
& the sea. And that it embraced all the land  
within those boundaries.

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The Rancho Los Bolsas  
is a part of this tract. I have always understood  
that there was a division between the Ritos in  
the time of Governor Figueroa, in 1834 or 1835  
and that the Bolsas was allotted to the family  
of Jose' Antonio Nieto. Jose' Antonio Nieto left  
no known child to my knowledge who was Maria  
Cleofa Nieto before mentioned.

I was at the Bolsas in 1844  
when Jose' Nieto Mireles & his family  
resided there. They had a house there and a  
stock of cattle & horses.

I have always understood  
they had lived there from the time of the  
division of the land, but I was not there myself  
prior to 1844 - The family has lived there  
from that time to this.

Answer.

Yes. She is my daughter.  
Question No 4.

Who formerly occupied the  
Rancho de los Balsas before the title was given  
by the Governor.

Answer.

Juan Jose Pinto and his brother  
occupied it. The Pintos always occupied it.  
Question No 5.

To whom did the Governor  
give the title?

Answer.

M Governor Figueroa gave the title to me.  
Question No 6.

For whose use and benefit did you receive the title -

Answer -

I received it for my self and my daughter Maria Alfonso.

Question No 7.

What part did your daughter own in the Rancho!

Answer -

My daughter had one half of the Rancho, and has always occupied it.

Question No 8.

In what manner did your daughter occupy it.

Answer -

She had a house there and a quantity of cattle and cultivated some portion of it with corn beans and other vegetables.

Question No 9.

How many years did she continue to cultivate it.

Answer -

About Twenty Five years.

Question No 10.

Have you ever made a title to your daughter.

Answer -

Yes.

Question No 11.

Who was your husband -

Answer -

Paso Antonio Pato who has hundred about twenty five years.

Question No 12.

Is your daughter married

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Answer.

Is this married to Jose Justo  
Morillo.

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José Figueroa General of Brigade of the  
National Mexican Army. General Inspector  
and Superior Political Chief of the Territory  
of Upper California.

Johnus David Catrina Ruiz  
widow of Don José Antonio Ruiz has proven  
her right in the will of the late Manuel Ruiz  
and Considering the old and peaceful possession  
which she has had of the place known by the name  
of the "Bolsas" bounded by the places of the  
Alamitos and the Coyotes the river of Santa  
Lucia and the Sea Coast, the proceedings and  
natural illuminations having undergone through  
with as is dictated by the laws and regulations  
exercising the powers conferred on me by decree  
of the 24th of July of the Year just passed, I  
have in the name of the Mexican Nation con-  
cluded to declare the property of the said Ranch  
hers and that she shall be put in peaceful pos-  
session by these present letters in Justice Conformity  
with the dictates of the laws and subject  
to the following Constitutions.

1st. That she shall be subject to those condi-  
tions which the regulation shall establish  
that may be formed for the distribution  
of unoccupied lands and that meanwhile  
before the grants nor her heirs shall divide  
our ultimate the land of which Monterey is  
made, unless granted that certain mortgages  
hypothecation nor other encumbrance ever  
should it be for such uses nor pass it in

in Guatemala.

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2d. She may Enclose it without prejudice to the Crossings, Roads and Casements. She may farm it freely and Exclusively devoting it to the use or Culture that may best suit her but within one Year at most she shall build a house and it shall be occupied.

3d. She shall immediately solicit of the proper Judge that he may give her American possession by virtue of this Dispatch whereby the boundaries may be defined, within the limits of which she shall appear placed in addition to the land marks some fruit or fruit trees of Similitude.

4th. The land to which reference is had is of Seven leagues of grazing land a title mine or less as the description which is annexed to the "Expediente" explains - The Judge who shall give the possession shall have it measured annually to determine to assignate the boundaries the surplus which results being left to the Nation for Revenue purposes.

5th. If she shall violate these Conditions she shall lose her right to the land and it shall be dividable by another.

Wherefore I order that the present Serving him for a title and being held as fair and valid account thereof to take in the Corresponding book and it be allowed to the party interested for his protection and further ends.



In 1812 an inventory of his cattle that were gathered in a corral was taken amounting to five thousand. There were other wild ones of which I cannot make an estimate.

They had been killing large numbers at different times and I cannot tell how many were left.

They had disputed branding their cattle for eight years in consequence of a dispute between Rich & Juan Jose Dominguez about some cattle that they had placed on the Rancho.

The Ricos also had large numbers of horses so numerous that they were obliged to kill the wild ones.

The Rancho Los Balsas constituted a part of the Rancho of Manuel Rich. I understand when I was a boy that the title papers of the land were sent to Mexico Spain and were approved by the Vice Ray of Mexico. I never saw any papers.

The place called Capatis & Santa Gertrudis were a part of Rich's Rancho.

Las Bolas in Los Angeles County containing  
Seven Square Leagues of Land

The Land claimed in this case is a part  
of the "Nieto tract" (so called) in Los Angeles  
County, which has long been occupied  
by the Nieto family. Manuel Nieto first  
occupied the same at his death left  
four Sons, one of whom Jose Antonio is  
alleged to have died about the year  
1838 leaving a widow Beatrice Reisz  
and two daughters. In 1833 an applica-  
tion was made to Governor Figueroa,  
and he by decree of July 37 of that year  
conceded the premises to the two surviv-  
ing Sons and the widow of his two  
other Sons then deceased, giving to each  
a separate portion according to a division  
delineated on a map which was presen-  
ted with their application. In this concession  
the portion called Las Bolas was ap-  
pointed to Beatrice Beatrice Reisz, and the  
grants of the same were issued to her under  
date of May 22d 1834. Manuel Nieto  
who with his heirs became Jose Justo  
Morillo is the petitioner in this case is the  
daughter of Jose Antonio Nieto  
and Beatrice Reisz and the only surviv-  
ing issue of that marriage. She claims  
that the title to the said Land was in  
her father in his lifetime, and that she  
as his sole heir is the present owner of  
the premises, as his sole surviving heir,  
subject only to temporary restrictions  
existing in her mother. In the petition  
to the Commission it is alleged that her  
mother Beatrice Reisz in December 1849  
conveyed all her rights in the Rancho

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Law Bolasas to Rafael Yorlee and his  
brothers and Sisters, whose claim was  
presented for Confirmation by the Commiss-  
ion in this Case No. 402.

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In order to sustain  
the claim set up in this petition, it must  
be determined that the legal ownership  
of the Land in question lies in Jose Antonio  
Nieto at the day of his death and conse-  
quently descended to his heirs at Law  
and that the Declarant grant of the  
Same to Dolores Recio was without  
authority and void.

In Case No. 423 the  
whole subject of the rights of the parties  
depending in these proceedings and doc-  
uments involved in this case were consid-  
ered and was held that the proof  
was not sufficient to establish a title  
in the land in the Nieto family of such  
a character as to withhold it from the  
possession of the Government to make the grants  
which were issued on the 3rd day of  
May 1834. That those grants were the  
consequence of title in the several grantees  
having therein and that took the property  
under the same with the ordinary auth-  
ority of enjoyment and disposition  
thereof. - Contra the Case of Juana Ramon  
Yorlee (Case 402) was held that Dolores  
Recio under the grant made to her  
became the owner of the Bolasas and  
her deed to Juana Yorlee conveyed to the  
grantee therein absolute, all the interest  
which she retained in the premises at  
its date. And on this ground a decree  
of Confirmation to her grantee was entered.

The same principle is  
deposited of the Case now before us, Dolores  
Recio became the owner of the land  
under the grant by Yorlee to her, and

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by the Conveyance of all her interest therein  
to Gorlee the latter became the owner of  
the premises in 1849

A decree from Estancia  
Reyes to Saide Maria Lopez Nieto de  
Morales of an undivided half of Las  
Baldas executed on the fourteenth day of  
November last is given in evidence, be-  
ing the grantor had settled with her entire  
property in the premises long before that,  
Nothing done so far by this Conveyance

The parties having  
failed to show any title in themselves or  
either of them they cannot be entitled to  
a decree of Confirmation.

It is very proba-  
bly that <sup>there may be</sup> equitable rights between  
the claimants to the several portions of  
Land referred to in the class of cases of  
which this is one, which may be reached  
and decided in the judicial tribunals  
of the country, but which cannot properly  
be the foundation of a decree by this Commis-  
sion. The grants made by <sup>of</sup> the Indians have  
seemed to us to be the true source of the  
titles held to the "Nieto tract" by the sever-  
al members of that family and in a due  
portion of the cases are in accordance  
therewith, leaving all questions of titles  
or other equitable rights between the several  
members of the family and persons, claim-  
ing under them to be determined by the  
Courts having judicial cognizance  
thereof. On a due date decree will be entered  
in the case in Repetido

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
