



Your petitioners legal heirs
of Juan Bautista Alvarado of the County
of San Diego in the State of California
respectfully represent to your Honorable
Board that they claim a certain tract
of land called "Rincon del Diablo" con-
taining three *sitios de quauda* more or
less situated in the County of San Diego aforesaid,
that they claim the same as the
legal representatives of the said Juan
Bautista Alvarado deceased the said
tract of land having been granted in
fee to the said Alvarado deceased under
the authority of the Mexican Government
by Don Manuel Micheltorena Governor
of the Department of California by grant
bearing date the 1st day of May one
thousand Eight hundred and forty
three.

Your petitioners would
further represent that judicial possession
of said tract of land was given to the
said Alvarado deceased on the 12th day
of January 1844 and the boundaries
thereof designated and defined and that he
during his life time and those many
claiming under him have been in the
peaceable possession thereof ever since
and that they have no knowledge of any
interfering claim.

Your petitioners present
herewith the grant with the certificate
of judicial possession of said land in the
Spanish language with translations.

1842 or 1843 until the time of his death
about the year 1844.

His widow and
eldest son have occupied it since his
death. The widow died in 1851 wife the
son is also dead. There was a house on
the land from its first occupation & it has
been inhabited to the present time & the
widow of the deceased son is now living on
it. A small quantity of the land has
been cultivated.

Heirs of Juan B Alvarado deceased

deposed in Spanish which is interpreted
by the interpreter to said Board as follows.

Questions by Judge Sutherland attorney
for claimant.

Question. What is your name
age and residence.

Answer.

My name is Jesus Moreno
My age 45 years My residence San
Diego California.

Question.

Do you know the
boundaries of the Rancho called Rancho
del Diablo if so state what you know
about them.

Answer.

I know the boundaries of said
Rancho from what the owner thereof
has told me he has painted them out to
me I have seen them and understand

what thus varie from their being meas-
ured by the Indians.

It is bounded on the
South side by the Rancho of San Bernar-
do, the line there is the public road which
leads from San Pasqual to San Marcos over
a hill on the East side by the common
lands of the Pueblo of San Pasqual.

That line is marked
by the Sierra on the North West side
side it is bounded by the Rancho of
San Marcos. There is a small arroyo
which runs down from the Mountain and
divides this Rancho of Diablo from that
of San Marcos.

They three Ranchos, Diablo
San Marcos and San Bernardo all
come together at the arroyo Sico on the
plain. On the North side Diablo is bounded
by the Sierra which are called "Sierras
de Rincon del Diablo".

3rd Question.

How far is it from the
Northly line of the Rancho of San
Bernardo across the Rancho of Rincon
del Diablo to the Sierra on its North
side.

Answer.

I should say it is from 3 to
2 1/2 leagues more or less.

4th Question.

How far is it from East
to west across said Rancho of Diablo.
Answer.

It is about two leagues I have
never run it measured. I have travelled
over it and I think this is about the
distance.

State if you know when
Juan Bautista Alvarado, the claimant
in this case died if you state whether
he left a widow and children if so
name them and state which of them
are still living.

I recollect I think about
1815 or 1816 I am not positive as to
the time. He left a widow named
Raimundo Yorba de Alvarado who is
since deceased, I think she died about
1832. She left 5 children. Maria Antonia
Ximok, Ysabel Pionilla, Guadalupe
de Orozco, Juan Maria and Francisco
these are all living. There are living
three children of José María Alvarado
a son of said Juan Bautista who was
killed by the Indians before the death
of his father, those are the grand
children of said claimant and are
named José María, Federico and
Simón.

It is rather of a triangular
form as near as I can tell I cannot

which comes out of the mountain there
and divides this Rancho from San
Marcos.

State how you know
the names of the children in this case.

I lived very near them and
was very intimate with the family.

Inasmuch as the citizen Juan Bautista Alvarado has solicited for his personal benefit and that of his family the place known by the name of the Rancho del Diablo bounded on the South by the Rancho of San Bernardino on the East by the Pueblo of San Pascual on the North by the Ridges of dead Mountains Leronius Muertos, and on the North East by the Rancho of San Marcos having previously consulted with the requirements and obligations according to the laws and regulations concerning them In virtue of the powers conferred upon me in the name of the Mexican Nation I have concluded to grant him the above mentioned land, declaring it to be his property by these presents subject to the approval of the Executive Departmental Santa and under the following conditions:

1st. He may cultivate it without prejudice to cross roads and servitudes, he shall enjoy it freely and exclusively devoting it to the use or culture most agreeable to himself but within one year he shall build a house upon it and which shall be whitewashed.

2d. He shall solicit of the proper Judge to give him judicial possession by virtue of this dispatch by whom shall be

marked the boundaries by whose limits
he shall place for land marks some
fruit or forest trees of same height.

3^o. The land of which donation is made
is of three Sitios de ganado Major more
or less as explained by the Titular and
respective Map or design.

The Judge who shall
give the possession shall have it mea-
sured conformably to the ordinance
returning the remainder which results to
the Nation for its convenient uses.

4th. If he contravenes these conditions,
he shall lose his right to the land which
may be demanded.

Wherefore I order that
this Survey have as a Title and being
held for an valid record of it be
made in the corresponding Book and
delivered to the interested party for his
security and further ends.





del Diablo" granted to him by the Govern-
ment of this Department whose title is
quoted in his petition I went with the
witnesses of assistance to the said
place and proceeded to give the posses-
sion requiring having previously cited to
appear the neighbors in reference to said
title which was granted to him by his
Excellency the Governor Don Manuel
Machetina on the eighteenth day of
May Eighteen Hundred and Forty
three.

Upon the Rayo of the Rincón del
Diablo on the 12th of January 1844, I

appointment which they accepted taking
an oath faithfully to perform their duties
which was authority and signed with
the assisting witness according to law.

On the same day month and year named
upon the "Rincón del Diablo" for the
purpose of making the measurement
and delivery possession to Don Juan
Bautista Alvarado, of the place
called "Rincón del Diablo" all the re-
quisites of the law having been com-
plied with, and the assisting witness
and chain bearers being present
caused a cord to be measured which
contained one hundred varas and sticks
of wood to be attached to its extremities

After observation and calculation by my direction a line was run from the boundaries of the Pueblo of San Pascual in a direction from East to the North West. Eight thousand seven hundred and fifty varas threes from South to North eight thousand seven hundred and fifty varas where the land marks were established.

And no opposition having been made nor reason shown why thus should we suspend the measurement of the Rancho of the Rincón del Diablo well concluded to the satisfaction of the party whom I ordered to place land marks at the proper points there to remain as evidence of his possession which was authorized and signed with the assisting witness according to law as certified.


