

IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

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Be it Remembered, that on this second day of March, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Three, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Jose Maria Castañares,  
for the Place named  
"Arroyo de los Calzoncillos,"  
was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 785 and  
is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco January 9' 1855.  
Case no. 785 Jose Maria Castañares for the place  
named "Arroyo de los Calzoncillos," was ordered  
to be placed at the foot of the 4'th column  
the trial docket.

San Francisco March 20' 1855.  
In the same Case the Counsel for the Claimant  
filed the following Affidavit, to wit:  
(Vide page 5 of this Transcript.)  
And the prayer of the petitioner herein was  
then made agreement by the Board.

San Francisco March 20' 1855.  
Case no. 785 was assigned for hearing on the  
3<sup>d</sup> day of April next.

San Francisco April 10' 1855.  
Case No. 785 was submitted without argument  
and taken under advisement by the Board.

San Francisco April 24' 1855.

In the same Case Commissioner R. Aug. Thompson  
delivered the Opinion of the Board rejecting the  
Claim:

To the Honorable Board of Commissioners  
for settling private land claims in California.

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Petition

Your petitioner, José M<sup>o</sup>. Castañeda  
of the City of Mexico, respectfully shows to  
your Honorable Board, that a certain tract  
of land was granted to him in the State  
of California by D<sup>r</sup> Manuel Micheltorena  
the thirty eighth / 28<sup>th</sup> / day of Decem-  
ber one thousand eight hundred hundred &  
forty three / 1843 / as will more fully appear  
by reference to the grant itself, a copy and  
translation of which are herewith presented  
marked respectively, B and C.

That the said D<sup>r</sup> Manuel Mich-  
eltorena was, at the time of making such  
grant, acting Governor of said California  
under the Government of Mexico, with full  
and extraordinary powers to make the grant  
aforesaid.

That the quantity of land claimed  
by your petitioner herein is Eleven square  
leguas (once sitio de ganado mayor) —

That the description, bounds and  
locality of the said tract of land are as fol-  
lows: To wit; The land known by the name  
of Rancho del los Calsucillos, situated in  
the mountain and road of Santa Fez or  
elevation looking towards Santa Clara, bound-  
ed on the North by the Rancho of Tita, on  
the South by that of D<sup>r</sup>. José Hernandez  
and Blue mountains, on the East by the  
same places, and on the West by the San  
Agustin and Sivanta.

That the said tract of land has  
not been surveyed by the Surveyor General  
of the United States.

That your petitioner is not aware

of any conflicting claim to the said tract  
of land known as Almijo de los Calsomillos.

That the said grant of land was  
made to your petitioner as aforesaid, not solely  
as a matter of grace and favor, but in re-  
muneration of his services and of loans  
of money made by him to the Government  
of Mexico in said California.

Wherefore your petitioner presents  
his said claim to this Hon. Board, and prays  
that said Board will pronounce in favor of  
the same, and will confirm the validity thereof  
and of his right and title to said described  
land and premises.

Robert Simon being duly sworn  
deposes and says that he is claimants Atto-  
ney in a certain cause now pending before  
the said Board numbered 785 upon the  
docket thereof.

That the claimant in the said  
cause is now absent from the State of Cali-  
fornia, being as the deponent is informed and  
believes in the Republic of Mexico.

That as the deponent is informed  
and believes the said claimant has been, and  
now is detained in said Mexico by reason  
of the revolutionary disturbances now pre-  
vailing in that country; and that said clai-  
mant is a Military officer in active service  
in behalf of the Government there; and  
that when said claimant left California  
he intended to be only temporarily absent  
therefrom.

That the deponent cannot prepare  
the said cause for submission to this Board  
without the presence of the said claimant  
therin or without said claimants written  
directions in answer to letters long since  
sent to him in respect to the conduct of  
the said cause - which answer and also  
the said presence of said claimant the de-  
ponent believes to have been delayed and  
prevented by the said revolutionary disturbances.

That the deponent is desirous to  
postpone the submission of the said cases  
for at least three months in order to give  
further time for the return of said clai-  
mant or for the receipt of communications

Whence D<sup>r</sup> José M<sup>r</sup>. Castan-  
ares, Captain of the active Militia, has asked  
for his funeral benefit, in remuneration  
of his services, and loans of money that he  
has made for the succor of the Garrison,  
the land known by the name of Rancho de  
los Calzucillos, situated in the mountain  
and road of Santa Cruz, or elevation looking  
towards Santa Clara, bounded on the North  
by the Rancho of Tita, on the South by that  
of D<sup>r</sup> José Hernandez and Blue Mountain  
on the East by the same places, and on the  
West by the San Agustin and Sayanta,  
as described and set forth in the map thereif.  
The necessary steps and proofs concerning  
the same having been previously taken &  
made as the laws and regulations prescribe  
in the matter, I, making use of the pow-  
er with which I am invested, in the name  
of the Mexican Nation, have and do concede  
to him, the said Castanares, the said land  
declaring the fee thereof to be in him by  
these presents.

The land of which grant is made consists of Eleven square leagues, which same the grantee may occupy when best suits him, destining the same to the use or cultivation that may best suit him, without prejudice to the crossways, roads and commons.

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In consequence I order that the present title shall be held good and valid, and the same be registered in the office of the Government Secretary and be delivered to the grantee for his security and other purposes.
