San Francisco April 10' 1854.  
In Case no. 688, Temple & Alexander for one hundred varas square of land in the Port of San Pao, the deposition of Manuel Requena, a witness in behalf of the claimants, taken before Commissioner G. Thompson Burnell, with Exhibits marked A. B. C. G. T. B. annexed thereto, was filed.

Your petitioners Don  
Juan Temple and Lawrence Lee being under residence  
of Los Angeles California respectfully represent  
to your Honorable Board that they are the  
Vendees and present claimants of a certain piece  
of land of Land of (100) One hundred varas square  
in superficies situated in the Port of San Pedro  
Los Angeles County California.

That they claim  
the same by virtue of a Concession made to Jose  
Antonio Carrasco and Alceste Stearns, on the 11<sup>th</sup> day  
of March A.D. 1834 and Decree of the 10<sup>th</sup> of the  
same month by Governor Hm. Jose Figueroa and  
an unanticipated possession and occupancy and  
possession by them and those claiming under them  
ever since.

Your petitioners file herewith a  
true copy of a decree by the Surveyor General  
of the Expediente and will proceed to make  
further proof of title.

And your petitioners pray  
that your Honorable Board may take into  
consideration their claim to the said 100 varas  
square declare it to be valid and confirm to  
them their right and title to the same tract.

Acres situated in the Port of San Pedro in  
the County of Los Angeles Numbered on

688 And upon Oath deposed and saith  
as follows —

Questions by counsel for claimants

Question No. 1. What is your name age and  
place of residence?

Answer. Manuel Reguera, I am fifty two  
years of age and reside in the city  
of Los Angeles.

Question No. 2. How long have you resided in  
Los Angeles?

Answer. I have resided in Los Angeles about  
Twenty years.

Question No. 3. Have you ever held any office  
in Los Angeles?

Answer. I have been member of the Assembly  
Judge of the Just Justice Board

Question No. 4. Was the Port of San Pedro  
formerly within the jurisdiction of the  
City of Los Angeles?

Answer. It was

Question No. 5. What have you ever known of  
the propositions of Mr. Abel Stearns in  
the Port of San Diego?

Answer. When I arrived in San Pedro in the  
year eighteen hundred and thirty four  
there was an old adobe house there  
in a dilapidated state and adjoining  
thereto a small house facing the North  
which house was in process of building

and was nearly roofed in and also had a bound floor which I was informed belonged to Dr Abel Stearns, and that the old house formerly belonged to the Mission of San Gabriel. When I returned again in the latter part of the year 1836, or commencement of the year 1837 another house adjoining the old house had been built on the south side of the old house forming L as per Exhibit C.

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Question 6th. In the years 1834 and 1835 were there any other buildings in San Pedro.

Answer. There were no other houses there at that time.

Question No. 7. Do you know how much land Dr. Abel Stearns owned in San Pedro?

Answer. I do not.

Question No. 8. Since the year 1836 do you know of any other buildings having been erected in San Pedro?

Answer. I do. A house was built there by James Johnson on the same ground where a house had been commenced by Alcenita Moraga. I think this took place about the year 1838 or 1839; this house was about 80 or 100 varas from that of Dr Abel Stearns.

Question No. 9. How long did Dr Abel Stearns occupy the house in San Pedro?

Answer. Dr Abel Stearns occupied the house up to the time that he sold it after which it was occupied by different persons, but I do not recollect the exact time when the house was sold.

Question 10. Do you know if Dr Abel Stearns ever occupied some house in San Pedro?

Answer. I do, and I also know that the house is occupied at the present time by George Alexander and Francis Banning.

Question 11. Do you know anything of the boundaries of the land owned by Dr Abel Stearns

in San Pedro, or what distance the house is from the ocean or shore?

Answer. I do not know anything of the boundaries the house is situated above 100 feet from the sea shore or less.

Question No. 12. Have Mr. Alice Stearns any other improvements in San Pedro?

Answer. I know of ~~a~~ <sup>concrete</sup> forming the house and running back 30 or 40 feet.

Question No. 13. Are you acquainted with the signatures of Jose Figueroa Jose Antonio Leonello Vicente Moraga, Alice Stearns and Vicente de la Osa?

The above question objected to by C. E. Thom acting Law Agent, except to the signature of Jose Figueroa

Answer. I know all the signatures except that of Vicente de la Osa which I do not well recollect.

Question No. 14. You are here shown documents herewith filed marked S & B Exhibit C & D in this case and ask me of the signatures of Jose Figueroa appearing on documents marked S & B Exhibit C in this case together with the signatures of the aforementioned Leonello, Stearns and Moraga appearing upon said documents. I ask you also whether their respective signatures appearing on these documents are then genuine signatures? All this question objected to by C. E. Thom acting Law Agent except that part relating to Jose Figueroa.

Answer. I know them all to be genuine.

Questions asked by C. E. Thom acting Law Agent

Question No. 1. How far have resided from the Port of San Pedro since you arrived in the country in the year 1834.

Answer. I have resided in the city of Los Angeles which is about 25 miles west of San Pedro.

Question No. 2. How many times did you visit the Port of San Pedro in the year 1834?

Answer. About twenty times.

Question No. 3. Did you see Dr. Alice Steams frequently in San Pedro and if so what was his occupation?

Answer. I did. He was occupied in delivering babies and receiving pay for them.

Question No. 4. Did Dr. Alice Steams reside the house in San Pedro or any part of it, if so state the time when and your means of knowledge?

Answer. He did. I saw Dr. Alice Steams there in person during the works, also other persons employed by him. I do not recollect exactly the time when I saw Dr. Alice Steams in San Pedro during the building, but it was about the years 1836 or 1837.

Question No. 5. How do you know that the house built in San Pedro previous to the year 1836 was built by and belonged to Dr. Alice Steams?

Answer. Every person I asked told me so does Dr. Alice Steams tell me so.

Question No. 6. State the dimensions of the old house, the house built previous to 1836 facing the North and also the house built since 1836.

Answer. I do not know the dimensions of any of the houses.

Question 7. Did Dr. Alice Steams ever occupy the house in person situated in San Pedro.

Answer. I do not know.

Question 8. Did any person ever occupy the house of Dr. Alice Steams in San Pedro before he sold it.

Answer. Yes, Vicente Maraga and family & John Foster occupied the house, but I do not know by whose authority.

Question No. 9. Did you see the persons whose signatures are annexed to the documents referred to on the examination in chief sign their names thereto?

Answer. I did not, but I have seen them sign other documents -

Question No. 10. How often and when have you seen them sign any paper or document?

Answer. I have seen Don Jose Tequino sign twice in my own house in the year 1835. Alvaro Steams sign in the city quite a great many times in the year 1836 and Vicente Monaga two or three times in the city in the year 1836 and Jose Antonio Lameiro in his own house and also in the city or another house in the year 1844.

Question No. 11. Is Don Jose Tequino dead if so when and where did he die?

Answer. He is dead. He died in Monterey in the year 1835.

Examination in chief resume by licensee for the documents -

Question No. 1. You are here shown a sketch marked G. T. B. Whaled. E and please in this case and advise if the house thereon represented, has the relative position to the Bay of San Pedro in the manner it appears to have by the same, of the designation made in Red ink are correct?

Answer. The house has the relative position to the bay shown by the map and the designations made in Red ink are correct.

Question No. 2. When did Monaga first occupy the house in San Pedro and also when did Foster

Answer. I am not positive when Monaga first occupied the house but I think it was in the year 1837 and that Foster often comes occupied the house in the year 1838 or 1839 of which I am not certain.

Question 3<sup>o</sup>. Who was occupying the house in person in San Pedro from the year 1834 until up to the time that Monaga occupied it.

Answer. I believe that a man by the name of Negrete Pio occupied the house

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in person, as I see him there often, and upon enquiry of him who was the owner of the house he told me that Mr. Allee Stearns was the owner.

Question No. 4. Who had charge of the affairs in San Pedro and attending to the building of the houses in 1834 and up to the time that Morego took possession?

Answer. Mr. Maguire Prior

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Questions resumed by L. E. Thom acting Law Agent.

Question No. 1. Do you know the names of the Compa?

Answer. I do not.

Question No. 2. Do you know the relative position of the Bay and houses as set down on Exhibit Market G. T. B. &

Answer. I know it from what I have seen of San Pedro and what I see on the paper?

Question No. 3. Was any of the houses erected in 1834, built by Mr. Allee Stearns or under his direction?

Answer. It is my conviction that he did, as very likely did so, but I did not see Mr. Allee Stearns there at that time directing the work.

Testimony by Counsel for claimants

Question No. 1. What is your name  
age and place of residence?

Answer. My name is Alec  
Stearns I am fifty six years of age and I reside  
in the City of Los Angeles, and I have resided  
in California since the year 1829.

Question No 2. State if you together  
with Soriano were the grantees of the 100  
Varas Square in the Port of San Pedro now  
occupied by Alexander and Baumng, if so state  
what you know in reference to the occupation  
and boundaries of the same

Answer. We were the grantees  
and Soriano Conveyed his part to me. I erected  
a house on the lot for commercial purposes  
in the year 1834. The lot granted contained 100  
Varas, which was measured off and stakes  
placed at the corners by myself and the  
deceased Migue Pria, the lot was measured  
by a survey and laid out in a square form.  
The lot was measured in 1834. I do not  
recall any other persons being present during  
the measurement except my son Swantz -  
The house was located nearer the Mission line  
than the eastern, leaving a wide space well  
around the house and is located about

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3 or 400 feet from the Beach or landing at that time. The house was occupied by myself and persons employed by me until I sold it to Francisco de Alexander and John Temple as a slave house and trading house with connection with my house in this place. Since I sold it I believe it has been occupied always by Francisco de Alexander and John Temple and other persons holding tenancy them.

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Question No 3. You are now shown Exhibit B purporting to be the deed of Conveyance from yourself to Alexander and Temple of the before above 100 varas square in the Rue of San Pedro, and asking you to sign the same thereon appearing, together with your signature appearing to receipts annexed to obsequies which accompanied that Conveyance, and asking if they are your genuine Signatures and if they were placed upon the said documents at the dates they purport thereon to have been.

Answer. My signatures on the receipts are genuine, and were placed there at the time they purport to be. Exhibit B is a true copy of the original transfer made by me to Alexander and Temple and I believe to be a true copy and certified by the deceased Alcalde Vicente Sayokey and in the presence of his Apostatus Donato Leonel and Felipe Lezcano whose signatures appearing therein I know to be their genuine signatures and to the best of my belief the original of Exhibit B was lost in the Archives in the year 1846 during the war.

Question. No 1 what sort of a house was built by you on the 100 varas lot in the year 1834. State particularly as to dimensions.

Answer. The house was built with adobe and covered with pine & boards. The house built at that time contained four rooms, there was an addition built the year 1837 of three rooms.

Precinct No. 3. Was the above mentioned 100 Varas Lot laid out by compass if not, how did you estimate the quantity?

Answer. I do not recollect if a compass was used in laying out the lot. The quantity was estimated by measurement




