



Petition

To the Hon Board of Commissioners for ascertaining  
and settling Private Land Claims in the State of  
California!

The Petition of the heirs an Legal Representa-  
tives of Antonio Yorba deceased and Juan Pablo Peralta  
deceased respectfully shows that they claim in fee simple  
a certain tract of land situated in the County of Los Angeles  
Known by the name of "Santiago" and containing it is  
supposed about Ten Spanish Leagues more or less.

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They further  
represent to your Hon Board that they claim said land  
in virtue of a concession thereof to the said Antonio  
Yorba and the said Juan Pablo Peralta made by Anelaga  
Governor of the Province of California in pursuance of  
an authority in him vested and bearing date Sept. 1810.

They further show to your Hon Body that  
previous to and at the time of said grant the boundaries  
of said land were well known and accurately defined  
and that judicial possession thereof was given to the  
original grantees and that from the date of the said  
grant to the present time the said land has been poss-  
essed according to its metes and bounds by the said  
grantees and their legal representatives peacefully without  
interruption.

They claim as the boundaries of said tract  
the following line. Commencing at the mouth of the  
Ruis Santa Ana when it empties into the sea thence  
turning up along the lands old bed (Cago Vigas) of the  
East Bank of said River to a point when the Ruis  
approaches closely to said River and when now is the  
line of the Rancho called Tuna owned by Bernardo Yuba  
thence to the said Tuna. thence southward along a range  
of hills to a place called Santiago passing Eastward  
of the old nose. thence to the Buena de las Ranas. thence  
in a straight line to the coast. thence along said coast to  
the mouth of said Ruis Santa Ana, the point of  
commencement. all of which tract according to  
the metes and bounds as aforesaid the original  
grantees and your petitioners have had possession for  
more than forty years.

They further represent that they  
have no conflicting claim.

They hereunto submit Governor Anelaga's Grant Marked  
A and its translation marked B. and they rely on  
the same and on such further Documentary Evidence

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testimony as they may be advised may be necessary. Wherefore  
they pray that the Hon Board may take their claim into con-  
sideration and confirm it to your petitioners, or if they  
are advised that it may be necessary that they may be  
permitted to file a supplemental petition setting forth  
substantially the various intents of all the owners of said  
tract of land who your petitioners are amount to sum  
thirty or more, and that their said claim may be con-  
firmed to them.

On this day before Hilard Hall Court came Jose Desiderio Ybarra a witness in behalf of the claimant. He is of Antonio Garza et al Petition No 47 and was duly sworn his evidence being interpreted by the Secretary.

The U. S. Law Agent (Associate) was present.

In answer to enquiring of counsel for the claimant the witness testified as follows.

My name is Desiderio Ybarra. my age is sixty nine years and I reside in Los Angeles.

I know Antonio Garza and Juan Peralta. They lived on the Rancho Santa Ana about twelve leagues from this place. in an easterly direction. My father was in the employ of said Garza and Peralta and established the Rancho for them in 1812 and they and their descendants have occupied it ever since. They had a house there in which they lived. They had a vine yard and orchard and cultivated the land and had cattle and other stock there.

Juan Peralta died about eighteen years ago. Antonio Garza died many years ago. and before Peralta's death. They continued in the possession of the Rancho so long as they lived. They occupied separate houses on the Rancho. I know the boundaries of the Rancho. They were Cemetery de los Ranos passing through the middle of the "Binega la Bolsa de Longara" to the Sea Coast. From the Sea Coast to the Santa Ana River and then the "Levito de Santiago" where it descends to the River.

There was a new channel formed of the River Santa Ana by a flood in 1811. Previous to that the River flowed in its bed. Previous to the flood of 1811 Garza & Peralta had a cabin or small hut there which was destroyed by the flood.

In answer to Questions of Counsel for the Claimants  
the witness testified as follows.

My name is Francisco  
Sepulveda, my age is Seventy Six Years and I reside  
in Los Angeles.

I knew Sargent Antonio Yorba and  
Juan Peralta. I knew the tract of land called  
Santiago. Laid Yorba and Peralta founded the  
Ranch in 1810 as I think. They built a house  
there with several rooms. They cultivated the land  
and had a Vineyard and lived on the land and  
continued there many years until their decease.  
They died on the Ranch.

After their death their  
families occupied it. Peralta was the Grandson  
of Gijalva and he and the wife of Gijalva lived  
on the land previously to the founding of the Ranch  
of Yorba and Peralta.

The Ranch now called  
Santa Ana is the same as that formerly called San  
tiago. Antonio Yorba had a large family. The  
names of the children were Jose Antonio, Thomas,  
Bunardo, Teodoro, Isahil, Raymundo, de Francisco  
and another Daughter who married Abila, and  
also Rosentacion. Peralta had four Sons and  
two Daughters whose names I do not recollect.  
Yorba and Peralta had a large number of Cattle  
Horses and Sheep

Claimant the witness testified as follows.

My name  
is Antonio Y. Coronel. my age thirty three years. and I  
live in Los Angelis.

I know the Rancho Santa Ana  
I have known it from 1838. It is bounded on the  
West by the River Santa Ana. On the East by the Rancho  
the Rancho San Joaquin and the Sierra de Santiago.  
North of the lands of Burruco Yoba and South of the  
Sea board. on the North East it adjoins the land  
of Teodoro Yoba. The Rancho has also been known  
by the name of San Gregorio. Since I have known this land  
it has been occupied by the Yobas and Peraltas. There  
are now seven dwelling houses on the land. distributed  
over the Rancho.

They have large fields cultivated in  
raising Corn and grain. have four Vineyards and have  
fruit trees. The houses are all good and occupied.

I know the names of some of the  
children of Antonio Yoba deceased. The names of  
those I remember are Bernardo. Tomás. José Antonio.  
Teodoro. Raymunda. Isashel. & Francisco. They are  
all married and have families. Some of the children  
of Antonio Yoba have Grand Children. José Antonio  
Yoba has eight children. Six of these eight have chil-  
dren. that are marriageable.

Juan Peralta left child  
ren named Pablo. Rafael. Felipe. Paula. Gasifa  
Candela. & some others who have deceased all those  
children are married but one and all that are  
married have children. Some of those children are  
married and have children.

9 The largest portion  
of those descendants of Antonio Yoba and Juan  
Peralta are now living on the land called  
Santiago. I think the number of those descendants

of Antonio Yoba and Juan Reculta are now living on the Land called Santiago. I think the number of the descendants who are living on the Rancho may be about fifty.

I know the old Road crossing the Rancho and leading to San Diego. The distance from that Road to the sea coast I should think was about Five Leagues and from the same Road to the Northern boundary of the Rancho about four Leagues. The width of the Rancho when the Road crosses it may be about a League and a half.

The Yobas have a large stock more than Eighteen thousand head of cattle and over Five hundred horses. I am Assessor of the County of Los Angeles.

the Private Land Claims in California personally  
appeared Anto G. Coronel a witness in behalf of

Yorba and Juan Pablo Peralta Claimants deposed  
for the land named Santiago numbered on the  
Docket of the said Board with No 470 who upon  
oath declareth and saith as follows.

Questions asked of Counsel for Claimants

1<sup>st</sup> Question. What is your name, age  
and place of residence?

Aus. My name is Antonio G. Coronel I  
am thirty four years of age reside at Los Angeles

2<sup>d</sup> Question Are you acquainted with  
the tract of Land called Santiago or Santa Ana  
in this County?

Aus. I am

3 Question State particularly if you  
are acquainted with it, the boundary of said tract,  
commencing where the Cima of Santa Ana  
touches its Banks from thence running a line toward  
the Loma de "Las Ranas" passing to the Eastward  
of the old house on the Rancho crossing the Arroyo  
of Santiago to the Las Ranas from the Cima of Santiago  
to the Arroyo, the line passes through the hills.

Aus. I have known it more than ten years  
the boundary commences on the Banks of the  
River Santa Ana where the Cima of Santa Ana  
touches its Banks from thence running a line toward  
the Loma de "Las Ranas" passing to the Eastward  
of the old house on the Rancho crossing the Arroyo  
of Santiago to the Las Ranas from the Cima of Santiago  
to the Arroyo, the line passes through the hills.

4<sup>th</sup> Question Do you know where the old  
house was situated if so state how far the old house  
is from the high road that goes to Santiago from "Las Ranas"  
and from the Cima above spoken of?

Aus. I know where the old house is situated  
from the main road more or less it is about a League  
and a half from the Ranas a little more than a League  
and a half and from the Cima three Leagues more or  
less. I have never seen those distances measured

but I have travelled there frequently.

5<sup>th</sup> Question. What office do you now hold in this County, and how long have you held the same.

Aus. I am Assessor of the County, and have held the office from the commencement of the State organization up to the present time.

6<sup>th</sup> Question. How many Leagues do you consider embraced in the lands claimed to belong to this Rancho?

Aus. About eleven or twelve leagues more or less, one third part of which is hills.

Questions Asked by L. E. Thom Acting Law Agent.

1<sup>st</sup> Question. Which is the form of the Rancho?

Aus. It is much greater in length than in breadth.

2<sup>d</sup> Question. What is the Northern boundary.

Aus. The Riva de Santiago.

3<sup>d</sup> Question Are there any Land marks along the line?

Aus. Yes, the ad. which is the Riva.

4<sup>th</sup> Question. Give the Eastern, Southern and Western boundaries, and designate particularly any Land marks there may be on those boundaries.

Aus. The Eastern boundary is the Rivas to the Sea shore. The Southern boundary is the Sea Coast, and the Western boundary is the Riva Santa Ana the Western line is completed if the line above described from the Rivas to the Riva.

5<sup>th</sup> Question. How do you know those to be the Eastern, Southern and Western boundaries?

Aus. Because for a good many years I had a good deal to do with the Rancho and had the necessity to know its lines, particularly in a Law Suit with Sepulveda of San Joaquin — the directions I have never run with compass but I judge the directions to be such as I have given them.

6<sup>th</sup> Question. Did you ever measure or did you ever see the Rancho measured.

Aus. Never measured the Rancho myself but I have seen a part of it measured.

17 Report about  
Grifalba's petition  
"Gauulatian"

In consideration of the repeated petitions which Grifalba's petition through me the promoted Lieutenant Don Pablo Grifalba had addressed to you soliciting for a place wherein to put his Cattle, build a house & Corral and in consideration of the power which the benevolence of Your Excellency has digned to confer upon me of deciding upon said petitions I have pointed out to him the little place "del Ancho de Santiago" little place in the contiguous bounds of the Mission of San Juan Capistrano and San Gabriel the distance from the one to the other being estimated at 18 Leagues it is therefore the distance of nine Leagues from the mentioned place to each of said Missions.

There is not within a great distance of the place of Santiago any "Rancheria" whatsoever of Natives, wherefore I deem that instead of doing injury to said place, he will be useful, and that neither of the mentioned Missions claim a right to it in conformity to the Laws, which assign to the Missions or Villages of Christian Indians two Leagues in their Environs.

Should the benevolence of Your Excellency approve of my decision, considering the justice which should Grifalba in having conceded to him a place herein, he might place the great number of cattle which he has in the immediate neighborhood of the Ranchos of Juanuel Vito, for the reason that there has been some etiquette between the two and for that which he has also had in the immediate neighborhood of this Presidio to the injury of the Pasture grounds for the horses of the Service I hope that you will direct to order the issuing to him of corresponding title of possession of the place "del Ancho de Santiago" with the distances on the North as far as the "Sierra" range of Mountains, on the East as far as the Beach, its cross Roads with the plains of the River of Santa Ana, and which is distant from the Ancho de Santiago a little less than a League and a half, and on the South as far as the place called "De las Ranuras" which is also distant about one League & a half or that you will decide that which your Supreme Excellency will deem proper.



Manuel Rodriguez, presented a petition soliciting the place called "Santiago" for the purpose of building a house thereon in Company with your petitioner, and emitting new animals and cultivating it, both of us for the common enjoyment of all the above mentioned benefits, which the said place may afford. I am aware and understand that the deceased has not mentioned me in the said petition, but nevertheless, in as much as I had so agreed in the Contract of Partnership with the said deceased, we have continued together until the present.

In consequence of the death of the deceased Ensign Yorva's persons have been placed in charge of the place. Since now I and Juan Perella have jointly agreed to settle the said place called Santiago - I for my part placing thereon one of my Sons both being minors, for the purpose of taking care of the number of three hundred head of cattle and the corresponding number of horses, which is the stock that will now be upon the said tract of land, besides the same we contemplate receiving from our Master Name -
