

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Be it Remembered, that on this *Sixth day of November*, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-*two*, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of *Casildo Aguilar & wife* for the Place named *La Cienega ó Paso de la Tijera* was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 458 and is as follows, to wit:

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5-Petition

To the Honorable, The United States Commissioner
for ascertaining and settling private Land claims
in California

Your petitioners Basilio Aguilar and
Victoria Yguera his wife, residents of the County
of Los Angeles and State of California respectfully
represent; That said Land was originally granted
to Vicente Sanchez by Manuel Micheltorena
while Governor of California, and as such fully
empowered in the premises, by deed of grant in
fee simple, dated the 16th of May A.D. 1843.
That at the time of said grant the said Victoria
Yguera was the lawful wife of said Sanchez
and so remained until his death, which
occurred about the year 1846, that shortly pre-
ceding to his death the said Sanchez made a
will, by the terms of which the said Victoria
Yguera, and his certain free grandchildren named
in said will, were by him constituted his legal
heirs -

At the time of his decease the said Sanchez
left among his other personal and real estate the
ranch above named. That not only by the said
will, but also by an agreement entered into by
said Victoria Yguera and the five other heirs
therein named, she became owner of the one undi-
vided half of said Ranch, it being always
considered as ganancial property acquired during
her marriage with said Sanchez - which agree-
ment bears date the 7th of March A.D. 1849, at
which time she had become intromitted with
the said Basilio Aguilar, and who acted
as her attorney in said agreement. That immedi-
ately after the date of the aforesaid grant pedi-
cine possession was given to the said Sanchez
on the 3d of June A.D. 1843 where by the bounda-
ries of said Ranch are defined in detail -
That said Ranch is bounded on the South
by the Ranch of Ygnacio Machado; on the
North by the ditch ("Sanjon") of the water of
"Rodeo de en medio" containing one league of
grazing land, a little more or less as the diagram
expressing which accompanied the respective
"Expediente". It is situated in the County of

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Los Angeles.

There are no interfering claims, except the pretension of the other heirs aforesaid inter-eres, which is set up in their petition No 427, in which the undivided sixth part is alone allowed by them to the said Victoria Ygnara, said petition being filed in the Secretarys Office of your Hon. Board. The said Ranch has never been surveyed by the Surveyor General of the United States, for California.

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Your petitioners rely in support of their claim on the following Documentary Evidence filed before your Honorable Board to wit:

- 1st. Copy of the Original Grant Marked A.
- 2^d " of Judicial possession " B.
- 3rd " of the Will of Vicente Sanchez " C.
- 4th " of Agreement " D.
- 5th " of Receipt of J. A. Sanchez et al " E.

These papers are accompanied by a translation of the Original grant Marked 1. They will rely upon such other Documentary Evidence and oral testimony as are thought necessary to support said claim.

Your petitioners further state that, all the conditions of the grant of said Ranch have been fulfilled; and they ask for confirmation to Victoria Ygnara of her claim. And as in duty bound &c.

an instrument dividing the property of Vicente
Sanchez between his heirs dated March 7. 1849
& an other instrument relating to said division

The signatures of Jose Vicente Guerrero,
Jose Antonio Lopez, Francisco de Johnson, Tomas
A Sanchez, Jose del la Sego, Jesus Guerrero, &
Jose Anto. Yorba appearing on said paper I believe
to be genuine. I am acquainted with their signa
tures. Jose V Guerrero was an Acting Alcalde
March 7. 1849. Said Sego was also an acting
Alcalde at the date of the paper to which his
signature is attached. Said ^{paper} is hereto annexed
& marked "H. H. No. 2."

The wife of Vicente Sanchez
was Victoria Yqquera, the place called "La
Cienega" was occupied by Vicente Sanchez when
I first came to this place in 1833 was occupied
by him to the time of his death in 1846. He left

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the said Victoria a widow, but no children,
He had a son who died before he died leaving
children. She has since married Basilio
Aguilar

about five or six years ago as near as I
can recollect. She has since married
Basilio Aguilar & she is now living with
him, know. When Vicente Sanchez was mar-
ried to the said Victoria he was a soldier
and had no property of any kind & she
had none. When he died he left a stock

On this day before Commissioner R. A. Thompson
Came Juan Maria Sepulveda a witness on
behalf of the Claimants Basildo Aquilar et al
Case No. 458 who after being duly sworn deposed
as follows, his evidence being interpreted by
the interpreter for the Board

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Witness states in answer to question, that his
name is Juan Maria Sepulveda; his age
twenty six years, and his residence Los
Angeles County California.

1st Question. by Claimants Counsel
Do you know the Rancho called La Conega
o Pano de la Figura, if yes; state what you
know of its Occupation, Cultivation, and
improvement, and by whom it was so
Occupied?

Answer. I have known said
Rancho since the year 1839 - it was then
Occupied by Vicente Sanchez. He had on it
at that time an adobe house, which was
Occupied by his Mayn domo and his servants
he had also about two thousand five
hundred of Cattle and about 250 or 300
head of horses and some and some ten or
fifteen acres of the land in Cultivation -

Vicente Sanchez continued so
to occupy the land until his death which
occurred in 1845. or 46. Since which time
it has been Occupied by his heirs who
built another house on the land and
now live on it

Question by Associate Law Agent

What were your means of knowledge
in relation to the Occupation & Cultivation
of which you have testified in the preceding
Answer.

Answer. I lived near said Rancho &
was frequently there. I saw the house and
the Mayn domo and servants living on it. I also

Saw the Cattle and horses of Sanchez on the land
I also saw the land in cultivation, both
Sanchez and the Mayor Domo told me it
was occupied by Sanchez

I believe to be genuine. Said Coronel was acting Alcalde at the time of said possession. Said paper is here annexed & marked A A No 1c

I am acquainted with the Rancho Lienega - It is situated a league and a half or two leagues westward from this place. Vicente Sanchez was in possession of the Rancho when I came to this place twenty years ago. He continued in possession until the time of his death in 1846. There was a small house on the Land & he was generally in possession of from two to three thousand heads of cattle & a stock of horses - which ranged on the Land.

Since the death of said Sanchez the place has been in possession of his heirs & representatives up to this time.



Whereas the Captain Vicente Sanchez has petitioned for his personal benefit and that of his family, for the place known by the name of the Hacienda or the Top of the Tijra bordering on the S. by the Rancho of Ignacio Machado, on the N. by the ditch of water of the Tijra on the W. by the point of the Hacienda and on the E. by the ditch of the Arroyo of the Calle.

Having diligently practiced all the observances and relative investigations according to the dispositions of the Laws and regulations, using the powers conferred on me in the name of the Mexican Nation I do hereby grant to him the above mentioned land, declaring it to be his property by these present letters subjecting it to the approbation or disapprobation of the Excellent Departmental Assembly and under the following conditions

1st The interested party shall subject himself to pay the tax or contributions which may be imposed on him, if the above mentioned land which he solicits, shall be within the public lands of the City, and when its proper measurement shall be made.

2^o He may fence it without obstructing the crops, houses or sanctuaries, he shall enjoy it freely and exclusively, adapting it to the use or cultivation that best may suit him, but within a year he shall build a house and it shall be inhabited.

3^o He shall solicit of the proper Judge that he give him Judicial possession in virtue of this decree and by whom shall be marked out the boundaries upon whose limits he shall not only plant land banks but fruit trees or useful trees of some utility.



The lands claimed in these two cases were originally held by Vicente Sanchez by virtue of a provisional right of occupation issued to him by Gov. Don Luis Arguello on the 23d February 1833 by which the use and enjoyment of the premises were conceded to him until the opening of the general Land Colonization by the Imperial Congress. Thence this right Sanchez entered upon the premises and continued in the possession and occupation of them from its date until the 2d of May 1843 when he presented his petition to Gov. Manuel Micheltorena accompanied by a certified copy of the former grant from Gov. Arguello, and a map of the premises, praying for a title in full ownership to the same.

Upon this petition after the customary investigations and inquiries the Governor on the 16th. of the same month issued to the petitioner a formal title to the land describing the boundaries and declaring the quantity to be one square league a little more or less as described by the map which accompanied the Especiente.

78
The deed of possession of the premises was
given by the proper Officer on the 3rd
of June 1843.

The testimony of this act
is duly certified by the Officer who
executed it, with the Original grant
from Governor Micheltorene attached
to file in Case No 427 and the gene-
ral map of both documents established
by the testimony.

The boundaries of
the land are laid down with unusual
accuracy and precision, and the quan-
tity ascertained to be within a frac-
tion of that allowed for in the grant.

The evidence is
clearly sufficient to establish the
validity of the title in the Original
grantee - the only remaining question
is as to the respective rights and
interests of the present Claimants in

D. 1852; *Casilda Aguilar Wife*

presented a petition to the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the private land claims in the State of California, when sitting as a Board, claiming a tract of land called *La Cienega &c*

in the County of *Los Angeles* State of California,

which said petition is referred to for a description of the land claimed, a copy of which appears in the transcript hereafter referred to. That thereafter, to

wit: on or about the 10th day of July A. D. 1855, the said Commissioners confirmed, by final decision, the said claim of said petitioner. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 5th

day of January A. D. 1856, a duly certified transcript of the proceedings and decision of the said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and evidence on which the said decision was founded, was filed in the Office of the Clerk of the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, and marked No. 458; reference to which it is prayed may be had and made part of this petition.

That on or about the 1st day of January A. D. 1856, the Honorable Caleb Cushing, Attorney-General of the United States, received a duly certified duplicate of said transcript of the proceedings and decision of said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and

evidence on which said decision was founded. That thereafter, to wit:
on ^{or about} the 3^d day of June A. D. 1856, the said
Attorney-General of the United States filed, or caused to be filed, in
behalf of the United States, a notice with the Clerk of said District
Court of the United States, that the appeal in said cause from the said
decision of the said Commissioners, in the District Court of the United
States for the Southern District of California, would be prosecuted by the
United States. Your petitioner further represents, that the land claimed,
as aforesaid, is situate in the Southern District of California, and within
the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court. Your petitioner further represents
and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said
Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for
many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified
transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said
cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all
and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimants
presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further
denies that the said claimants ^{have} any valid right or title to said land claimed
as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

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And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said pe-
tition to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision con-
firming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

said claim should have been rejected by them. And the said claimants having no valid right or title derived from the Spanish or Mexican Governments, to the land claimed as aforesaid, the lawful right and title in and to the said land was acquired by, and it now belongs to the United States, by virtue of conquest, and the Treaty of peace, friendship, limits and settlement, between the United States and the Republic of Mexico, made at the City of Guadalupe Hidalgo, February 2d, A. D. 1848.

Wherefore, the said Pacificus Ord, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, for and in behalf of the United States, by reason of the premises, and in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California," approved March 3d, A. D. 1851, and the laws and statutes in such case made and provided, prays that the said claimants or ~~his~~^{their} attorneys may be served with a copy of this petition; and that this Honorable Court will review the said decision of said Commissioners, and reverse the same; and decide on the validity of the ~~same~~^{said claim}, and decree the alleged title to be invalid: with costs and general relief.
