Francisco del Rio has
title to grant a citizen of Mexico before
the before Your Honourable Board by John
Parrott of San Francisco in the state of
California his attorney respectfully repre-
sents

That he the said claimant occupies tract
or parcel of land herein and called by the name
of Rancho Salce bounded on the north by river,
that the Public lands in 1835 in divided by
the small divide on the south by the River
a la Verde) and on the west by the range of
Santa Ana.

The said tract of land lying at the
southward of Monte del Diablo and is subject
to be in the county of San Joaquin in Mariposa
in the state of California your Petitioners claim
said land to the extent of six leagues (six
lotes de Gauado Mayor) under and by
virtue of a Grant made the authority of the
made by Don Vicente Gutiérrez Political
Ley of Upper California in conformity with
the approval of the Excellent Deputation
dated October 12th 1835,

Which grant to your
Petitioners bears date the 15th day of April
1836 assent true fully and at large appears
by reference to the public archives of the former
Government of Mexico in the possession
of the Superior General of the United States
for California the Expediente and accompanying
papers marked and numbered 127 of
said Archives.

Your Petitioners further represent
that at the time the said grant was made
to him he was toward his service
him an affair in the Mexican Army
and that his departure from California was
brought about by the force of circumstances
utterly beyond his control and that in
his capacity as a military officer was
ordained by his Government from duty in

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California to other military duty in other
parts of the Mexican Republic Your Petition
begs most particularly to call the attention
of your Honorable Board to the fact

That the condi-

tions upon which the said Grant was given to
him did not in his opinion render it imprudent
in his power to improve the land granted but
left it optional with your Petition to decide
whether further his claim.

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was the date
of the Grant and for several years after that
section of the country or state was occupied
by savage and hostile Indians This fact can
be cited with the duty of a military officer
will your Petition fully trusts his suffi-
cient to convince your Honorable Board
that it was not the least care in his power
upto the breaking out of the war with the
United States,

To occupy the land above described
and granted to him also other wise would
have done

Your Petition further most
respectfully calls the attention of your Honora-
ble Board to the 8th article of the treaty of
Guadalupe Hidalgo between the United
States and Mexico and particularly to
the last paragraph of the same

Your Petition

further more represents that he has been en-
titled that some time during the year 1839
in consequence of a revolution in Mexico
by some individuals of California against
the legal authorities of the Mexican Government
accused Manuel Larios and Juan Angel
Ansar falsely of having the said Grant from
been abandoned and took possession thereof

by what authority your Petition does
not know

Your Petition has no claim and
and his claim that he has the same
been as your Petition believes an ex-
clusive of the said land so that the same

could be lawfully devoured by any other person in virtue of the Grant held under your Platinum Sealis under and by virtue of the Grant alone set forth six leagues (six sitios de Guadalupe Mayor) according to the boundaries aforesaid and refers your Hons to the accompanying copy of the Grant Declaris returns and documents in the archives aforesaid also by
of said Grant in Spanish and abridgement
of the same is herewith placed in file with
your Secretary.

Wherefore your Petitioners pray
your Honorable Board to confirm his grant
to the said tract of land and to decree that
his title thereto is good and valid and as
in duty bound will low pray

On this day before Commissioner William
Hall came Bernard Peyton witness in
behalf of the claimant Francisco
Castillo Negrete Petition Number 33 and was
subjoined his evidence being given in En-
glish the United States Associated Law Agent
was present

In answer to inquiries by himself
for the claimant the witness testified as
follows

Bernard Peyton Jr of lawful age
to testify depose and say that I am and have
been for the last two years the principal agent
of John Parrot Esq of San Francisco

Was
with Mr Parrot at New Orleans in 1850
in the month of April about 1850 and was returning
to Leavenworth Prairie leading Negro to
going to said Parrot's certain papers re-
ating to claims to land which Negro had
in California

not being able to read Spanish
at that time I cannot recollect the names more

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but I do remember that at the time informed
from their communication that the business
was in reference to the gettysburg to
land

and that Negrete made Parrot
his agent to look after the land Negrete
also handed over to Parrot at that time a
package of papers in connection with
and referring to the subject as I understand
it stood

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I came to San Francisco with Mr
Parrot in that same month of April 1850
after we arrived in San Francisco Mr Parrot
built a brick store fronting on Market Street
Street and the second door from Sacramento
Street supposed to be entirely fire proof. When

that store was finished Mr Parrot had
his office in a chamber in that building
and an iron safe in which his own and
all important papers were uniformly
deposited.

Mr Parrot left San Francisco
on the first day of December 1850 for the
Eastern States and Germany in his
affair here in charge of his business

all
his papers were in his safe in the building
afire and burned on the night of the 3rd and
4th of May 1851 the great fire occurring in the
city of San Francisco.

The said brick
store was burned the iron safe aforesaid
destroyed and all the papers and documents
were consumed. Have no doubt the pack
age of papers given by Negrete to Mr Parrot
as heretofore mentioned were destroyed in that
safe at said time.

On this day before Commissioner of Land
Hall came John Parrott witness in behalf
of the Army and Prairies at least title
to right Petition Number 33 and was asked
from his evidence being in English

The United States assoc-

iate Law Agent was present

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Motion to question
by counsel for the defendant the witness
testified as follows

I John Parrott am
of San Francisco in the State of California
via express and say that I am forty years
of age was born in the state of Virginia
near the year 1818 I was admitted
counsel for the United States to reside
at home at last in the Republic of Mex-
ico.

That I continued there in that capacity
up to the time of the war between the
United States of America and the Republic
of Mexico in the year 1846.

That during
my residence in Mexico I became acquainted
with General Aguirre an officer in the service
of the Mexican Republic

When first known
said Aguirre he was a captain in the
Army and subsequently was promoted
to the office of colonel and is still as far
as I know and believe in the service of his
country as an army officer he is now in
service in Lower California I have letters
from him of my recent date from that
country, in the month of April 1850 I saw
the said Aguirre in Mazatlan in Mexico
and he then gave me certain original papers
and documents bearing the original grant of a
tract of land of six sections by square leagues of
land known and called Rancho Sabon which
grant was dated in the 15th day of April A.D. 1836 and
made before the said Francisco Esteban Aguirre
by the Governor of California Gutierrez &
was confirmed by the Departmental assembly

of Upper California at the sometime viz
in April 1830 the saidugrite gave me a full
Power of Attorney to look after his rights
in the lands so as above granted to him

that
I took said papers in my possession and
brought them with me to San Francisco where
I had them in my safe in a brick building
that stood near the corner of Sacramento
and Market Streets

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On the first day of
December 1833 I left the city of San Fran-
cisco for the Atlantic States leaving the
above described papers ofugrite with my
own papers in my own safe as above ac-
cited

I have now seen said papers since
the time last mentioned but have procured
copies of them from the records of the firm
Lummis & Co. who are in the possession
of the papers in the usual form for California,

and have
placed them up in the care of Francisco Basilio
ugrite for transmission of his legal title
to his lands of land called San
Sole.

At the time Hisklar Francisco in
December 1833 left my office (Burrard)
Preston (or Key) in charge of my office safe
and papers and all my business

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Question Are you acquainted
with Francisco Beato? Inquire if you know
how far he went in the direction
and when it was believed he had
left and in what official capacity was
he acting during that period

Answer Yes I am ac-
quainted with him having known him for
some years when I first knew him he was
at Monterey in Upper California

If you know him he was with the Secretary
of State but not Secretary in the year 1836 he
was made Secretary of State and continued
to act in that capacity till the month of June
or July of the same year

Question Please to state
the occasion and the circumstances of the
said Francisco Beato leaving Upper California

Answer His Department
assured him to Mexico to represent the
Supreme Government at Mexico of the condition
existing in California which was then in
state of revolution

The nature of this revolution
was the communism of the country which
resulted in a revolution between the ass-
embly and the Governor.

Answer Francisco
Beato had a brother residing in California
at that time called Dr Luis Beato he was
a lawyer and a Judge of the District Court

Question Did you
know during your acquaintance with
Dr Francisco Beato at Monterey in
the years 1835 & 1836 of his having obtained
from the Mexican Government a grant of land
in the state all you know in regard to said

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Grant which was obtained and all the circumstances connected with it and where the same is situated

Ausur I think there were said Francis Wright obtained either in the year 1835 or 1836 a grant of land I think the Grant was made either by cutting or killing

Land granted was at Grass Valley called Twin Lake and was situated in the neighborhood of an Indian location of this Grant was within the range of the hostile Indians

I question that he said, Mr Francis Wright born in upper California to your knowledge since belief in 1836 as you have stated and not later than his birth and his employments according to your best knowledge and belief

Ausur I think not him in upper California until about the year of his birth in 1836 until recently after having been sent to New York as I have before stated he was employed by the Supreme Government as Lemire's Agent Principal in Lower California

He continued to act in this capacity for about two years he was appointed to act as auditor of the military columns in the military service of lower California

and he was also Political Agent of lower California until last affairs before continuing to hold military service

in behalf of defendant Francisco Bustillo
Negrito alias number 33 who after being
duly sworn deposed as follows his evidence

Answer my name is Rafael
Gonzalez I am forty five years of age and
reside in San Jose

I reside in San Jose
with Francisco Bustillo Negrito of whom
I have known him from above and he
lives outside and in what appears to be
poor condition during that period

with Francisco Bustillo Negrito and he
lived in San Jose during the
years 1834 and 1835 at which time he resided
in Wmting and was acting as Surveyor
to the Political Levee when Francisco Bustillo
was not employed during which was afterwards

I was in company with Padre
Negrete and several others sent to see
the land before Negrete petitioned for
it. I know there was a grant made but
I don't know the name of the Rancho or
the limits

5 Instru^m Has Francisco
Negrete to your knowledge ever been in
upper California since the year 1836
as you have before stated until his
recent return

answ^r The revolutions
were so frequent in upper California that
he did not return. This meeting is the first
time I have seen him since he left.

6 Instru^m What revolution

answ^r The revolution
of October of 1836 immediately followed
the leaving of Negrete after which Gen^l
B. Alvarado was Governor

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

evidence in this case establishes the fact that
a grant was issued to the claimant as set
forth in the petition and that the same was
approved by the Departmental Assembly on the
12th of October of the same year, and that the
grantor was an officer of the government at
the time acting as Secretary of State, and that
in the year 1835 he left the state of California
for Mexico and has never resided in the state
since. That he now occupies the land in
any form whatever.

And that in the year
1839 William Larros and Juan Miguel Arzur
submitted for a grant for the place setting
forth the facts that the land had been granted
