





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Be it Remembered, that on this second day of March, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-three, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of James Stokes

for the place named

In case No 758, James Stokes for three Suerces of land in Monterey County, the deposition of Manuel Castro a witness in behalf of the Claimant, taken before Commissioner Hiram Hall with documents marked H. H. Nos 1, 2, & 3, annexed thereto, was filed.

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Petition

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To the Hon the Board of
Land Commissioners for the Settlement of
Private Land Claims in California.

The petition of Am's Stokes
of Monterey respectfully Showeth. That he
is the Claimant of a tract of Three Sections
of land in or near the limits of the Town
or Mission of San Juan lying in the
County of Monterey.

That the same was granted
to Jose Canuto Boronda on the 2^d day of
January AD 1843 by Jose R Estrada Prefect
of the District according to the laws then in
force and the uses and customs in such cases.

That judicial possession
was duly given and said grantee occupied
the same until the 15th day of August 1849
when by and of that date he sold and con-
veyed the same to your petitioner who has
ever since held the same.

That there is no known
conflicting claim and your petitioner relies
upon the documentary Evidence copies
whereof are herewith filed as Exhibits
and the testimony of witnesses to be produ-
ced and examined before this Hon Board
all of which is respectfully sub-
mitted for such action as the Nature and
Justice of the Case may require.

On this day before Com. Alameda Hall
came Manuel Castro a witness on the part
of the Plaintiff James Stokes Petition No
458 and was duly sworn his evidence being
interpreted by the Secretary.

The W^s Associate Law Agent
was present -

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In answer to Enquiry by counsel for the
Claimant the witness testified as follows.
My Name is Manuel Castro, my
age is thirty one years of age & I reside
in Montevideo. I have always lived in California
now -

A paper is now shown me purporting
to be a petition to the Prefect for a
grant of land date 1843 & produc-
tions endorsed on it & is hereto attached Mar-
ked H. H. No. 1.

I am acquainted with the
hand writing & signatures of Jose Castro,
Canuto Brondo, Jose R Estrella & Juan
Cesar Arias & believe their signatures on
said paper to be genuine. The signature
of Estrella in the margin being that of the
said Jose R Estrella who was Prefect
at the date of said paper. Said Arias was
Judge at San Juan Bautista at the time.

A paper is also shown me pur-
porting to be a statement of judicial pos-
session which is hereto attached & marked
H. H. No 2 -

I am acquainted with the hand
writing & signature of Palomino F Romo
Jose M Brano & Francisco Diaz & believe

two signatures to said paper to beginne
Palermo S Romano was at the date of said
paper a Justice of the Peace.

Another paper is also shown
one purporting to be a transfer from Jos
C Bonanza to Adams Stokes & a copy
attached & marked H H No 3.

I am acquainted with the
hand writing & signature of Jose Fernandez
& believe the signature on said paper purporting
to be his, to be genuine.

What do you know of the authority of the
Prefect of said Juan Bontista to make
grants of the Asentamiento of this?
Answer.

According to the law of the 24th
of March 1837 the Prefect had authority to
grant common land & the Prefect had an
order from the government of California
to make such grants.

What do you understand by common lands?
Answer.

The lands enclosed within the
jurisdiction of each magistrate's district
The subjects could grant lands for farming
purposes & Alcalde only for building purposes.

Inquiries by the Associate Law Agent.

Where is the Town of Susan situated?
Answer.

In the immediate vicinity of San
Juan Bontista about half a league from
it.

Do you know that any lands

Do you know that any lands
were ever assigned to the town of Pajaro
by the Government of California as Com-
munity lands?

Answer.

I do not understand that
Pajaro was a separate Town from San
Juan Bautista.

It was part of the Mission
I was at first occupied by Indians. When
the Mission was secularized lands being granted
than third.

Lands were also granted to
others who were not Indians in the same
locality.

Do you know that any lands were ever
assigned as common lands to San Juan
Bautista?

Answer.

I do not know.

of land granted to Jose Cunuto Boronda
lying near the Mission of San Juan
and if you state what you know of their
occupation?

Answer -

I do - In the Month of June & July
'43 I passed by there and saw Cultivation
what of barley beans corns milms a little
of everything. There was a small brush
house in which Boronda and his family
were living. Neither I know not as to
the matter of occupation.

Question.

What do you know of the authority
of the Prefect of the District to grant
these lands.

Answer.

By the Constitution of 1836

By the Constitution of 1836
Prefects were invested with the power to
make grants of Sheets & Common lands
of the Pueblos.

Besides this the Governor
of California gave the authority especial
to the Prefect of the First District to grant
Sheets lands - These three Sheets are
located in the First District.

Cross Examined by the W.S Associate
Law Agent.

Question -

How do you know these three
Sheets were granted?

Answer.

I was in San Juan at the time
with my family. There were only some
four or five families there. That of Boronda
was one and whatever happened in our
family and was generally known to all the
rest and Boronda told me at the time
he had petitioned for the Sheets and they
had been granted to him -

Question -

How was that order from the
Governor authorizing the Prefect of the 1st
District to grant Sheets lands made -

Answer.

It was in writing - It was sent
to me when I was Prefect by the Governor.
Estuda was Prefect after me and could
have acted under the same order sent to me.

The authority was not given
to the person next to the Office of Prefect
of 1st District Jose Castro.

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In the Exequatur of San Juan Bautista on
the eighth day of February, 1843 citizens José
Bravo, José Francisco Díaz and José Arango were
notified of their appointment, the first two apostates
and the third measure, and they said that they
accepted and they did accept said trusts and
made oath in the name of God and the holy
Cross to discharge them faithfully and legally
to the best of their understanding and ability
without fraud against any person. They signed
it with me the judge of said place

to be brought before me with which the lands are

At the place of "El Pajaro" it being 10^o

Mexican by birth, and neighbor of the
Pueblo of San Juan Bautista says that by
these presents, in that manner, and form made
and conformable to law certain and corut, which
corresponds to this case, and for himself and
in the name of his heirs and successors, and
whichever of them may have title, right and
cause in any manner whatsoever, he sells
and conveys in real sale, and perpetual aliena-
tion forever to James Stokes a piece of land,
of his own property in the pueblo of "El Lajado,"
of three mites of land which borders with the
land of Don Juan Higuera and the civilized
Indian Martín, and as his own he sells it
for the sum of four hundred and fifty
dollars in silver which have been received
in hand truly and in fact, and for which
he declares that said land shall be safe
and certain to the purchaser, That no one
shall molest him or bring suit for the
possession, enjoyment or benefit of it,
and should any one molest or distract he
will appear in defense and will present it
through all expenses until he shall accomplish
it, and leave the purchaser in the full use and
quiet pacific possession, and if not he will
return to him the sum which he may have
paid, whatever it may be, and all expenses
which may occur on account thereof he will
contribute to him. Likewise he renounces
the law 2^o title, 1^o portion of the new recapitulation
which treats of contracts of sale, and other
matters which are set forth, more or less,
according to the true effect. Also he renounces
whatever of the statute and domestic law can
favor him. And by these presents that the
matters referred to in this instrument may be
valid, he obligates his person, his goods present
and future, and with them he subjects himself
to the law and jurisdiction of the Hon. Judges
which in this business they should know, so

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as to compile and enforce all the rigor of the law and executive practice, as by definitive sentence of a competent judge passed by authority of a tribunal with effect and without recourse. He removes the lands in his favor and defense with every thing in the form of law.

230 Opinion of James Stokes
Borne by vs For three Socies of
Com Felch vs Land in Monterey
The United States County

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A Conveyance of the land claimed from
Jose Camilo Boronda to the petitioner and
a grant thereof to said Boronda made
by the Prefect of the last District, Jose
A Estrada, are presented as the basis
of the claim. The grant is dated January
1-1843.

In several cases the Commission
has had occasion to consider the effect
of Prefect grant, and have held that,
that office had no power of disposing
of any, but the common lands of the
Pueblos of his District, and that to
establish title under a Prefect grant,
the claimant must prove the lands
granted to be of such common lands.
(See Cases 297. 39. and 753). The proof
in this case fails to show the lands
claimed to be of this description, and
therefore the grant, so far as appears
by the proofs, is without authority.

Two of the witnesses
speak of the Prefect being also
authorized specially by the Governor to
make grants. The terms and conditions
of such an authorization are not
stated with sufficient distinctness
to enable us to know anything of its
validity, its extent or its character.
We cannot infer from what is said
enough to give validity to this grant
under power derived from this source, or

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even to raise the question whether the Governor Coerce delegate his authority so as to authorize an officer to cede away the National Domain. The language of the Minutes seems intended to convey the idea simply that the Governor gives his consent for the Prefects to make grants uniposs for the common benefit to the Pueblos, and nothing more.

Whether the Prefects power to make this grant depended on such authority given by the Governor, or on the Constitution and the Law of 1837, it was restricted authority in the Prefect, and the grant Coerce be sustained only by proof that the premises were of the description of Land which he was authorized to grant.

Such evidence is not given in the case, and the validity of the grant is therefore not sustained.

In this Case on hearing the proofs and allegations it is accepted by the Commission that the Claim of the said petitioner is not valid, and it is therefore decreed that his Application for a Confirmation thereof be denied.


