

Petition

Your Petitioner Juan Bandini resi-
dent of the County of San Diego, State of
California respectfully represents:

That he is lessee of a tract of land
called the Cajon de Muscupiabe, or los
Mexicanos for the purpose of cutting &
taking the timber therefrom.

That the exclusive right to the
timber of said tract for the term
of thirty years was granted to him,
by Juan B. Alvarado as Governor of
the Californias, and as such having ample
powers in the premises, by article of
lease bearing date the 18th of December,
A.D. 1839.

Said land is described as follows; Con-
taining the mouth of the "Cajón de mu-
cupiabe" and the mountain adjoining
thereto and the pinery thereon, where
there is a large grassy plain the
circumference of which forms the boundary
of the tract designated for the cutting
of timber situated in the County of
Los Angeles. Said tract of land has
not been surveyed by the Surveyor
General of the United States for California.

There is no known interfering
claim, and its conditions have been
fulfilled.

Your Petitioner relies upon
the following documentary evidence,
filed with the Secretary of your Hon-

Board to support his claim;
A copy of the Expediente and Article of
lease granted by said Governor, the translation
of which accompanies it.

He will rely upon such further docu-
mentary evidence and oral testimony
as may serve to support his claim.
And he prays that he may be confirmed
in said lease by the superior wisdom
and justice of your Honorable Board.

On this day before me Heiland Hall
one of the Commissioners for ascertaining
and settling Private Land Claims in
California came Abel Steens a witness
produced in behalf of the Claimant
Juan Baudini whose petition is No 380
on the Docket, and was duly sworn
his evidence being given in English

The W.S. Associate Law Agent was notified
and attended.

In answer to questions by the Counsel
for the Claimant the witness testified
as follows:

My name is Abel Stearns, my age fifty four years & I reside in Los Angeles. I have been a resident in California for the last twenty three years.

I am acquainted with the handwriting and signatures of Juan Bandini, Manuel Jimenez, Francisco C. Arce, Liburcio Tapia, Narciso Botello, Andrew Machado, Ignacio Coronel, Juan acio Abila, Juan C. Vegas, Juan B. Alvarado, Juan B. Beaudry & Perfecto Henyo Reid.

A paper is now shown me purporting to be a grant by Governor Alvarado on the 18th of December 1839, to Juan Bandini of the right of cutting wood at a place called Muscupiabe, & papers connected with the same.

The signatures of the said several persons appear on said paper and some of them in several places.

I have no doubt their signature wherever they appear are genuine, that the signature Alvarado, is that of Govt Juan B. Alvarado, said paper is hereto annexed and marked No. 76 J.

I know that Bandino opened a road to the place designated in the grant.

I was at the place in 1844 & he had taken considerable lumber from there.

He had a number of men at work there at that time.

The place is in the County of Los Angeles, and in the vicinity of San Bernadino.

I think Bernadino Godia is in

charge of the place for Bandini.

In Answer to questions by the Survey Agent
the witness says Bandini does not cut
wood on the land at present,

I think he has cut no wood there
since 1846, though I think other persons
cut there by his permission in 1847 or
1848, or both years.

He used the land for cutting timber
up to the times before stated, from
the date of the grant.

The Citizen Juan Bandini before
Y. E. with all due respect and due
consideration presents himself & says:
That having need of some Boards
for the building of a house, and further
of the plankings necessary to it, and for
other utilities for his personal benefit
and speculation, proposes to open
a road into a cajon or cañada of
the mountain which extends to the
back parts of the Ex Mission of San
Gabriel, and which Cañada is next
to the Cajon of Misericordia or of the
Mexicans as they call it, situated
near to the place called San Barnading,
and as for said enterprise it is neces-
sary to lay out great expenses for the
purpose of repaying them and of
securing advantages to compensate
his industry.

He asks of the Governor the
exclusive right for thirty years at
least, to enjoy the benefit which
he desires, for the realization of the
expenses which that subject will
create leaving it afterwards to the
public use;

Wherefore he supplicates of Y. E. to
grant him such right, as he believes it
will be just, declaring it necessary,
and hoping that y. e. will be pleased
to admit the present on common
paper for want of the seal'd.

Opinion of Juan Bandini
Bocino by vs
Com. San Diego The United States Calle "Cajon de
Mesquite" in the
County of San Diego
The petitioner in this Case has offered in
evidence a document executed by Gen
m Juan B Alvarado on the 18th
day of December 1839 granting him the
Exclusive right to cut timber on the
above named place for the term of
thirty years from the date thereof
in Consideration of the sum Bandini
making a road to the place

The Act of Congress creating
this Board limits its jurisdiction to the
Settlement of Private Land Claims in
California and the Eighth Section
provides "That each and every person
claiming lands in California by
right or title derived from the Spanish
or Mexican Governments shall present
the same to the Commissioners when
settling as a Board, together with
their deficiency of title" &c

The Act of Congress evidently
was not intended to confine jurisdiction
of this Board to decide only
Cases that did not reach an interest
in the land itself

The right given by
the Commission in this Case in their
Opinion a mere easement, and not
such an interest in the land as was
intended by Congress to be decided
by this Board will therefore

I think this case is one over which this Commission has no jurisdiction.

But if the rights of the
Clemente whatever they may be, are
sufficiently protected by the treaty
between this Government and that
of Mexico, and which can be enforced
through the medium of the proper Courts
having jurisdiction over the subject
matter, no such any invasions shall
be attempted shall be attempted of his
rights.

For the aforesaid reasons we
think this Clem not a valid one
and a decree will be entered accordingly
Repealed


