



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Maria Antonia Castro de
Amar, Juan Amar Matolio Amar and
Policronio Amar give Notice that they
claim a tract of land in the County of
Monterey in Said State at a place called the
Carmiroo one league square in Extent according
to the boundaries set forth in the grant
thereof.

Said land was granted to Dona
Antonia Gimenes on the 9th October 1842 by
Dr Juan B Alvarado Governor of the California
and was by the said grantee conveyed to the
late Dr Juan Miguel Amar deceased and
by his death has vested in the present claim-
ant his widow and children.

The original of said
grant and the official copy of said convey-
ance with translations of the same are
herewith presented as a part of this petition
and Notice and such other proof will be
produced as will support this said
claim.

Answer.

My Name is Jose Antonio Anzar. My
age is sixty years. My residence at San Juan
Pintista.

2. Were you acquainted with the
husband of the claimant Maria Antonio
Castro and the father of the other claimants in
this case? If you state who he was and whom
and where he died?

Answer.

I was acquainted with the person
mentioned. He was the late Juan Miguel
Anzar who died about one year since.

The claimant Maria
Antonio Castro is his widow and the claim-
ants Juan Francisco Anatolio and Pauli-
croix are his children and his.

Are you acquainted with the land claimed
in this case? If you state what you know of
its occupation when first and by whom.
Answer.

I am acquainted with the land
called Los Carpuros. It was first occupied
by my brother Juan Miguel Anzar in no

by my brother Juan Miguel Anzar since

than fifteen years ago. He occupied with his cattle that lived on an adjoining Rancho called Las Oromas. He occupied in that Rancho up to the time of his death and since his death his cattle have continued on the place - Amedor Antonia Pineros built a house on the place about eight or ten years ago. My brother Alonso Ramírez bought the house and took away the timber and the house went to ruin.

Claimant,
1st Question.

What is your Name age and
place of residence?
Answer.

My name is Vicente Pefecto
Gomez my age 31 years and I reside at
Monterey State of California -
2^d Question.

Are you acquainted with the
Rancho de los Carnos claimed in this
case if yes how long have you known it and
what are your means of knowledge.
Answer.

I am well acquainted with the
said Rancho and have known it ever since
1842. I have lived a neighbor to it and
have been on the Rancho a great many
times. The Rancho de los Carnos of my
father Joaquin Gomez deceased adjoins on
the South.

3rd Question.

What are the boundaries of the
said Rancho de los Carnos.
Answer.

Northly the said Rancho is
bounded by the lands of the Rancho
called "Los Aromas" belonging to the
hus of Juan Amor died. Eastly by
the lands of the Rancho of Moncayo
Pareja, next to San Juan, Westly by the

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lands of the Rancho of Saagin Soto
also called "Carnivores" and soothly as
I have before stated by the Rancho of
my father. There are no Caldas lands
adjoining the said Rancho. It is a small
Rancho and contains about one square
league.

4th.

Are you acquainted with Maria
Antonio Tinajas? if you state what you
know of the occupation of the said
"Rancho de los Carnivores" by her in the years
1842 and 1843.

Answer.

I was very well acquainted
with the said Maria Antonio Tinajas
who it seems to me did some two years
ago at the Mission of San Antonio. She
had in the years 1842 & 43 on the place
a good adobe house lived in it with her
family. had there two corrals, a small
garden and a field enclosed which she
cultivated. She had horses and cattle on
the place and a great many chickens.

5th. Question.

Who has occupied the
said place since the year 1843?

Answer.

In 1843 I saw a man named
Arias (very dark man) living on said
place with his familia who I suppose
was occupying it for Juan Anzar because
I had understood that Oyar had caught it
and I think in 1843 Julian Ursua went
on the place to live under the patronage of
the said Juan Anzar they both have told
me so and the Rancho is still occupied by
the family of said Anzar.

^{5th} Question Objected to and the Answer also on the ground of it being hearsay.

6th Question.

Is Juan Anzar dead if yes when did he die, who are his wife and children and are they now living?

Answer.

He is dead. He died about 2 years ago at the Pueblo of San Isai and left a widow named Maria Antonia Castro de Anzar and two children are named Aquatotio and the other Polonnio Anzar. I do not know of any other children.

7th Question.

Look at the document now shown you marked Exhibit "A.P.P" to this deposition and state what you know in regard to the genuineness of the signatures thereon.

Answer.

I have examined the said document and the signatures of Jose Fernandez, Jose A. Chaves, Jose Alvarez, Jose Castro, Juan B. Alvarado, Manuel Jimenez and Antonio Maria Osio and Estrada where they occur upon said document I recognize to be the genuine signatures of the said persons respectively.

I have seen all of them wrote and am acquainted with their signatures. Jose S. Fernandez was Judge of First Instance of Monterey in the year 1843.

Cross- Examined by U. S. Law Agent.
8th Question.

When did you first ascertain

the boundaries of said land how did you ascertain them and what is the shape of the land?

Answer.

I first learned the boundaries of this Rancho in 1843. I learned them from my father and his Major-domo Jose Maria Andrade.

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They mentioned in my presence the boundaries of my father's rancho and they know the boundaries of the adjoining ranchos and among them that of Los Carreros.

The ranch is longer one way than another but I cannot say what is its shape exactly.

I do not remember the exact time when I became acquainted with the boundaries it was about 1842 or 1843.
I^o Justice.

What are the marks which show the boundary on the North South East and West. State each and all you know.

Answer.

I was shown two trees by said Andrade which he said were on the North line of this Rancho which divided it from the Rancho of Joaquin Soto and Teodoro Robles also pointed them out to me when he was my father's Major-domo.

I know of no other mark on that side. On the South this Ranch is divided from the Ranchos of Angel Castro and my father by some high hills the top of these hills is the boundary no artificial marks for mine are necessary I do not know what marks the Eastern

or Western Boundary.

These are all the marks of boundary I know. The rancho of Manuel Gariel lies to the east but I do not know the boundary between them. Said Sotero's ranch runs round on the west.

3rd Question.

When and how were the lines established?

Answer.

I do not know when nor how they were established.

4th Question.

How often did you visit said land in 1842 and 1843?

Answer.

I was there probably one or two hundred times. I always passed that way in going from my father's house to San Juan and back again as that was my nearest road.

5th Question.

What were you engaged in during those years?

Answer.

I was in the Employment of the Government I was a Clerk in the Office of the Treasury and also of the Secretary of the Governor.

6th Question.

How much of a family had said Antonino Mariano Tinoco?

Answer.

I think there were seven six or eight children though I have never known more than three or four of them.

7th Question.

How large was said adobe house and where did it stand. Where did her corrales stand and how much of a garden had she and where was it located?
Answer.

The house was 6 or 8 beams long by 11 or 5 varas wide. It stood in a Cañada where there was a Spring near the road I used to travel. It was on the Southern side of the Ranch near my Father's Rancho. The corrales stood near the house and the garden was perhaps about 40 or 50 varas more or less. It was situated at the Spring near the house.

8th Question.

How much stock had she on the Ranch and how do you know the amount?

Answer.

The Ranch had 150 or 200 head of tame cattle and some 20 or 25 mares and some tame horses. I know the amount because I frequently saw the stock there when I was passing the place.

9th Question.

What connection had said Arias with Amzar?

Answer.

I know of no other connection between them except that Amzar employed Arias to take care of the place for him.

and Don Manuel Larios the proceedings and investigations relative thereto having been previously had as provided by the laws and regulations in the exercise of the powers with which I am invested in the name of the Mexican Nation I have concluded to grant to her the aforesaid tract of land hereby declaring unto her the ownership thereof subject to the approval of the Most Excellent Departmental Senate and the following conditions.

1^o. She may enclose it without prejudice to the crossings roads and servitudes she shall enjoy it freely and exclusively appropriating it to such use or cultivation as may suit her best but within one year she shall build a house and it shall be inhabited.

2^o. She shall request the respective Juez to give her judicial possession thereof by virtue of this Patent by which the boundaries shall be marked out in the limits which she shall plant besides the land marks some fruit trees or void ones of same utility.

3^o. The land hereby granted embraces an square having a little more or less according to the division which forms a part of the respective Ejidos.

The Juez who shall give the possession will cause it to be measured according to ordinance the surplus that may result remaining to the Nation for the common public uses

4th. If she contravenes these conditions
she shall lose her right to the land
and it shall be alienable by another
person.

Therefore I command that
the present title being held as firm and
valid an entry be made thereof in
the Aspiration Book and that it be
delivered to the interested party for his
security and other purposes.

D. 1854, the said Attorney-General of the United States filed, or caused to be filed, in behalf of the United States, a notice with the Clerk of said District Court of the United States, that the appeal in said cause from the said decision of the said Commissioners, in the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, would be prosecuted by the United States. Your petitioner further represents, that the land claimed, as aforesaid, is situate in the Southern District of California, and within the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court. Your petitioner further represents and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimants presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further denies that the said claimants ~~had~~^{have} any valid right or title to said land claimed as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

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And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said petition to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision confirming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

said claim should have been rejected by them. And the said
claimants having no valid right or title derived from the Spanish or
Mexican Governments, to the land claimed as aforesaid, the lawful
right and title in and to the said land was acquired by, and it now
belongs to the United States, by virtue of conquest, and the Treaty
of peace, friendship, limits and settlement, between the United States
and the Republic of Mexico, made at the City of Guadalupe
Hidalgo, February 2d, A. D. 1848.

Wherefore, the said Pacificus Ord, Attorney of the United States
for the Southern District of California, for and in behalf of the
United States, by reason of the premises, and in pursuance of the Act of
Congress, entitled "An Act to ascertain and settle the Private Land
Claims in the State of California;" approved March 3d, A. D.
1851, and the laws and statutes in such case made and provided, prays
that the said claimant, or his attorney may be served with a copy of this
petition; and that this Honorable Court will review the said decision
of said Commissioners, and reverse the same; and decide on the validity of
the ^{said claim}, and decree the alleged title to be invalid: with costs and general
relief.
