My very dear Grandmother.

I have promised to write you a letter and hardly know how to address you. yet the promise has been given and I love to keep my engagements. It is with a heart full of gratitude and emotions that I endeavour through this pen to hold communion with you. your protracted illness has to me been a deep source of regret and at the same time admiration at the Christian resignation you have evinced during your sickness. to you I confer many faults committed by me when young towards you. which now I sincerely regret, and only wish I was able to make those regrets in person. You have had your pleasures and regrets during your long eventful life - and now when apparently near the portals of Death. to enjoy that calm quiet repose in God is truly a source of great consolation.
