Custom House and Port Regulations. In the Harbors of California, ____ I. W. Norris Collection Bancroft Library In the absence of the Commander in Chief of the Jacific Squadrow, the undusigned in virtue of authority in him wested, orders and establishes the following Regulations for the better Enforcement of the orders of the President of the United States respecting the collection of Military Contributions, 1. The Collector shall visit all muchant versels immediately on their arrival, and make the master of each versel acqu -ainted with such regulations as may be established from time to time for the volice of the Harbon, 2. - Any dispute which may arise between the masters of Merchant vessels in relation to anchorage or moorings shall be decided by the collector. of the master of any merchant versel shall refuse or fail to obey the directions of the Collector as to anchorage or mooring of his vessel, he shall be fined not excusting thirty dollars, or imprisoned not exceeding one week for each offence. 4. to of any master of a Merchant wessel shall receive, or con - mive at being received, on board his vessel, any deserters from the army or havy; or if such deserters shall be yound concealed on board his vessel, the vessel itself shall be confiscated, and The Master shall be tried by a Military Commission and punished according to the Laws of War. 5. to of any person belonging to a muchant vessel, other than the master, shall receive or shall connivo at being received on board, any deserte, from the any or havy, such person shall be tried by a military Commission and Junished accor. - ding to the Laws of Ular. 6. the Any person who shall entice any sailor or other person belonging to any vessel on the Coast of California to desert; or who shall aid or abet in such desertions, or who shall Knowingly receive or conceal, or assist in concealing such deserter, shall on conviction before any Judge, alcalde or other civil magistrate who may be authorized to issue warrants or try causes, he subject to a fine not excuding

Five hundred dollars, and an imprisonment not J. the Affairy Master of a versel shall be detected in landing or attempting to land any where in California, any goods or Muchandizo, without pumit- from a Collector, he shall be fined for every such offence in the sum of five hundred dollars; and the goods or merchandige so landed, or attempted to be landed, and the boat or boats through which such landing is effected or attempted, shall be seized, forfeited, and sold by the nearest 8. the of any person or persons, other than the marter of a vessel, shall be detected in landing, or in attempting to land, any where in Cala, any goods or merchandizo, without permit from a Collector, he or they shall be fined in the sum of one hundred dollars, and the goods or muchandize so landed or attempted to be landed, and the boat or boats through which such landing is effected a attempted, shall be seized, forgeited, and fold by the marest Collector . -9. - In case goods or Muchandizo are landed or attempted to be landed, without primit from a Collector, at a point distant from a port of Entry, it shall be the duly of the manest alcalde or other civil Magistrate to sieze, confiscate and sell such goods and boats, and impose the penalties designated in the two preceding articles, in the same manner as is directed for the Collector of a port. 10,th On the arrival of any vessel whose Cargo is subject to duty, the collector will notify the meanest Coundy Mily Officer, who, on receiving such notice, will immediately detail one or more non-Comid-Officers or privates, as a guard for such vessel, This quand will be instructed to allow no caste, box, package, or other article of murchandise to be removed from the versel without a permit signed by the collector, These primits with be returned from day to day by the Guard to the Collector for file in the Custom offoure, 11. th - Masters of vessels will be responsible for the conduct of their men while on shore on liberty, and will be held accountable for the payment of any fines in forfeitimes imposed on Them in violation of law or riotous or impropie conduct 12. The Collectors will require the masters of all nessels when

clearing at the Custom House to make Outh to the correctments of their manifests, and that to the best of their knowledge and R. B. Mason Collection Bancroft Library belief no gold or silver is on board, or about to he exported in their vessel, other than that set forth in their manifest, This oath will be subscribed to on the manifest, 13. the All shippers and Supercargoes will be required to make Oath that their Invoices and papers set forth truly and correctly the amount of all goods, merchandizo, or other property, shipped on board The vessel about to be cleaned. a similar Dath may, at the option of The Collector, be administered to any passenger or other person about to sail in such vessel, all baggage belonging to passengers with he examined at the autom House before it is suffered to go on board, and the Keys thereof he withheld till the Custom House quand is withdrawn from the vessel, 14th all gold a silver not mentioned in the manifest and found on board any versel about clearing from a port of Eal, or concealed in passenger's baggage, or atherviso secreted for the purpose of degranding the revenue, with he seized and confiscated, together with the box, trusto, or package, and all the contents of the same in which it may be found, And should the amount of gold or silver so found on board of any vessel exceed in value one Thousand dollars, the versel will be seized and confiscated. 15. the Any Collector who may have just and reasonable grounds for suspecting a vessel of having gold or silver on board for the purpose of defrauding the revenue by exporting the same without paying The export duty, will detain and search such nessel, even, if necessary to the unloading and examining of her entire Cargo, 16, - A Similar examination will be made by any collector who may have satisfactory reasons for believing that any vessel trading in the Ports of Cal. has good or merchandize on board not mentioned. in her manifest, and all such goods or muchandin and the vessel upon which they may be found, will be subjected to the penalties mentioned in Article 12 of the Jariff Regulations. 17 The personal baggage of all passengers or other persons arriving in the Ports of Gala will be inspected at the Custom Youse and any dutiable goods or muchandise which may be found in the possess = ion of such passinger or other person, and not on the manifest will be confiscated together with the box, truth, or package in

which it most be found. 18.th Any master of a versel who after his clearance has been granted, I hall communicate or allow any other person to communicate from his vessel with the shore or with any other vessel in port with be subjected to a fine of five hundred dollars; and the boat or boats through which such communica - tion is effected with he confiscated, and any other person other than the master of the versel who shall make such communication, shall be subjected to a fine of One hundred dollars, and the confiscation of the boat or boats, as aforesaid. 19. Any person who shall visit a wessel arriving in a port of Cala before she has a Custom Stone quand or Inspector on board, or before her manifest and papers are deposited at the Custom! House with be subjected to a fine of one hundred dollars, and the confiscation of the boat or boats used for such visit, Any person quilty of either of the offences mentioned in this and the foregoing article, will be imprisoned till said fines are paid, 20. to The proceeds of all fines and confications imposed by Military Commissions or otherwise, for offences designated in articles 4th oth and 6th of these Segulations, shall go for the exclusive Genefit of the informer, the necessary Expenses of Court being previously paid; and in all other cases of fines or confiscations under these Regulations, our hay of the proceeds shall go for the benefit of the informer. 21th ~ All other Custom House and Joh Regulations for the Ports of California, Lo fair as they conflict with there Segulations, one hereby repealed.
