Allen, an attorney-at-law, publishes a statement to the effect that the honor of first discovering gold in California belongs not alone to Marshall, but also, and in even a greater degree, to Mr. and Mrs. Feter L. Wimmer, who were at the time also stopping at Sutter's Mill, Mr. Wimmer being engaged in building the same, while his wife did the cooking for the party. According to this statement Marshall pronounced the shining particles which were plentifully visible in the mill sluice to be base metal, and but for Wimmer would have taken no notice of them. Mrs. Wimmer tested the first nugget found by boiling it in her soap kettle, the same piece of metal being now in Mr. Allen's possession. The
