My dear Arch:

I received your good letter of March 4 last evening.

I was intensely interested in the dog case because I believed it most dangerous, and I really feared there would be a verdict against you. As I long ago wrote you, I think you won a notable victory. I am not sure that I have told you before, but about a month before your case came to trial, a decision was rendered in New York State holding substantially that the owner of a dog was presumed to know its character. 


