THE CALIFORNIA FORMULA

ACADEMIC FREEDOM HAS BEEN COMPROMISED AT THE UNIVERSITY.

THIS IS THE FIRST TIME THAT THIS HAS HAPPENED AT A GREAT AMERICAN UNIVERSITY.

WILL THIS SET A PRECEDENT?

DOES THE FOX CASE REPRESENT THE FIRST APPLICATION OF THE CALIFORNIA FORMULA?

1. Fox's colleagues attest to his professional ability.
2. Fox was fired for not meeting the "minimum requirements" of the University.
3. Regents refuse to state these "minimum requirements".
4. No appeal.

The AMERICAN CIVIL LIBERTIES UNION has protested the method used by the regents in their "condemnation and dismissal of Mr. Fox".

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO A DEMOCRATIC EDUCATION.

Show the faculty, the regents, and the public where you stand on academic freedom.

3. For the immediate reinstatement of Irving David Fox, and a full, open hearing on Mr. Fox's case.
4. For a vigilant defense of academic freedom.
